### **FACULTY STEP CHALLENGE MOVES MOUNTAIN(SIDE)**

Mountainside faculty and staff improved their physical fitness and health awareness by participating in a district-wide Move Mountainside Winter/Spring Challenge. This program, spearheaded by the physical education department, provided an opportunity for everyone in the Mountainside School District to become more active at work and at home.

Employees worked in teams to track their activity over a period of six weeks, while competing against their peers and providing healthy role models for their students. The teams (of no more than five) had fun creating team names. Among them were: Holey Walkamolies, Friendly Neighborhood Movers, Thunder Road, and Red Hot Chili Steppers. Each team registered and kept track of their steps weekly through a Google Drive spread sheet. PE teachers provided suggested routes in and around the schools. The faculty also received a conversion chart to add other activities to their step counts. A portable step counter was provided for each faculty member by Dr. Lubarsky, the chief school administrator.

A total of 17 teams representing 73 faculty members out of 120, or over 85%. At the end of the six week challenge, the top averages of each team and the top three individual with the most steps won gift certificates. The prizes were

generously donated by local restaurants, Grillstone, Echo Tap and Grill, and Mosaica.

The top individual scorers were: First place - Peter Scholl (908,476); Second place - Courtney Hunter (859,731); Third place, Meghan Petrillo (831,075). The top team averages were: First place - Christopher Walkin' (Gary Chan, Kristie Crilley, Caitlin McGarrity, and Samantha New - 623,974 steps); Second place - Summer Dreamers (Denise Barone, Sonia Branco, Michelle Cruz, Heather Goldstein, and Linda Lombardo - 513,778 steps); Third place - Dream Team (Kelly Herscheit, Courtney Hunter, Stephanie Ianniello, Michelle Jamnick, and Janelle Lauterbach - 513,651).

#### **MOUNTAINSIDE TEACHERS AMONG THOSE HONORED AT KEAN**

Kean University hosted Union County's Teachers of the Year on Wednesday, May 24 with a breakfast and award ceremony at the New Jersey Center for Science, Technology and Mathematics. Sponsored by the Union County Superintendents' Roundtable, the Union County Teacher Recognition Program honors one outstanding teacher from each school within the county. Nearly 60 of the honored teachers are Kean University alumni.

Mountainside teachers who were honored included Barbara Hemmings and Caitlyn Murphy.

"There is no doubt that your impact will be realized beyond the scope of this state, this nation, and indeed this world," Anthony A. Pittman, Ph.D., acting dean of Kean's College of Education, told the teachers. "You educate and empower our next generation of leaders." The featured speaker at the event, 2016-2017 New Jersey Teacher of the Year Argine Safari, recalled a high school teacher who pushed her and encouraged her to reach for more.

"Think for a moment how incredible that power is that we have in our classrooms. Think of the influence that we all have," Safari said. "Every child deserves to have a champion. I had my champion, and I'm sure that you can name teachers who influenced you. We have to continue to work and advocate for our students."

Also speaking at the event were Interim Executive County Superintendent for Union County Juan Torres, Superintendent of Springfield Public Schools Michael A. Davino, and Union County Freeholder Bruce H. Bergen. Each praised the honored teachers for their dedication to the students of the county.

#### "BOOK BANDY" A SUCCESS AT HILLSIDE'S GEORGE WASHINGTON SCHOOL

Last summer, when 16-year-old Katie Zimmermann, a Girl Scout with the Mountainside Ambassador Troop 40851, chose creating a reading program for the 5th Grade students at George Washington School in Hillside as her Girl Scout Gold Award Project, she set a goal of collecting 350 new or gently used books to help restock the school's library. Now, a year later, the 17-year-old Junior honor student at Governor Livingston High School is wrapping up her project and leaving behind an ongoing book program in the school.


"I chose to create a 'Book Bandy,' which meant the students could select a book and not have to return it until they finished reading it because they were not restricted by a due date. The books also came with a review sticker that had a '5 Star Rating Scale' to encourage discussion. The Book Bandy encouraged the students to try different genres of books and if they didn't like the book, they just returned it and tried another. It was aimed at encouraging students to try larger and more challenging books that they wouldn't normally try," Zimmermann explained.

In addition to stocking the shelves of the Book Bandy, the teen met monthly with the students to discuss different books and literary genres, as well as give the students a chance to review their books. The children gave oral book reviews, which were later printed in the monthly newsletter Zimmermann created. The newsletter enabled those who could not attend the meeting to still get the literary genre material, student book reviews and additional sections requested, such as upcoming movies that are based on books. With the end of the school year, the monthly meetings will end, but the Book Bandy remains and the librarian and staff will continue to encourage students to "bandy" these more challenging books without a time limit or late fine. Zimmermann chose "bandy" as it means "to pass about causally, give and receive."

"The end of year evaluations of the children and staff were that the project was an overwhelming success. The students read more and enjoyed their reading. They are now more likely to attempt more challenging genres knowing they have an unlimited time to explore them. As a result of the oral reviews, they now are more comfortable discussing their opinions with others and can more easily express what they liked or disliked about a book. In addition to increasing their reading materials, the project proved to be a confidence builder as well," Zimmermann said.

The teen was quick to acknowledge that the success of the "Book Bandy" was a joint effort that included many people. "This project would never have been possible without so many people coming forward with books and other material donations. I have to thank the entire Mountainside community, other friends and

neighbors and my fellow scouts for their help sorting, labeling, carrying books and art work. I want to thank the Mountainside View and its readers for their support. I especially want to thank the Hillside Board of Education, George Washington School administrators, staff, parents and students for their help, participation and enthusiasm. This project was a win/win for everyone. My hope is that the biggest success of this project is that these fifth graders will take their increased love of reading and spread the message to their peers. I also hope this experience will benefit them as they continue their education. It was a pleasure working with them. I will miss interacting with the students and wish them well," Zimmermann concluded.
