## DR. WM. ROBINSON MUSEUM'S LIVING HISTORY WEEKEND

The Dr. Wm. Robinson Museum held their annual Living History Weekend in June which featured reenactors portraying soldiers and civilians from the Civil War era. The reenactors camped overnight on the grounds and battles took place at Esposito Park between the North and South. There was a candle light tour through the house and the camp grounds. Visitors got to speak to all of the reenactors, listen to authentic live music, dance and try on clothing, handle weapons and household items from the 1800's.

The Dr. Wm Robinson Museum was built by Dr. Robinson around 1690 and much of the originally framing remains and is visible from inside. Dr. Robinson came here from Scotland with his family and was a doctor who used herbs as medicine. ### "SHOPRITE'S LOCALLY GROWN PRODUCE - BRINGING FARM FRESH FOODS TO YOUR TABLE"

Here are a few recipe ideas using locally grown produce including tomatoes, summer melons, corn, summer squashes, blueberries, cucumbers, peppers. Try one today!

#### Summer Squash Ribbon Pasta

1 zucchini and 1 yellow squash cut into ribbons with a vegetable peeler  
1/4 cup chopped fresh mint  
juice and zest of 1 lemon  
1/4 cup toasted pine nuts  
1 tbsp extra virgin olive oil  
1/4 tsp cracked black pepper  
4 oz low-fat crumbled feta cheese  
1 lb linguine pasta  
Cook pasta according to package directions. During last 2 minutes of cooking add in squash ribbons to cook, drain and set aside - reserve 1/2 cup pasta water. Mix mint and next 5 ingredients in a small bowl and mix with cooked pasta and squash. Add a splash of pasta water if linguine seems dry. Enjoy!  
Make this dish heartier by adding a can of drained and rinsed ShopRite cannellini beans.

#### Tomato Stuffed Peppers

4 large red bell peppers, halved lengthwise and seeds and ribs removed  
2 garlic cloves, sliced  
4 medium tomatoes, wedges into 8 pieces  
3 tbsp chopped olives (recommended kalamata)  
2 tsp olive oil  
1/2 tsp cracked black pepper

Assemble pepper halves on a baking sheet. Divide garlic and olives evenly among peppers and fill each pepper with 4 tomato wedges. Drizzle with olive oil and pepper. Roast at 375°F for ~50 minutes until peppers are tender and slightly browned.  
*Serve as a dinner side dish or as a side to eggs in the morning for breakfast.*

#### Tomato Stuffed Peppers

6 ears corn, cooked and kernels removed  
1 cup fresh blueberries  
1 cucumber, diced  
1/4 minced red onion  
1/4 cup chopped cilantro  
Dressing:  
2 tbsp lime juice  
2 tbsp olive oil  
1 tbsp honey  
1/4 tsp cumin  
Combine all ingredients for dressing and whisk together in a large bowl. Toss in corn, blueberries, cucumber, onion and cilantro. Mix well until all ingredients are coated. Cover and refrigerate overnight to let the flavors enhance.  
*For an extra kick of flavor add 1 minced jalapeño pepper.*

February: Raised \$2550 for the American Heart Association through the Jump Rope for Heart campaign; personal Valentine cards and treats were sent to a former Hehnl student, currently stationed in Afghanistan, to distribute among his fellow soldiers.

December-March: Partnered with Cub Scouts Pack 145, Den 4, to send card fronts for recycling to new cards for St. Jude's Ranch for Kids, a cancer camp for children.

March: 300 placemats were decorated and mailed to "Color A Smile".

April: Maintained the environment in conjunction with Earth Day; collected & donated sports equipment for Green Sports in Cranford.

May: Presented the Kiwanis club with a check for \$100 from K-Kids for the Angie Maulbeck Scholarship Fund. Mrs. Maulbeck was a secretary in the Clark School System and Kiwanis member who passed away this year.

# LEADERSHIP COUNCIL HELPS AUTISM AWARENESS

## HEHNLY KIDS CARE

Students at Frank K. Hehnly Elementary School in Clark participated in two PTA sponsored events in support of the American Cancer Society, Relay for Life, which will be held on June 14 and 15 at ALJ High School. During the month of May, each student had the option to donate \$1.00 to color a purple cancer ribbon, and put it on display in the halls of the school to raise awareness for cancer. The students also had the option to bring in their loose change to "Toss Your Coins for a Cure" in the Main Lobby of the school. So far over \$600 has been raised. All of the money collected by the end of the month will be donated to the Clark Relay for Life under the group name "Team Hehnly Kids Care".



Recently members of the Crusader Athletic Leadership Council participated in the Clark School District's Autism Awareness Day at the Clark Pre-School. Autism is one of a group of serious developmental problems called autism spectrum disorders that appear in early childhood - usually before age three. Though symptoms and severity vary, all autism spectrum disorders affect a child's ability to communicate and interact with others. The number of children diagnosed with autism appears to be rising. It's not clear whether this is due to better detection and reporting of autism or a real increase in the number of cases or both. While there is no cure for autism, intensive, early treatment can make a big difference in the lives of many children with the disorder.

C.A.L.C. members participated in numerous events throughout the occasion that not only were enjoyable for all of the children, but also raised awareness for autism. In addition, the teachers had a multitude of activities relating to autism that incorporated C.A.L.C. members and pre-school students alike.
