





Performing a self exam on your feet can alert you to any potential signs of skin cancer. Addressing foot melanoma early on may catch the situation in time to tackle and cure it. Detecting melanoma in its early stages is critical. The soles, around or under the toenails, and between the toes are the most common locations of foot melanoma even though they typically do not get much, if any, sun exposure. Foot melanoma usually manifests itself with a freckle, mole, or spot that changes in configuration over a period of time. The resulting change in color, diameter, elevation, or border should be reported to your podiatrist immediately since those four factors are the indicators of foot melanoma.







TWO RECORDS SET AT ROTARY TRACK AND FIELD MEET

partly sunny skies and cool temperatures for the 90th Annual Rotary Track and Field Meet, held June 7, 2017 at the Hub Stine Athletic Complex in Plainfield, NJ.

The Rotary Club's meet has been held annually since 1924, with a three-year break during World War 2, and several meets cancelled due to weather. Started as an organized meet for elementary school students, the meet shifted to the high school level to provide a friendly competition for area students. Later, when high schools began competing through a statewide system of athletic events, the Rotary meet shifted to the middle school grades.

Invitations went out to area schools in early May, with just over 250 students registered for the Meet. "This year we have students from North Plainfield Middle School and College Achieve Charter School; Valley View School in Watchung; and Maxson Middle School, Queen City Academy, Plainfield Academy AAS, and Koinonia Academy of Plainfield," said Meet Director Michael Townley. "Plainfield Athletic Director John Quinn was instrumental in getting the athletes from Maxson registered for our event."

Records were set in two events this year, the 800 meter and the high jump. The new record for the 800 meter run for girls in Group 1 was set by Amaia Onque-Shabazz, whose time of 02:37.19 topped the previous record of 02:40.48, set in 2010 by Aniyah Tyler of Queen City Academy.

The record-setting effort in the high jump was the result of a determined Vincent Rizzi of Valley View School, who cleared the crossbar at 5' 10", a full four inches over the record held since 1998 by Mitchell Webb of Maxson Middle School. Last year, Rizzi also set a record in his first Rotary Track and Field Meet. He has one more opportunity next year in the 14 year group.

"Over the years, we have had the privilege of

gone on to set state and national records. One athlete, the late Milt Campbell, Olympic decathlon champion, even went on to win medals in Olympic competitions" said Meet Director Townley. "We look forward to seeing Vincent Rizzi achieve at least some of those accolades as he continues his athletic career.

"But even more important than hosting future greats is our ability to give any interested student athlete the opportunity to compete against their peers, sometimes for the very first time. I have been doing this for over twenty-six years, and one of the joys of that long history is meeting young men and women who tell me that they competed in our meets when they were in high school or middle school. Even in their thirties and forties and older, their smiles are just as big as the day they competed at the Rotary Track and Field Meet."

Members of the Club and their friends offered their services as officials and judges for an afternoon of friendly but determined competition by the young 12, 13 and 14 year-old athletes. They were supported by members of the Interact Club at North Plainfield High School who also filled key roles, such as judges, timers, and field event assistants. Interact is the youth-based service club sponsored by Rotary International.

"We are so grateful to our family members and friends and our Interact Club members who come out to help us with this youth service project," said Ravenell Williams, president of the Rotary Club. "There are so many positions to fill that we could not do it without their help. And our Interact Club members and their adviser, Alexandra Pereira are just wonderful! We sincerely appreciate the support of the North Plainfield School District in allowing these students to participate in so many of our club's events."

Medals were awarded to first, second and third

Hundreds of young athletes gathered under hosting a number of young athletes who have place finishers in all events except the relays, where ribbons were awarded to second and third place finishers. All participating schools took home medals or ribbons.

> College Achieve School - 7 first, 6 second, and 3 third place awards:

Koinonia Academy - 1 first place award;

Maxson Middle School - 7 first, 13 second, and 10 third place awards;

North Plainfield Middle School - 22 first, 11 second, 3 third place awards;

Plainfield's Queen City Academy - 1 first, 5 second, 7 third place awards;

Plainfield Academy of Arts and Advanced Studies - 6 first, 7 second, 1 third place awards;

Watchung's Valley View -8 first, 9 second, 9 third place awards.





FEMA ENCOURAGES PEOPLE TO PREPARE NOW FOR THE 2017 ATLANTIC HURRICANE SEASON

The Atlantic hurricane season began in June, and there is no better time to get ready than now. The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) encourages residents and businesses across the nation to prepare by understanding their risk, planning together for the entire family, and downloading the FEMA App.

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) Climate Prediction Center seasonal outlook for 2017, released last week, states that the Atlantic could see an abovenormal hurricane season this year. The full forecast is linked seasonal www.noaa.gov/media-release/above-normalatlantic-hurricane-season-is-most-likely-year.

Both hurricanes and tropical systems have the potential to cause serious damage to coastal and inland areas. Their hazards could come in many forms including storm surge, heavy rainfall, coastal and inland flooding, high winds, and tornadoes.

"The time to prepare for hurricanes and tropical storms is now, before a threat even exists," said FEMA Acting Administrator Robert J. Fenton, Jr. "We want people who live in coastal and nearby inland areas to know where they can get reliable information; prepare their home and

workplace ahead of time; know if they live in an evacuation zone and be familiar with evacuation routes. Knowing what to do and practicing your plan now can make the difference between life and death if a hurricane or tropical storm does strike."

There is a lot of information available to help individuals and communities prepare:

Learn Your Flood Risk: Flooding is the nation's most frequent and costly natural disaster. Go to FloodSmart.gov and learn how to protect your home or business. Purchase a flood at insurance policy if you do not already have one.

Make A Plan: Residents should speak with their family today about how they will communicate with each other during a significant weather event when they may not be together, or during an evacuation order.

Download the FEMA App: The FEMA App contains important information on what to do before, during, and after a hurricane. The App also allows users to receive weather alerts from NOAA's National Weather Service, includes lifesaving safety tips, and provides access to disaster resources should survivors need them. The App is available in the Apple App store or the Google Play store.

Know your evacuation zone: Evacuation zones are areas that may be impacted by hurricane Many communities designate evacuation zones and routes to get citizens to safety. This information is typically found on the websites of state, county, or town emergency management offices. If a hurricane threatens a community and local officials say it's time to evacuate, residents should evacuate immediately. Do not wait for the next forecast.

While much attention is often given to the Atlantic hurricane season, there are tropical systems that can affect many other areas around the nation. BLACK BEAR SAFETY TIPS

Black bears by nature tend to be wary of humans and avoid people. However, if you encounter a black bear in your neighborhood or outdoors while hiking or camping, follow these common-sense safety tips.

- Never feed or approach a bear!
- Remain calm.
- Make the bear aware of your presence by speaking in an assertive voice, singing, clapping your hands, or making other noises.
- Make sure the bear has an escape route.
- If a bear enters your home, provide it with an escape route by propping all doors open.
- Avoid direct eye contact, which may be perceived by a bear as a challenge. Never run from a bear. Instead, slowly back away.
- To scare the bear away, make loud noises by yelling, banging pots and pans or using an airhorn. Make yourself look as big as possible by waving your arms. If you are with someone else, stand close together with your arms raised above your head.
- The bear may utter a series of huffs, make

popping jaw sounds by snapping its jaws and swat the ground. These are warning signs that you are too close. Slowly back away, avoid direct eye contact and do not run.

- If a bear stands on its hind legs or moves closer, it may be trying to get a better view or detect scents in the air. It is usually not a threatening behavior.
- Black bears will sometimes "bluff charge" when cornered, threatened or attempting to steal food. Stand your ground, avoid direct eye contact, then slowly back away. Do not run.
- If the bear does not leave, move to a secure
- Immediately notify the DEP's 24-hour, tollfree hotline at 1-877-WARN DEP (1-877-927-6337).
- Families who live in areas with high black bear populations should have a "Bear Plan" in place for children, with whistles, air horns and an escape route.
- Black bear attacks are extremely rare. If a black bear does attack, fight back!




