FORMER "RIVERDANCE" CAST MEMBER AND WORLD **CHAMPION OPENS IRISH DANCE SCHOOL IN GREEN BROOK**

Irish dancing comes to Green Brook this fall, when Heritage Irish Dance Company opens its doors to dancers of all levels at its new studio located in Sansone Plaza, 319 Rt. 22 East, Green Brook.

The school will offer several free classes including a demonstration of hard and soft-shoe dancing, a trial class for prospective new students and a discussion with parents on September 6th, 7th and 8th at 6 pm. Classes are open to boys and girls ages 2.5 to 18.

Classes will be taught by Amy Siegel Loxley of Bridgewater, formerly of Warren, World Champion Irish Dancer and former cast member of "Riverdance the Show" and "Riverdance on Broadway," and her team of licensed Irish dance teachers. Ms. Siegel Loxley, one the few American women to have won the World Championships of Irish Dance, has performed in countless cities across the United States and Canada. She studied Irish dance under the tutelage of Peter Smith for 18 years before passing her Irish Dance Teacher's and Adjudicator's Exams in 2001 and 2009 respectively.

Heritage Irish Dance Company dancers have performed at Radio City Music Hall, Carnegie Hall, The New Jersey Performing Arts Center in Newark, Rutgers Athletic Center, The Prudential Center, Madison Square Garden and at countless local venues.

After winning the All-Ireland and North American Championships, Heritage Irish Dance Company alumna and assistant teacher, Sarah Oldam, is currently touring with "Riverdance." Each year Heritage Irish Dance Company sends between 15 and 20 dancers to Ireland or Scotland to compete in the World Championships of Irish Dance.

Irish dance is a cultural art form made popular by such long-running shows as "Riverdance" and "Lord of the Dance." As well as being enjoyable, Irish dancing is a way for young people to make friends, keep fit and learn about Irish culture. "Organized physical activity has been shown to be an important part of every child's social, intellectual and physical development," said instructor Loxley. "Boys and girls who take

TRAVEL BEFORE ROUTE 22

While we currently think of travel as our basic Route 22 main road, of course that is a relatively new addition to the Green Brook lack of scenery. When the first white settlers arrived in our area during the early and mid-1700's, the main means of transportation was by water. One has to envision that the water table was feet higher and the Green Brook was more riverish rather than brookish.

Early on the settlers had made their way up the Raritan River from the shore and then branched out onto the Cedar Brook and Green Brook and other interlocking streams.

After settling on their land farms, they found it easiest to follow the careful planning the Indians had done that they could utilize. The Native Americans always created the best trails. Hills were ascended at the easiest grades and the waters forded at the best spots. Following them saved the settlers a great deal of time and allowed for faster and further exploration. One of the known trails over the Watchung was the path which Warrenville Road now follows.

The paths were narrow walking ways and not conducive for use by wagons or other multiperson conveyances, so into the 1700's passage was only on foot or by horseback. There are no records to show whether or not Greenbrook Road was an Indian trail but it makes sense since the trails often followed water sources. The main trails were eventually widened for horse drawn vehicles.

Early automobiles in Green Brook were faced with impossible and impassable road conditions. Finally about 1922-1924 the roads began to be repaired and improved. King George Road used to run all the way from Sebring's Mill across what is now Route 22 and all the way up over the mountain to current Morning Glory Road. It now ends in the large housing development at the base of the mountain. When Sebring's sawmill and gristmill were active, that road was used constantly. The modern bridge just south of Route 22 which is currently seeing a lot of activity for the Army Corp of Engineers flood control project is the site of an original crossing bridge dating back into the 1700's.

Then comes the railroad to Dunellen about 1867 when the station was built. And at that time several stagecoach lines from east to west were popular. The travel opportunities for the future seemed endless !
