SUMMIT MOURNS THE LOSS OF OFFICER MATTHEW TARENTINO

Donation site created to support the family in this time of need

SUMMIT, N.J., Wednesday, May 31, 2017 - The Summit Police Department and the entire city of Summit lost a valued officer, community member and friend. This loss has greatly affected not only our law enforcement community and the citizens of Summit, but countless people far and wide. Officer Matthew Tarentino epitomized what a law enforcement officer should be: a respected, trusted colleague with unwavering dedication and enthusiasm for his calling.

Officer Tarentino was the face of the department's community policing unit and understood the importance of building relationships within Summit, most recently serving as Summit's DARE officer. During his time with the Summit Police Department, Matt created a lasting imprint on the department and the city as well as the children of Summit. While Officer Matthew Tarentino may be gone, he will never be forgotten.

The Summit PAL with support from the Summit Police Department, the City of Summit and the entire Summit community has created a donation site to help support the family in this time of need and ensure that Officer Tarentino's legacy is never diminished. Officer Tarentino leaves behind his wife Victoria, two sons, Robert and Raymond, ages two and four, and a third child due in August.

POSTHUMOUS PROMOTION OF OFFICER MATTHEW TARENTINO

On Wednesday, May 31, 2017, Summit Police Chief Robert Weck announced the posthumous promotion of Officer Matthew Tarentino to the rank of detective, effective immediately. Detective Tarentino, 29, had served five years in the police department before being killed in a motor vehicle collision early Tuesday morning.

Tarentino was part of the police department Community Policing Unit and considered instrumental in establishing and managing a notable number of programs and partnerships with Summit public and private schools, community organizations and within city departments.

"Matt was an exceptional police officer and fully deserving of this honor," explains Summit Police Chief Robert Weck. "He was highly respected within our department and throughout the Summit community. His legacy is one of strong community connections and balanced, enthusiastic outreach. While he may be gone, he will never be forgotten, and his family will always be part of ours."




MUSICIAN GAINS ATTENTION AS A DIRECTOR IN FILM FESTIVALS

Adam Gilbert, Youth and Contemporary Music Director at Central Presbyterian Church in Summit, NJ, recently received the Accolade Film Festival Award of Merit as well as acceptance into the Manhattan, Hoboken and New Hope Film Festival for his short film "On Softer Ground" Known more as a piano based singer/songwriter with 2 albums under his name, 5 star ratings on itunes, his own Pandora station, critically acclaimed reviews and national airplay he now finds himself immersed in the film festival circuit which is conveniently timed with the release of his new album, "On Softer Ground"

"You really never know how things are going to grow in a creative process. What started as a song, turned into a music video and then turned into a short film." The short is a non-traditional music video in the sense that you never see the singer or band and is shot with a more artistic and cinematic approach. The story line borders reality with mysticism which follows two characters coping with the emotions of heart break. It's no wonder why this video is being shown at film festivals, it's landscapes and character

movements are beautifully shot and carefully crafted with a hypnotizing melody that seems to slow down time. The process wasn't easy though, Gilbert says, "I'm tough on myself, if it doesn't feel right I just won't release or share it. I had to rework and re-shoot the video many times until it really reflected how I felt and what I wanted to see on the screen. I was lucky to get help towards the end of the process in character development and editing from Ray Williams and Mark Kelly at Hostile Wood Productions to enhance the depth of the story."

Adding to the build of up of the new album Gilbert also released a haunting version of Wicked Game as a single on itunes and spotify a few months ago. "This single fits some of the vibe from the new album so it works well as a build up. I love the atmosphere that is created in the original version of Wicked Game but I wanted to try to stretch that emotion even further to give the song more of a dynamic arch. I wasn't sure if I was going to pull it off or release it but it feels good so I put it out as a single on itunes to help ramp things up! Whatever I release, I try to make it my own—to carve out my own niche and



(hopefully) bloom within that space. It's always challenging, but if you find the 'it,' the feeling is extremely rewarding."

The new album blends vintage Coldplay with Beck's Morning phase but ultimately gives us the defining sound of Adam Gilbert. A piano based singer-songwriter who creates powerful musical moments in grandiose fashion or with the simplest of arrangements of just a piano and his voice. 

FIFTH GRADERS GAIN PERSPECTIVE ON AGING AT SAGE ELDERCARE

About 60 fifth graders from Summit's Lincoln-Hubbard Elementary School participated in sensitivity training at SAGE Eldercare. The program is designed to help the students understand what it is like to age and gives them an opportunity to interact with older adults who attend SAGE's Spend-A-Day program. As part of the eighth annual intergenerational program, the students also provided a generous donation to

the food pantry at SAGE.

Students were given activities to complete with glasses that simulated a variety of vision problems and rubber gloves with cotton inside the fingertips that simulated arthritis or polyneuropathy symptoms. The children quickly learned that it is hard to write, use buttons, and feel items, and that it was also hard to see what they were trying to do with the "special glasses" on.

Another task was for some of the students to cover their ears while others spoke quietly to them showing them what having a hearing loss might be like. They also breathed through straws to demonstrate asthma and a reduced lung capacity that can sometimes occur with the aging process.

Marianne Kranz, SAGE Eldercare's Director of Volunteers, talked to the students about how aging might impact the sort of activities that they do now such as playing sports, reading, and enjoying video games. The students were also encouraged to "stay healthy and active, eat right, and take care of themselves" so that they could age gracefully.

In addition to the sensitivity training, the students also interacted with participants in SAGE's Spend-A-Day adult day health care center, asking them questions that they'd

prepared in advance. Susan Wirth, Manager of Recreation for Spend-A-Day, discussed dementia and Alzheimer's with the students.

Students reflected on what they learned during the program, including the importance of "patience, being nice and encouraging, and being empathetic" to issues that older adults might face.







They are considered special events in the election calendar and for very good reasons. League debates are fair. They are unbiased. They are conducted for informational purposes, without a hidden agenda, and are controlled by principles nonpartisanship.
