

# **HOMELESS VETERAN TURNS HIS LIFE AROUND WITH THE HELP OF CAU**

recognize his family, Donovan was unable to father and veteran found himself homeless.

> "I had everything once, a house, family, backyard pool and a good job," he said. "But I lost everything and ended up homeless."

> Yet Donovan never gave up. With the help of his sister and a family friend, he was referred to and became a member of CAU, which operates a Home First: Financial Stability Program through which the agency serves as the member's representative with the Social Security Administration (SSA).

> Through the program, CAU first becomes the member's Representative Payee with the SSA. Upon receiving the participant's benefits each month, CAU pays their rent and utilities directly to their landlord and utility provider and makes the remaining funds available to them for personal use. CAU staff also work with the participant to create a budget plan that provides financial stability.

> In addition, CAU staff provide guidance to the participant on how to obtain and maintain other county and state benefits, including Section 8, food stamps, low-income housing and more.

> "The Home First Program is open to anyone in the community who needs this type of assistance but it is especially helpful for the homeless," said Samir Abdul, senior accountant at CAU and program administrator. "The program authorizes us to serve as their representative with the Social Security Administration, including providing bookkeeping reports that are necessary for them to maintain benefits.

"Equally important, this program allows us to help people who are homeless due to no cause of their own to achieve financial stability and turn around their lives. That's very rewarding for us."

"I do not know what would happen to me if CAU hadn't become part of my life," Donovan said. "I am very thankful to CAU and my entitlement specialist, Yanna Espinal."

# WESTFIELD HISTORICAL SOCIETY HOSTS VIRTUAL TOUR OF NEWARK

On February 26th Elizabeth Del Tufo, President of the Newark Preservation and Landmarks Committee visited the Westfield Historical Society's Reeve House to present a virtual tour of Newark through its art and architecture. Her presentation, "Newark Through the Ages" brought attention to the beauty and history of the urban center. Interest in Del Tufo's presentation was so high that we asked her to return for a repeat performance on April 2nd. Total turnout reached a record 83, which exceeded expectations and included many first time visitors.

Ms. Del Tufo traced the city's history from its

earliest days in the late 1600s through the dedicated by President Theodore Roosevelt and Revolutionary War, the Industrial Era, the Post-World War II Era, the riots of 1967, and the growth and revitalization taking place today. Along the way, she discussed many of Newark's most well-known and architecturally significant landmarks — Trinity Cathedral, the Ballantine House, Newark Public Library, the Essex County Courthouse, Branch Brook Park, Mount Pleasant Cemetery, and Broad Street Station.

She also called attention to many of Newark's notable statues, including the "Wars of the America" statue in Military Park and the "Seated Lincoln" statue in downtown Newark, which was

was influential in the design of the Lincoln Memorial.



# RECENT CHANGES TO A PARENT'S CHILD SUPPORT OBLIGATION

"10% of Purchases will be denated"

Parents who are either currently going through a divorce or were divorced many years ago often ask "at what point do I no longer have to pay child support for my children?" It surprises some parents to learn that there has been no specific age at which time parents are no longer obligated to pay child support.

Parents who are already divorced should review their settlement agreement which usually spells out the conditions which must be met for the child to be deemed "emancipated." It is at the time of emancipation when parents no longer are financially responsible to support their children.

A recent change in New Jersey law provides more certainty. As of February 1, 2017, unless otherwise specified in a Court order or judgment, the obligation for a parent to pay child support stops without a Court Order on the date of a child's marriage, death or their entry into military service.

The provision that applies to many families is that the obligation to pay support for a child shall also stop automatically when a child reaches 19 years of age, unless:

- another age for the end of this obligation is provided for in a court order, which age shall not go beyond the child's reaching 23 years of age;
- a formal written request is submitted/filed with the Family Court to continue support for the child, by the parent with whom the child primarily resides, before the child reaches 19 years of age; or
- the child for whom support is being paid does not reside with such a parent as a result of placement through the Division of Child Protection and Permanency (formerly the Division of Youth and Family Services, DYFS).

If a parent receives such a formal written request as noted above, he or she can object to the termination of child support. To do so, the parent shall submit a request, in writing, with documents to show proof of all of the following circumstances which may apply:

- their child is still attending high school; or
- their child is enrolled a post-secondary education institution or program and is attending the school on a full-time basis; or
- their child suffers from a physical or mental disability, as determined by a governmental agency, and that the disability existed before the child turned 19 which renders the child in need of, and entitled to, continuing child support.

In providing these written requests to the Court, a parent must also propose a future "good faith" date when they believe such child support should end.

Even with these recent modifications to the law, a custodial parent also retains the right to file an application with the Court to extend the time to have child support paid beyond the child's 19th birthday in the event there are exceptional circumstances. It will then be the Court's prerogative to determine if and to what extent such circumstances will be controlling.

Child support orders are generally modified when a child goes to college. The obligation to support a child does not cease at that time but child support is factored in as a component of the child's overall needs.

Each child's individual circumstances will affect the timing of their emancipation. Even with the revisions to the law, careful consideration must be given to all factors affecting the child and his or her needs. 
