





HOMELESS VETERAN TURNS HIS LIFE AROUND WITH THE HELP OF CAU

Following the accident that left him father and veteran found himself homeless. unconscious for five days and unable to recognize his family, Donovan was unable to return to work as an operating engineer at Newark Liberty International Airport. Soon the

"I had everything once, a house, family, backyard pool and a good job," he said. "But I lost everything and ended up homeless."

his sister and a family friend, he was referred to and became a member of CAU, which operates a Home First: Financial Stability Program through which the agency serves as the member's representative with the Social Security Administration (SSA).

Through the program, CAU first becomes the member's Representative Payee with the SSA. Upon receiving the participant's benefits each month, CAU pays their rent and utilities directly to their landlord and utility provider and makes the remaining funds available to them for personal use. CAU staff also work with the participant to create a budget plan that provides financial stability.

In addition, CAU staff provide guidance to the participant on how to obtain and maintain other county and state benefits, including Section 8, food stamps, low-income housing and more.

"The Home First Program is open to anyone in the community who needs this type of assistance but it is especially helpful for the homeless," said Samir Abdul, senior accountant at CAU and program administrator. "The program authorizes us to serve as their representative with the Social Security Administration, including providing bookkeeping reports that are necessary for them to maintain benefits.

"Equally important, this program allows us to

help people who are homeless due to no cause of their own to achieve financial stability and turn around their lives. That's very rewarding for us."

"I do not know what would happen to me if Yet Donovan never gave up. With the help of CAU hadn't become part of my life," Donovan said. "I am very thankful to CAU and my entitlement specialist, Yanna Espinal."



Mr. Shalom, a New Jersey native, litigates cases on issues that disproportionately impact





IRS URGES PUBLIC TO STAY ALERT FOR SCAM PHONE CALLS

The IRS continues to warn consumers to guard The IRS will not: against scam phone calls from thieves intent on stealing their money or their identity. Criminals pose as the IRS to trick victims out of their money or personal information. Here are several tips to help you avoid being a victim of these scams:

- Scammers make unsolicited calls. Thieves call taxpayers claiming to be IRS officials. They demand that the victim pay a bogus tax bill. They con the victim into sending cash, usually through a prepaid debit card or wire transfer. They may also leave "urgent" callback requests through phone "robo-calls," or via phishing email.
- Callers try to scare their victims. Many phone scams use threats to intimidate and bully a victim into paying. They may even threaten to arrest, deport or revoke the license of their victim if they don't get the money.
- Scams use caller ID spoofing. Scammers often alter caller ID to make it look like the IRS or another agency is calling. The callers use IRS titles and fake badge numbers to appear legitimate. They may use the victim's name, address and other personal information to make the call sound official.
- · Cons try new tricks all the time. Some schemes provide an actual IRS address where they tell the victim to mail a receipt for the payment they make. Others use emails that contain a fake IRS document with a phone number or an email address for a reply. These scams often use official IRS letterhead in emails or regular mail that they send to their victims. They try these ploys to make the ruse look official.
- Scams cost victims over \$23 million. The Treasury Inspector General for Administration, or TIGTA, has received reports of about 736,000 scam contacts since October 2013. Nearly 4,550 victims have collectively paid over \$23 million as a result of the scam.

- Call you to demand immediate payment. The IRS will not call you if you owe taxes without first sending you a bill in the mail.
- Demand that you pay taxes and not allow you to question or appeal the amount you owe.
- Require that you pay your taxes a certain way. For instance, require that you pay with a prepaid
- Ask for your credit or debit card numbers over the phone.
- Threaten to bring in police or other agencies to arrest you for not paying.

If you don't owe taxes,

or have no reason to think that you do:

- Do not give out any information. Hang up immediately.
- Contact TIGTA to report the call. Use their "IRS Impersonation Scam Reporting" web page. You can also call 800-366-4484.
- Report it to the Federal Trade Commission. Use the "FTC Complaint Assistant" on FTC.gov. Please add "IRS Telephone Scam" in the notes.

If you know you owe,

or think you may owe tax:

• Call the IRS at 800-829-1040. IRS workers can help you.

Phone scams first tried to sting older people, new immigrants to the U.S. and those who speak English as a second language. Now the crooks try to swindle just about anyone. And they've rippedoff people in every state in the nation.




