Doyle and Valdes-Dalton are the recipients of the 20th annual Optimist award, established in 1998 to recognize the importance of teaching in the intermediate grades. The award is presented annually to two Westfield teachers – one each from Edison and Roosevelt Intermediate Schools.

James Doyle has been teaching concert band at Roosevelt Intermediate School for 7½ years. He leads the Roosevelt jazz program, which meets before school three days a week, and he co-leads the Afternoon Ramble – a rock and roll club that meets once a week after school. A former mentor for the Teddy Roosevelt Scholar program, Mr. Doyle is currently a member of the school's Sunshine Committee, Leadership Committee and the Intervention and Referral Services team.

He has earned two degrees from Montclair State University -- a Bachelor of Arts in Music Education and a Master's in Education Leadership. Mr. Doyle is a member of the New Jersey Music Educators Association and the Central Jersey Music Educators Association.

A letter of nomination from a student reads, "Mr. Doyle is a very good teacher who has made me learn so much about my instrument but in a non-pushy way. . . He has changed my life and my life as a musician."

A Roosevelt parent adds, "Mr. Doyle brings enthusiasm, integrity and energy to his classrooms. Best of all, he is a great role model

In commenting on receiving the Optimist Award, Mr. Doyle said, "I am beyond honored to receive this recognition, especially considering the many dedicated and talented teachers I work with. I will continue working every day to become a better teacher."

Cecilia Valdes-Dalton is a Special Education teacher, who is in her 11th year at Edison Intermediate School in Westfield, where she also has taught 7th grade replacement math. She is coadvisor for Edison's chapter of Girls Learn International, developing awareness for equal education for girls, especially in third world countries. She also serves as on the Intervention and Referral Services team as well as the school's Safety and Leadership teams.

Mrs. Valdes-Dalton earned a Bachelor of Art degree from Pace University in Political Science and a Master degree in Cross Categorical Special Education from the University of Phoenix. She is a member of the Council for Exceptional Children, the Association of Math Teachers of

THE BENEFITS OF DIVORCE (AND POST-DIVORCE) MEDIATION

Many couples who are contemplating divorce or separation believe that litigation is their only option. The truth is that many couples can utilize mediation as a means of resolving their marital issues. Additionally, many couples who have been divorced but are dealing with issues which have arisen after their divorce settlement can use mediation as a cost-effective means of achieving a resolution. Mediation is a fair, unbiased and less confrontational alternative to the parties returning to Court. Many discover they have more individual control in the mediation process than when utilizing the Courts. Divorce mediation offers the possibility to avoid the lengthy and costly process of litigating disputes.

Mediation is a private process for discussing and resolving the parental and financial issues that are part of your divorce or the issues that often arise after your divorce has been finalized. Instead of choosing to pursue the resolution of their disputes through the court system, couples voluntarily agree to work out issues between themselves with the assistance of a neutral third party (an accredited family law mediator).

In some cases one spouse sees the advantages in mediation while the other party is reluctant, mistakenly believing that mediation is a form of marriage counseling. This is not the case. Mediation is a completely nonbinding process where the parties attempt to resolve the issues that arise in a separation or divorce or where issues have come about after the parties are divorced (e.g. a party's loss of employment, a child's emancipation or their selection and cost of college, relocation of children

out-of-state, compliance with Court Orders). Mediation does not include any form of therapy or counseling.

Sometimes parties believe that going to mediation will set a precedent for future negotiations. This is also not true. The mediation process is confidential. Any disclosures or communications made during mediation are never to be repeated to a judge or third party. The mediator cannot be brought to court to discuss or testify about anything that was discussed in mediation. The entire process is also non-binding on the parties meaning that their understanding must become a signed court Order or formal agreement to be final.

Many parties feel that the issues that they present are too complicated for mediation. An accredited, experienced family law mediator (preferably an experienced family law attorney) who has met the standards required by the New Jersey Supreme Court, is uniquely qualified to deal with virtually any issue which may arise during family mediation.

The family law / divorce mediator is an independent professional who participates in private discussions with the parties about their issues and assists them in the process of mutually resolving the issues. 

WESTFIELD CHESS CLUB THRIVES, ATTENDED BY PLAYERS YOUNG AND OLD



The Westfield Chess Club was established in 1940, originally as the Plainfield Chess Club. Then and now, it acts as a hotspot for the continued revitalization of Chess, achieved only by new players playing an old game. "New" here

refers both to age and experience-there are some children flush with skill and some adults just beginning their journey of a thousand games, and vice versa. And the numbers support this report of the club's vitality. The club averages 57 players at its regular Sunday tournaments.

As stated, there are talented players, both young and old, who attend the Westfield club, and a prime example of one of these youth powerhouses is Sanjana Vittal. At just 14 years old, Sanjana is the most recent winner of the 2016 Club Championship. She will be representing the U.S. at the World Youth Chess Championships in Montevideo, Uruguay this fall, along with several other members. Among them are Brandon Nydick, Aaron Shlionsky, and Westfield resident Brandon Jacobson. Another club youth, thirdgrader Audrey Hu of Westfield, was featured in the "Faces Across the Board" section of the April 2016 edition of Chess Life, after having her first World Team experience. This club has no lack of young stars!

Chess's past is just as important as its future, though, and the Westfield Chess Club has a rich history of skilled and talented past members, some of which include: Grandmaster (GM) John Fedorowicz, GM Michael Rohde, International Master (IM) Tom Bartell, IM Yaacov Norowitz, IM Victor Shen, IM Arthur Shen, and IM Praveen Balakrishnan. Honoring their favorite game and the bonds they share with each other, former Westfield members Gene Salomon, Wayne Conover, and Steve Pozarek authored a book titled 40 Years of Friendship, 100 Games of Chess. To preserve the memory of the greats, the names of the Westfield Club Champions are inscribed on the club's Henry D. Hibbard Cup; the most frequent winner has been Life Master (LM) Todd Lunna, who won the Championship 14 times. Sanjana Vittal, a young teenager, has her name among powerful players of the past—a truly excellent achievement that deserves many congratulations.

Westfield Chess Club organizer John Moldovan was proud to see a past Westfield Chess Club member Eric Yuhan Li play for a national championship. Li, who now lives in New York played in the 2017 ChessKid.com Online National Invitation Championships (CONIC). He finished 3rd in the Age 9-10 section of the 2017 CONIC, held on chess.com from June 2nd through the 4th. Eric, who as of May 2017 was the nation's top-rated 9-year-old chess player, defeated top-seed Christopher Yoo in the last round. Yoo is the youngest-ever U.S. player to earn the National Master title. Additionally, Eric has the proud honor of being the US Under 10 Official rep for the 2017 World Cadet Championship, and the 2017 Pan American Youth Championship.

Before moving to New York in April, Eric was a student at Chess Mates Academy in Rahway, where his coaches included Grandmaster (GM) Leonid Yudasin, GM Michael Rohde, and the school's owner/operator Life Master (LM) Arthur Macaspac. He played at the Westfield Chess Club that meets at the Westfield YMCA on Sundays. Eric was also receiving lessons from 12-time Kenilworth Chess Club Champion LM Scott Massey.

Eric is one of many highly skilled members of the growing youth population that promise personal success in a worldwide classic, as well as its continued vitalization. Organizations like Chess Mates, Westfield Chess Club and Kenilworth Chess Club bolsters many young players, such as Jack Silver of Rahway, who was featured in the April 2016 edition of Chess Life Kids. In 2015 Jack placed first in the US Chess Junior Grand Prix - after attending only 17 events - he made every appearance count, and his skillful brevity delivered him to the gold.




