#### 7 YEAR OLD GYMNAST WINS SECOND PLACE AT THE NATIONAL LEVEL HAS HIS EYES SET ON BIGGER GOALS


Local Mountainside Gymnast, Sasha Rozenshteyn is only seven years old, but at this young age he's already accomplished a plethora of accolades, earning second place at the 2016 Trampoline Championship in Tulsa, Oklahoma. While Sasha came in second at the National level, he earned first place at the state and regional level.

Sasha began four years ago in Olympika Gymnastics, where he entertained the idea of gymnastics, by playing around in the gym. Here, coach, Stoyan Grigorov noticed Sasha's potential. Sasha's talents began to unravel 2 years later and at the age of 7 Stoyan saw the determination needed to compete. This willpower, coupled with the incredible amount of talent portrayed in the gym, yielded the equation of a winning formula.

Coach Stoyan explains that his young protégé has not only the physical skills to compete, but the mindset that he holds carries him through his failures and gives him an inability to fear the competition. "He just wants to win," expressed Coach Stoyan. He points to examples in the gym where he faces off against the older more experienced gymnasts and expects to win. This type of gumption allows young Sasha to be courageous is how he faces defeat is what's really mentally impressive. Where most adults might quit, Sasha's tenacity kicks in pushing him through his shortcomings to create success. "Most kids his age are scared of the competition, but Sasha shows no fear, which is why in the future he is going to represent his country on international level," expressed Coach Stoyan.

Sasha's training regimen includes a rigorous hour and half session three days a week, where coach Stoyan goes over techniques, as well as conditioning and flexibility through stretching. While Sasha is mentally strong, it is easy to forget he is only seven; during these training sessions, Coach Stoyan makes sure to build on that mental toughness Sasha already possesses. Coach Stoyan explains that he uses Sasha's yearning to





be a champion as a way to motivate him and reminding him what it takes to be a champion and what needs to be accomplished to achieve those goals. Sasha responds positively and always comes to practice with laser focus, ready to improve.

Thus far Sasha has participated in 6 competitions, most at the state level, but with his recent success at the national level, coach Stoyan determined that within two years Sasha could see international competition.

Currently Sasha is hard at work with Coach Stoyan and there are mountainous goals Sasha hopes to achieve in the near future. Coach Stoyan has installed a new training regimen tailored to the higher level of competition he will be entering next year in the national level. Coach Stoyan explains that Sasha will move from level 7 to 8. There are 10 levels in total before reaching the elite level. These are the progressions that will be taken before reaching the final goal, being considered the best, and winning gold medals. Sasha has a lot of work ahead of him, but with the help of his coach, Sasha seems destined for success.

#### **BACK-TO-SCHOOL TIME FOR FOSTER YOUTH, TOO**

Mountainside residents needed as advocates

Just as the kids head back to school, you may find yourself with more free time — and thrilled at the possibilities! How about changing the life of an area foster child? Train in Westfield later this month with like-minded locals and enjoy a light dinner, guest speakers and a team of trainers that equip you with all the tools needed to become a successful Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) volunteer. While many Mountainside students happily settle into school routines, buoyed by active parents readying for Back to School Night, there are foster youth without that support system who face educational challenges. Your commitment to their success helps ensure access to an education that meets their specialized needs:

Five-year-old Samantha is severely autistic and almost completely nonverbal. Due to excessive violence in the family home, a concerned neighbor called for help and, after investigation, Samantha was removed from her parents' care and placed in foster care. Although primarily nonverbal, the two phrases Samantha does say graphically depict the violence she witnessed at home and confirm the trauma she

endured. Since entering care, it has become clear Samantha also is a victim of educational neglect. At age three, Samantha was entitled to an Individualized Education Plan from the Department of Education to ensure continued inhome speech and behavioral services to move her toward enrollment in a half-day educational program. Unfortunately, Samantha's parents neglected to utilize these services and she is now two years behind others her age! A CASA volunteer can advocate for Samantha's educational rights and needed services, among other things, and make recommendations to the family court judge that will ensure her best interests remain prioritized.

CASA of Union County is seeking Mountainside residents to be the voice for one of the nearly 600 Union County youth, ages 0-21, in foster care through no fault of their own, as there are currently only enough volunteers to serve one-third of those youth. Trained CASA volunteers are sworn in by a judge and empowered to speak to foster parents, teachers, doctors, lawyers, tutors, therapists and more. They visit the youth regularly, incorporate

findings into court reports and attend court hearings quarterly, working to ensure best interests are considered and a safe and permanent home is secured as quickly as possible. Although not required, there is a particular need for advocates who speak Spanish.

Fall training kicks off Tuesday, Sept. 27, 2016 and includes 10 sessions over several weeks. A swearing-in at the Union County Courthouse by a family court judge and luncheon follows. Training is 6 to 9 p.m. at the County Clerk Building, 300 North Avenue East in Westfield, across from the diner. A light dinner is provided.

Attend an information session to learn more: Evening sessions are Tuesday, Sept. 6 and Wednesday, Sept. 21 at the County Clerk Building in Westfield; morning sessions are 10 a.m. Sept. 9 and Sept. 23 at CASA's offices, 1143-45 East Jersey Street in Elizabeth. 

#### **MOUNTAINSIDE VIETNAM VETERAN HONORED**

This spring, The Pingry School's 2016 Boys' Varsity Golf Team, led by the efforts of Head Coach Joe Forte and co-captain Jake Mayer '17, participated in the Folds of Honor Military Tribute Program to honor the memory of William F. Little III '64, a First Lieutenant in the U.S. Army.

Folds of Honor, which Jake Mayer heard about while playing in a tournament, provides the opportunity for a high school or college golf program to honor a fallen or severely wounded American soldier by having team members carry a golf bag displaying the name, rank, and branch of service of the soldier being honored. During the season, the golf team worked hard and raised money to send to Folds of Honor in Lt. Little's name. Through scholarships and other assistance, Folds of Honor gives back to the families of soldiers killed or are severely wounded in service to the United States.

Lt. Little was killed in action in Vietnam when he gave his life to protect one of his own men. The golf team selected Lt. Little after the Class of 1964 made a gift to Pingry in his memory.

"We wanted to honor Lt. Little's sacrifice. He was a Pingry alum, and it wasn't hard to reach out [to his family] because his sister Alison Little '82 is a Pingry parent," Jake said. "I like community service through golf, and I like giving back to the military because my grandfather fought in World War II. There are lots of golf/military partnerships, so this is one way that a high school can be involved."

Thanks to the efforts of Coach Forte and the Athletics Department, Pingry purchased two golf bags and engraved them—one for Alison Little and one for Bob Weissman, Lt. Little's classmate in Folds of Honor, saying, "We hope to make this who helped spearhead the class gift.

Coach Forte is proud that the team participated an annual effort."

#### **BLOOD RESERVES CHALLENGED BY DEMAND**

O-Negative Blood a Constant Challenge

New Jersey Blood Services, a division of New York Blood Center (NYBC) is asking for help to maintain an adequate supply of all blood types, but especially O-negative – the "universal" blood which can be transfused into anyone in an emergency. In addition, hundreds of additional blood drives need to be scheduled to meet projected hospital demand. Current inventory of several blood types is running below the desired target level.

"It's simple: hospital patient demand for blood often outpaces our best efforts to recruit donors and schedule blood drives," said NYBC Executive Director of Donor Recruitment Andrea Cefarelli. "There are always reasons but we have to overcome that for the sake of hospital patients who need us."

"This is one of the toughest times of the year," Cefarelli added. "We're asking for our dedicated supporters to roll up their sleeves to make sure we're able to provide our hospital partners with whatever they need to take care of their patients."

Blood products have a short shelf life – from five to 42 days, so constant replenishment is necessary. Each and every day there are patients who depend on the transfusion of red blood cells, platelets and plasma to stay alive. But blood and blood products can't be manufactured. They can only come from volunteer blood donors who take an hour to attend a blood drive or visit a donor center.

volunteering at a local blood drive.

Any company, community organization, place of worship, or individual may host a blood drive. NYBC also offers special community service scholarships for students who organize community blood drives during summer months. Blood donors receive free mini-medical exams on site including information about their temperature, blood pressure and hematocrit level. Eligible donors include those people at least age 16 (with parental permission or consent), who weigh a minimum of 110 pounds, are in good health and meet all Food & Drug Administration and NY or NJ State Department of Health donor criteria. People over 75 may donate with a doctor's note.

#### **JUDGE SWEARS IN 17 COUNTY RESIDENTS TO ADVOCATE FOR FOSTER KIDS**

Union County Superior Court Judge Daniel R. for their assigned youth. Lindemann recently administered oaths to 16 Union County residents to serve as extra eyes and ears for Family Court judges on cases involving abused, neglected or abandoned children currently in foster care. This marks the 30th training class since Court Appointed Special Advocates of Union County began in 2005. A 17th volunteer was sworn in at a later date.

The new CASA volunteers completed 30 hours of training over six weeks. After performing the oath, Judge Lindemann stepped off the bench and thanked each advocate for committing to serve children in need of a voice. A member of the nonprofit's board participated, and each new advocate was provided a commemorative pin and certificate. During a celebratory luncheon that followed, advocates were matched to their new case. Before starting that work, though, they observed court proceedings to see other CASA volunteers in action. Already, most are in the trenches, working their cases and making inroads

Cranford resident Nicole DellaVecchia, a member of Team 30, noted, "I just had my first court appearance for the girl I'm working with, and I'm really enjoying my experience as a CASA volunteer. You not only get the opportunity to give and help a child, but you learn a lot about yourself along the way. We tend to live only in our day-to-day experiences, forgetting there are kids living in our very own communities that need us. I'm honored to be involved with an organization whose mission is to help children and give them a voice!"

Volunteers with varied backgrounds and experiences make successful advocates, and this class is no exception: Ages range from 33 to 80 and include parents, empty-nesters and nonparents; careers include health professionals, school personnel, attorneys and stay-at-home parents. Several experienced abuse in their own childhoods, and one was a CASA years ago who returned to help another child now that her

schedule allowed. Most have no prior knowledge of the foster system.

CASA volunteers have court-ordered access to all parties in a child's life, including foster parents, doctors, caseworkers, therapists and teachers, and incorporate into court reports findings from these contacts as well as time spent with the youth. Volunteers advocate both in the community and court to ensure their youth's needs are met and time in care is as short as possible. There are 600 Union County children in foster care; CASA of Union County advocates for approximately one-quarter of those and its mission is to provide an advocate for every child that needs one.

The next training class kicks off September 27 in Westfield.
