The event was open to all Kenilworth school children fish caught in each designated age group.





Numbers of old-timers were questioned. They shook their heads in puzzlement. Since the dwelling was located within what was the New Orange Park section of Kenilworth, some theorized that perhaps it was constructed by the section's developer, early Kenilworth builder James Arthur. It was not, although his daughter, Florence Arthur Hubinger, resided there in the 1920s and 1930s. But the name James Arthur provided a clue. About 1900 he purchased much of what remained of the Faitoute family farm on the south side of town along both sides of Faitoute Ave. Might it have been owned by a member of the Faitoute family?

A document from the 1950s by William Shallcross (1887-1961) came to light somewhat recently. William was just 11 when his parents, John and Anna Shallcross, arrived in 1898 with

their family. That document provided details of what Kenilworth was like in its earliest days when part of New Orange. William wrote, "On the Faitoute Farm there was one farm house, and it still stands at the southeast corner of Newark Ave. and Arthur Terrace."

Map and census data suggest that it was the farmhouse of Aaron Higgins Faitoute who lived from 1829-1881 and may date to the 1860s, making it the third oldest house still standing in Kenilworth. Aaron's parents were Moses (b. 1799) and Elizabeth Higgins Faitoute (b. 1800).








THE BRITISH INVASION YEARS' BAND **COMING TO KENILWORTH**



WARNING OF MORTGAGES WIRE FRAUD

Union County residents and businesses to be aware of mortgage wire transfer fraud, a trending fraud victimizing prospective home owners, in which funds are steered from legitimate accounts to unauthorized ones.

"June is National Home Ownership Month, but unfortunately many prospective buyers are being defrauded by a vicious scam," said Ms. Rajoppi. "Being informed and aware is the best strategy for avoiding this type of fraud."

Mortgage wire transfer fraud falls into the FBI category of "Business Email Compromise" schemes, a category that has been growing by leaps and bounds. The impact of wire transfer fraud is significant. Since 2013, American home owners have been defrauded in an amount exceeding \$748 million. The tactics can vary but the central theme is consistent. The fraudster, posing as the title company, notifies the buyer by

Union County Clerk Joanne Rajoppi alerted email that there has been a change in the instructions for the wire transfer.

> Typically, the fraudulent email address closely mimics the address of the legitimate title company. Sometimes the only difference is one letter. If the unwary recipient complies with the instructions, the money ends up in a "staged" account – often an overseas one — set up by the fraudster. "There are endless variations to this scheme, so the best defense is to pick up the phone whenever you receive a notification regarding a wire transfer, and check with a reliable source to confirm that the instructions and account number are legitimate," said Ms. Rajoppi.

Black bears by nature tend to be wary of humans and avoid people. However, if you encounter a black bear in your neighborhood or outdoors while hiking or camping, follow these common-sense safety tips.

- Never feed or approach a bear!
- · Remain calm.

speaking in an assertive voice, singing, clapping • If a bear stands on its hind legs or moves closer, your hands, or making other noises.

- Make sure the bear has an escape route.
- If a bear enters your home, provide it with an escape route by propping all doors open.
- · Avoid direct eye contact, which may be perceived by a bear as a challenge. Never run from a bear. Instead, slowly back away.
- To scare the bear away, make loud noises by velling, banging pots and pans or using an airhorn. Make yourself look as big as possible by waving your arms. If you are with someone else, stand close together with your arms raised above your head.
- The bear may utter a series of huffs, make popping jaw sounds by snapping its jaws and swat the ground. These are warning signs that you are too close. Slowly back away, avoid direct eye contact and do not run.

- it may be trying to get a better view or detect scents in the air. It is usually not a threatening behavior.
- Black bears will sometimes "bluff charge" when cornered, threatened or attempting to steal food. Stand your ground, avoid direct eye contact, then slowly back away. Do not run.
- If the bear does not leave, move to a secure
- Immediately notify the DEP's 24-hour, toll-free hotline at 1-877-WARN DEP (1-877-927-6337).
- Families who live in areas with high black bear populations should have a "Bear Plan" in place for children, with whistles, air horns and an escape route.
- Black bear attacks are extremely rare. If a black bear does attack, fight back!
