LINDEN CHAMBER'S ANNUAL SCHOLARSHIP AND BUSINESS OF THE YEAR AWARDS DINNER

The Linden Chamber of Commerce held their sixteenth annual scholarship and business awards dinner on June 7, 2017. Four scholarships were awarded to Linden High School seniors. Mayor Derek Armstead made opening remarks and thanked the chamber for everything they do for Linden stating in part "The most important thing the Chamber does is award scholarships annually."

The scholarship recipients were: Mihalia Sarris who will pursue a career in Physical Therapy; Joseph Krempa who will attend Carnegie Mellon University and will pursue a degree in Mechanical and Biomedical Engineering; Gabrielle Rampo will attend New Jersey Institute of Technology; and Zeke Modrak who will attend the Union County College American Honors Program. Zeke is interested in engineering and automotive technology.

The Linden Business of the Year Award was given to Chevys Fresh Mex. Chevys Fresh Mex, located in Aviation Plaza, came to Linden in 2005 and is the home of Award Winning Ribs. Chevys Fresh Mex resembles a Mexican border town café or cantina with a vibrant contemporary décor. Mayor Derek Armestead had this to say "I am truly grateful for all of Chevys' contributions to city events. They are so deserving of this award." General Manager Jorge Rojas stated "Our company prides itself on giving back to the community."

Morning Star Community Christian Center was awarded the Member of the Year award. Morning Star, located at 1009 Chandler Ave, Linden, was founded in 1967 by the late Bishop Irvin Evans, along with his wife Constine, and has evolved into lives being restored and destinies fulfilled. In 1999, their son, Dr. Therman Evans took over the pastorate and is currently the senior pastor. Morning Star has established several other initiatives to help serve people and meet their needs. SIX SCOUTS FROM ONE PATROL EARN SCOUTING'S HIGHEST RANK

On June 12, 2017, Mr. Fredy Reyes, Scoutmaster of Troop 330, and Mr. Joseph Chrobak, committee chair, bestowed certificates of commendation to six Eagle Scouts from the same patrol at the troop's annual Court of Honor Picnic. Over the course of the 2016-2017 scouting year, the boys completed their requirements for the rank of Eagle. The rank which is earned by less than 4% of all scouts nationally requires a number of achievements, including earning a minimum of 21 badges, providing leadership to the troop and completing an Eagle project approved by the troop adult committee and the regional council.

The new Eagle Scouts are Linden residents Michael Palay, Brian Vieira, and Clark resident Conor Flood.

While the troop, chartered by St. John the Apostle Roman Catholic Church in Linden-Clark, has had 108 Eagle Scouts since its inception in 1951, this is the first time since 1966 that six scouts from the same patrol have earned the rank. Moreover, they are the entire patrol. The six Eagle Scouts also received Eagle Charge coins from the two leaders. "It is highly unusual to see this many Eagles from the same patrol," said Mr. Chrobak, the committee chair.

Both adult leaders have been with the boys since they joined Cub Scouts at the age of seven in Pack 30 also out of St. John the Apostle. When they became Boy Scouts seven years ago, the boys named their group the Cobra Patrol, and they've been together ever since. As they matured they became a central part of the leadership of the organization, serving in a number of positions including senior patrol leaders, patrol leaders, quartermaster and den chiefs. "These six young men became central to the running of the troop for several years. They were always enthusiastic and committed to living to the Scout Oath and Law," said Mr. Reyes.


FILMMAKERS AND LINDEN FD PRESENT **"AFTER THE FIRE" TO LHS SENIORS**



The Jets PLAY 60 "Eat Right, Move More" program, a partnership between the Jets, the Department of Agriculture, and the American Dairy Association North East, encourages New Jersey school children to take advantage of healthy foods in their school cafeterias and become more active.

> Martin visited the school for a fun and educational program and presented the school with a \$5,000 grant to improve school food service and physical education programs, made possible by the Jets and the American Dairy Association North East. "Prioritizing healthy foods and being active is so important for my daily routine to be successful on and off the field," said Martin.

> Schools were judged on their outstanding efforts to provide children with fresh produce, healthy foods, nutrition education and opportunities to increase physical activity. They also were required to have at least 100 students participate in the Jets Play 60 Program during which students must log one hour a day of activity for a week.

Linden High School offers fresh fruits and/or

vegetables with school lunch on their daily Farm Stand. Some of their most creative menu items include theme days such as Caribbean Day and Smoothie Promotion Day, as well as Fruit and Vegetable of the Month features. In addition, over 100 students participated in and completed the Jets Play 60 portion of the program.

Our district is continually educating our students and staff about the importance of maintaining a healthy lifestyle and making smart nutritional decisions," said Athletic Director Steven Viana. "This award will allow us to broaden the spectrum of physical activity offerings that we provide for our students. Linden Police Officer Daniel Kuczynski, 45, passed away June 12, 2017. He was born March 19, 1972. His work with kids began as a teenager, and he spent his summers working as a Park Director for the Linden Recreation Summer Park Program. He graduated from Linden High School in 1990, and earned an Associate's Degree from Middlesex County College. He continued his education at Monmouth University, where he played NCAA Division I baseball until graduating with a Bachelors of Arts Degree in Criminal Justice in 1996. He joined the Linden Police Department in January 1997 and graduated in the 76th class of the John H. Stamler Police Academy later that year.

Danny spent eleven years assigned to the Patrol Division, and was commended dozens of times. Most notably, he was among a group of officers named Officer of the Year in 2000 for their actions during the pursuit and arrest of


multiple murder suspects. He earned the award again in 2001 after he and other officers arrested multiple armed robbery suspects. Officer Kuczynski was also recognized for his extensive participation in community events. Despite his effectiveness as a Patrol Officer, Officer Kuczynski was well respected by the community, and on several occasions citizens wrote letters to thank Officer Kuczynski and commended his compassion, particularly with youth.

Officer Kuczynski was assigned to the Linden Police Juvenile Bureau in 2008, and served as Director of the Linden Police Athletic League for the next nine years. He was lovingly called "Officer DK" by the kids, and he, in return, was relentless in his efforts to create new opportunities for them. League participation more than doubled during his tenure as director, and he significantly expanded the programs offered. He added new leagues and new sports, expanded programs to include children of more

ages, and sponsored clinics and summer programs. In 2009 he started the Wanda Green "Battle of the Badges" football game, which has grown into a yearly tradition that starts the league's flag football season. This year he expanded the tradition with the inaugural "Battle of the Badges" basketball game.

Danny continued his education, and earned his Master's Degree in Human Resources and Development from Seton Hall University in 2016. Of all his accomplishments, however, Danny was particularly proud of the "Real Talk" series he began earlier this year. Danny recognized how difficult it was to be a kid today, and the program featured members of the community speaking directly to kids and setting them on the right path.

Danny is survived by his father, John, his mother, Eleanor, and his brothers, John and Adam. A funeral service was held at St. John the Apostle Church on Monday June, 19th.

I SCREAM FOR ICE CREAM SUMMER LEARNING

In addition, they received Summer Writing and Math journals as well as books for Summer Reading. Members of the Linden Fire Department, Linden Police Department, and Office of Emergency Management attended and provided safety resources for all families. The Linden Public Library also shared free resources available to all Linden families. At the conclusion of the event, families gathered in the cafeteria to enjoy ice cream, while the grand prize raffle winners were announced. Two bikes, donated by the Linden Housing Authority, were given away, along with educational board games.

We would be remiss not to mention the dedicated teachers and staff members of the School No. 4 faculty as well as the support from building principal Anthony Cataline, who helped make this event possible.




