

Family and friends gathered at Giovanna's Restaurant in Plainfield in April to honor Shirley Weaver Thompson as she received the 2017 Service Above Self Award from the Rotary Club of Plainfield-North Plainfield. Mrs. Thompson, a resident of South Plainfield, was selected for the award for her "Shirley Thompson's Christmas" project that she has run for the past fourteen years.

Mrs. Thompson's project includes working with the community to gather food and supplies sufficient to prepare over one hundred Christmas dinners for the elderly and others in need. She also works with local businesses and organizations to gather gifts for children and gift cards for the seniors and teenagers to help make their Christmas Day a special one.

"I grew up in a poor family and know what it's like not to have Christmas presents," Mrs. Thompson said after she received the award. She thanked her family and friends who support the project and put in the long hours every year to make it a truly special and highly successful event.

Attendees at the dinner enjoyed the friendly banter and one-liners by the master of ceremonies, Mike Castoral. The Rotary Club's president, Ravenell Williams, and club member Magdalena Morales worked the crowd by selling tickets for an attendance drawing at the end of the evening. And Rotarian Tom Reedy's entertaining presentation of door prizes was also enjoyed by the crowd, some of whom received the give-away of a bottle of wine from each course of the dinner. A grand prize of a basket of all four wines was won by South Plainfield resident Brian Townley.

At the end of the evening, Mr. Williams thanked everyone for attending and supporting the Club and Mrs. Thompson's project. "When we think of service to others that the Service Above Self Award represents, we think of people like Shirley Thompson who give so selflessly to help others," he said. He then announced that the Rotary Club was not only donating the proceeds from the attendance drawing, but also supplementing it to bring the total donation by the Club to \$1,000.00 for the project. The winner of the attendance drawing also donated \$200 to Mrs. Thompson's project.

GIRL SCOUT FOOD DRIVE IS A SUCCESS

More than five carloads of non-perishable food and \$228.78 was collected at an April 1 North Plainfield Girl Scout, Stop & Shop, Watchung, N.J., food drive. The food items benefited the North Plainfield branch of the Somerset County Food Bank and the local FISH, Inc., Food Bank Program. Monetary donations are earmarked for FISH.



"THE BOY AND HIS WANDERING WALLABY" IS SECOND CHILDREN'S BOOK BY AUTHOR JAMIE M. MILLER

The picture book is aimed for ages Pre-K through First grade. Miller uses the nameless male character, based off of her son, from the first book, making him the star of the series. Like the first book, "The Boy and His Wandering Wallaby" touches on characteristics of Autism and Sensory Processing Disorder and the attachment children can have with a specific object that they use for comfort, such as a stuffed animal. In the story, the boy and his wallaby share many adventures until one day, the boy wakes up to find his wallaby missing. He panics, but his mother once again comforts her son and promises to find the beloved toy while he is in school. At the end of the day, the boy returns home and waiting is his wallaby!

Once more, Miller collaborated with illustrator and friend, Matthew J. Corrales to bring the book to life. Corrales was up for the challenge of drawing the wallaby and the new

scenes in the second book, which are even more detailed and visually stimulating than the original.

Miller will be hosting several readings of "The Boy and his Wandering Wallaby" throughout 2017 at local libraries, elementary and pre-schools and other events. She will kick off the "Read across America Campaign" at John P. Faber Elementary School in Dunellen at the end of February and will post future events and book signings on her Facebook page, The Boy Series.

BREAK THE SILENCE: PEOPLE ARE BEING VICTIMIZED EVERYDAY AND VERY FEW ARE TALKING ABOUT IT. IT'S TIME TO ADDRESS THIS CRISIS.

Maybe you have been personally affected by this, but if not, I'm certain that you know someone who has been a victim. According to reports, every 98 seconds an American is sexually assaulted. Every eight minutes that victim is a child. Nearly one out of every six American women is a victim of sexual assault. And one out of every six males will be assaulted by the time they are 18 years old.

Victims of sexual assault are more likely to experience poor performance in school, increased professional issues at work, and more difficulty in relationships with family, friends and co-workers. They are also more likely to suffer suicidal or depressive thoughts. They are 3.4 times more likely to use marijuana, 6 times more likely to use cocaine, and 10 times more likely to use other major drugs.

The prevalence of sexual assault in our communities has raised it to the level of a public health crisis. Everyone is at risk, yet the greatest sustaining element of this crisis is our collective silence on the issue. It's time to start talking, now.

Victims of sexual assault often do not speak up for a number of reasons; They blame themselves, or fear that they will be blamed for what happened to them; They feel shameful and embarrassed; The memory of the assault is too painful to re-live in the process of reporting it; They fear repercussions from family members or intimate partners; They fear no one will believe them. This silence allows perpetrators to remain unknown and unpunished.

There is also a certain lack of clarity on the definition of sexual assault that works to support this silence. Usually when the topic is raised, the conversation gets centered on rape, and usually involves sudden attack from a stranger or someone new. It is important to understand that "sexual assault" includes many other inappropriate and more subtle behaviors than rape. And that assault can occur even within relations between intimate partners.

WHAT IS SEXUAL ASSAULT/SEXUAL VIOLENCE? It is "any sexual activity where consent is not freely given. This includes completed or attempted sex acts that are against the victim's will or involve a victim who is unable to consent. Sexual assault also includes non-contact, unwanted sexual experiences such as verbal sexual harassment." -CDC

April was National Sexual Assault Awareness month. The month has ended, but our work is far from finished.

What are some things that we can do as a community to address the issue? We can establish an environment within our own personal realms of influence that makes it easier for victims to speak up. Adopt rules and policies for addressing inappropriate conduct. Educate our children about "O.K. touch," and "Not O.K. touch." Call out insensitive jokes and comments made by others in our social circles. Report suspicious behavior and activities to law enforcement or appropriate authority. Continue to raise awareness on the issue not just in April,

but throughout the entire year. Most importantly we can commit ourselves to believing, first, the victims story when they speak up.

If you, reading this article, are a victim of sexual abuse or would like to help someone who has been victimized, there are trained counselors and mental health professional available to listen and speak with you anonymously, free of cost, 24/7, and they will believe you.

If you missed the opportunity to join last month's national campaign efforts to address the issue, it is not too late. Any of the organizations listed above can provide you with helpful tools and resources to guide you in continued efforts.

The plague of sexual assault is far too large a problem to be adequately addressed in one month's worth of activities. Your voice and efforts are desperately needed year round if we are to make any significant change.

This year's national Sexual Assault Awareness theme is 'Engaging New Voices.' The 2017 emphasis is on encouraging and equipping coaches, fathers, members of Greek life, and faith leaders to play stronger roles in changing the culture and societal norms that allow sexual assault to persist. I'm calling on the North Plainfield Community to join me in raising awareness and become active partners in addressing this public crisis. Together we can make a difference.




