LINDEN POLICE CELEBRATE NATIONAL POLICE WEEK

In 1962, President John F. Kennedy designated May 15 as Peace Officers Memorial Day and the week in which that date falls as Police Week. Each year tens of thousands of law enforcement officers from around the world converge on Washington, DC to participate in a number of planned events which honor those that have paid the ultimate sacrifice.

The residents of Linden understands the dangers faced by law enforcement better than most. It was just nine months ago when Ofc. Angel Padilla and Inv. Peter Hammer were shot during a gun battle with alleged terrorist Ahmad Rahami. With memories of that day still in their minds, City Officials planned a number of events to pay tribute to Linden's Finest.

On April 18th the Linden City Council formally recognized Police Officer John Byko Jr., the only Linden Police Officer to be killed in the line of duty. Officer Byko made the ultimate sacrifice on June 17th, 1935 when his patrol car collided head-on with another vehicle. Mayor Derek Armstead presented Police Chief Jonathan Parham with a resolution commemorating the 82nd anniversary of his death. "Officer Byko gave his life in service to the citizens of Linden, and we are grateful to Mayor Armstead and the City Council for ensuring that his sacrifice is not forgotten." Chief Parham said.

During a dedication ceremony on May 3rd Mayor Armstead temporarily renamed Wood Ave in honor of Officer Byko. A memorial sign was commissioned and hung over the intersection, where it will remain for the remainder of the month.



The largest event, however, was the beginning of the Police Unity Tour on May 9th. The purpose of the Tour is to raise awareness of Law Enforcement Officers who have died in the line of duty and raise funds for the National Law Enforcement Officer's Memorial and Museum. This year eleven Linden Police Officers participated in the tour. "Team Linden" rides with Chapter 37 of the Tour, who begin their Tour at the World Trade Center in tribute to the 72 Police Officers killed during the terrorist attacks on September 11th, 2001. Dozens of students and supporters, including the Linden Fire Department, Linden High School Marching Band, and nearly 250 JROTC cadets lined the street to welcome the nearly 300 riders as they ceremoniously rode down Wood Ave.

Then the crowd joined the riders and their supporters in the Robert Wood Bauer Promenade for a ceremony in which Chapter 37 presented Officer Angel Padilla, Investigator Peter Hammer, Investigator Mark Kahana, and Officer David Guzman with the Police Unity Tour Medal of Valor. The ceremony featured a number of speakers, including Congressman Donald Payne Jr., NJ State Senator Nicholas Scutari, and Freeholder Christopher Hudak. Mayor Armstead and Chief Parham also spoke to the riders jumped back on their bikes and continued on the more than 250 mile ride to the National Law Enforcement Officer's Memorial in Washington D.C.



EVENT CELEBRATES NATIONAL VOLUNTEER WEEK

Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of Union County kicked off National Volunteer Week with a Mix and Mingle event at Rosie's Wine Bar in Garwood for its corps of volunteer child advocates as well as those in the community interested in learning more about the volunteerbased organization that works with Union County children in foster care.

Said Executive Director Marla Higginbotham, "The evening was about celebrating those who commit to the foster children in our own community and sharing with others the mission of CASA, but also, on a larger scale, we wanted to celebrate the tenor and intention of National Volunteer Week, and the significance of service to others."

Among those attending were numerous current CASA volunteers, eager to visit amongst each other and share experiences with those curious about their advocacy work. Board members and staff celebrated the volunteers and shared ways others can also give back to their community through CASA of Union County, as it works to reach the two-thirds of Union County foster youth awaiting a CASA volunteer.

National Volunteer Week began in 1974 as a way to recognize and celebrate the contribution of volunteers, and since has expanded to a nationwide effort urging Americans to give their time to community outreach organizations. The theme is "Celebrating People in Action" and nonprofits like CASA of Union County recognize their volunteers as well as celebrate and foster a culture of service.

Most CASA volunteers have no prior knowledge of the foster system and successful advocates have varied backgrounds that contribute toward success with the youth. For example, the most recent graduating class of CASA volunteers ranged from age 21 to 81 and had parents and non-parents, recent retirees, students, business professionals, a teacher, nurse, attorney, professor and homemakers. CASA volunteers train 30 hours to become an extra set of eyes and ears for Family Court judges. They have court-granted access to all parties in the child's life, including foster parents, doctors, caseworkers, therapists and teachers, and incorporate into court reports findings from these contacts as well as visits with the youth. Volunteers advocate in the community and court to ensure their youth's best interests remain a priority while working toward a safe, stable and permanent home for each child served.

Today, there are 600 Union County children in foster care; CASA of Union County's goal is to provide an advocate for every foster child that needs one.

PHILLIPS 66 SUPPORTS RUTGERS FLOOD MITIGATION EFFORT IN LINDEN

Phillips 66 Bayway Refinery has donated \$60,000 for a project spearheaded by Rutgers University and the City of Linden, NJ, to install a rain garden that will mitigate flooding in Linden's Tremley Point neighborhood. A natural water filter, the rain garden will also restore wetlands and improve the local ecosystem and recreational space.

Faculty members and students from the Rutgers School of Engineering are now working with Linden's city engineer-Rutgers School of Engineering alumnus George Vircik-and a local consultant to design and construct the garden. The 50 feet long by 40 feet wide ground depression will intercept and slow down storm water runoff from paved and other hard areas while filtering out dog-produced pathogens from a nearby dog park. Native plants planted by local volunteers will assist the process and also provide food and habitat for birds, butterflies, and other pollinators. The City of Linden will maintain the garden with guidance from the Rutgers team.

"The project was conceived to help address

flooding in a vulnerable working class Linden, Phillips 66 Bayway Refinery, and other community of approximately 275 homes located in an industrial area," explains Dr. Qizhong (George) Guo, a professor of civil and environmental engineering at the Rutgers School of Engineering and a widely recognized flooding expert.

The Rutgers team traveled to the area a few years ago during a post-Hurricane Sandy flood study, sponsored by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, to identify the causes of the problem, which were primarily rainfall induced flooding and tidal flooding from the Arthur Kill, via the Rahway River. Putting their education to practical use, the students brainstormed and designed a solution, which Guo describes as "wonderful hands-on education."

The project dovetails with a much larger \$2.7 million ongoing flood mitigation and ecosystem restoration project for Marshes Creek in the City of Linden recently funded by the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation (NFWF). It is a collaborative effort between Rutgers, the City of

area partners.
