

### **GREEN BROOK VOCAL ENSEMBLE ALZAPELLA**

Green Brook's Music Department has added a new vocal ensemble this year called Alzapella. This is a highly selective group of 6th through 8th grade singers who are auditioned at the beginning of the year. Auditions include scales, a pop solo of their choosing, aural pitch callback, and movement activities. The singers in this group tackle some of the most complex, difficult, and fun a cappella arrangements. If you've seen Pitch Perfect or the group the Pentatonix, then you've already heard this style of vocal music that we call contemporary a cappella. Alzapella is a group of 10-18 middle schoolers that sing arrangements of their favorite pop and rock songs in 6 to 8 part harmony (created by their director Mr. Alzaher) with a lead soloist and beatboxer for each song.

Singers in this group have already received some pretty amazing accolades and experiences including performing for the "Godfather of Acapella" and producer for the Pitch Perfect movies Deke Sharon and the music director and arranger for Pentatonix Ben Bram, they were also featured at the Highlands Acapella Festival, and were chosen to go to the State Teen Arts festival to represent Somerset County in vocal music. These students were also honored at a Green Brook Board of Education Meeting alongside other outstanding musicians who were selected for regional and all-state instrumental ensembles. While there are quite a few High School a capella groups starting in New Jersey recently, Alzapella is one of the only middle school contemporary a cappella programs in the state.



Performing a self exam on your feet can alert you to any potential signs of skin cancer. Addressing foot melanoma early on may catch the situation in time to tackle and cure it. Detecting melanoma in its early stages is critical. The soles, around or under the toenails, and between the toes are the most common locations of foot melanoma even though they typically do not get much, if any, sun exposure. 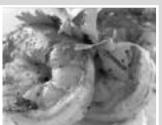



### **BLACK BEARS SAFETY TIPS**

Black bears by nature tend to be wary of humans and avoid people. However, if you encounter a black bear in your neighborhood or outdoors while hiking or camping, follow these common-sense safety tips.

- Never feed or approach a bear!
- Remain calm.
- Make the bear aware of your presence by speaking in an assertive voice, singing, clapping your hands, or making other noises.
- Make sure the bear has an escape route.
- If a bear enters your home, provide it with an escape route by propping all doors open.
- · Avoid direct eye contact, which may be perceived by a bear as a challenge. Never run from a bear. Instead, slowly back away.
- To scare the bear away, make loud noises by yelling, banging pots and pans or using an airhorn. Make yourself look as big as possible by waving your arms. If you are with someone else, stand close together with your arms raised above your head.
- The bear may utter a series of huffs, make popping jaw sounds by snapping its jaws and swat the ground. These are warning signs that you are too close. Slowly back away, avoid direct eye contact and do not run.
- If a bear stands on its hind legs or moves closer, it may be trying to get a better view or detect

scents in the air. It is usually not a threatening behavior.

- Black bears will sometimes "bluff charge" when cornered, threatened or attempting to steal food. Stand your ground, avoid direct eye contact, then slowly back away. Do not run.
- If the bear does not leave, move to a secure area.
- Immediately notify the DEP's 24-hour, toll-free

hotline at 1-877-WARN DEP (1-877-927-6337).

- Families who live in areas with high black bear populations should have a "Bear Plan" in place for children, with whistles, air horns and an escape route.
- Black bear attacks are extremely rare. If a black bear does attack, fight back!

sustain themselves long before the strip malls on the highway. The mountain had one copper mine, but other than that the area was only good for hunting game. That left the plains for farming and the Green Brook to provide a living. If one were lucky enough to be born into a wealthy family like the Vails', you could just wait to be given an inherit acreage that you could farm. Otherwise you might have to work for someone else for many, many years to save enough to buy a few acres to farm for yourself.

Most of the farms were planted a few livestock for personal use. Use of the land varied depending on the quality of the soil. In the Washington Valley over the mountain, fruit trees were plentiful, but the Green Brook soil did not lend itself to that.

The most productive area in Green Brook was the actual Green Brook itself. Currently just a slow moving, often shallow, body of water which

The early settlers in Green Brook had to is not in play other than the occasional devastating flood. But in the 1700's and 1800's it was the hub of commerce. The water table was much higher then and dams were built to harness the flow for useful water power. Keeping in mind that the brook was a flowing body of water, it is less surprising that at various times there were no less than five viable mills between Sebring's Mill and the current Washington Avenue. The best known in the current era is Sebring's Mill. It started as a gristmill for the farmers, but later a sawmill was added. The gristmill burned in the 1800's but remains of the sawmill could still be seen as late as 1940.

> Almost a mile to the east was Goad's Mill. Not to be confused with goat's milk. A gristmill, it was just to the east of the Trust House (Dog Park). Built before the Revolution, the millstones were removed in 1892 and it burned to the ground in 1915. There are other industries which you can learn about at our meetings.






