SUPERINTENDENT & BOARD OF EDUCATION HONORED BY HISTORICAL SOCIETY

Superintendent of Schools, Margaret Dolan, Ed.D., and the Westfield Board of Education are the 2017 recipients of the Trustee's Award from the Westfield Historical Society. Presented at the annual dinner of the Historical Society on May 12, the award recognizes the "Board's notable contribution to the preservation of Westfield's heritage." For many years, the Board of Education's administration building at 302 Elm Street has provided space for the Westfield Historical Society's archives.

Upon receiving the award, Dr. Dolan remarked, "The Westfield Public Schools and

the Historical Society have a lot in common. We both want to preserve and continue the tradition of excellence in this town."

"I can attest to the fact that as educators in Westfield, we have relied on the Westfield Historical Society to enhance our students' understanding of the town's earliest beginnings," explained Dr. Dolan.

"For decades, our teachers have brought students to the Historical Society offices as part of the social studies curriculum devoted to local and state history," she added.

Dr. Dolan also noted that with the proximity of the archives on the third floor of the Board of Education administration building for many years, students and staff have perused through the stored documents in preparation of school anniversaries, facility studies, and various presentations, including the video created in 2016 entitled "The History of Westfield Public Schools." (https://vimeo.com/179058828).

In addition to the presentation by the Westfield Historical Society whose dinner thee was "Education in the Community," Dr. Dolan and the Board of Education received a resolution from the State of New Jersey Senate and General Assembly commending the preservation of Westfield's heritage and for 'demonstrating a remarkable measure of public spiritedness . . . and record of service, leadership and commitment."

Dr. Dolan pledged that the school district would continue to work hard to provide outstanding education in Westfield. "We strive to pave the way for our students to become responsible citizens in an ever-changing world, with an understanding and respect for the past," she stated.

In closing, she remarked, "Thank you again to Historical Society Westfield acknowledging the strong and valuable partnership that we share. I am certain it will continue to thrive for many years to come."







UNDERSTANDING NEW JERSEY'S CHILD CUSTODY ARRANGEMENTS

In New Jersey, there are two basic concepts of child custody. The more familiar concept is "physical" custody which refers to where and with whom the child will live. When parents share "joint physical" custody, the child lives with each parent for a certain amount of time during the year. A parent with whom the child spends most of their time is designated as the Parent of Primary Residence ("PPR") or the primary caretaker. The parent with whom the child has time-sharing is designated as the Parent of Alternate Residence ("PAR") or secondary caretaker. Generally, unless there is a concern that the parent of alternate residence will harm the child, parenting time or visitation rights will not be withheld.

The less familiar but equally important concept is "legal" custody which refers to a parent's right to make decisions concerning their child, such as medical treatment, selection of healthcare providers, education, engaging in what might be considered hazardous activities and other significant decisions. In most cases, parents will have joint legal custody of a child and share the decision-making responsibilities. In some instances, however, the judge may award sole custody where only one parent has legal and physical custody. This is a relatively rare occurrence that is ordered only when the other parent is absent or legally unfit. A parent may be unfit if he or she has engaged in child abuse or neglect or is struggling with an addiction to alcohol or drugs. Absent such circumstances, a joint legal custodial relationship among parents is the preferred arrangement since it is likely to foster the best interests of the child.

A recent Court decision restated that "the prime criterion for establishing a joint legal custodial relationship between divorced or separated parents centers on the ability of those parents to agree, communicate, and cooperate in matters relating to the health, safety, and welfare of the child notwithstanding animosity or acrimony they may harbor towards each other. The ability of parents to put aside their personal differences and work together for the best interests of their

child is the true measure of a healthy parent-child relationship."

Once the parties have agreed or a Court has ruled that they will have joint legal custody of their child, the issue becomes implementing and exercising such a joint custodial arrangement. Joint legal custody requires the parents to discuss and consult with each other regarding "major" decisions affecting the health, education and welfare of the child. Sometimes there is often a conflict as to what is a "major" decision versus a "day-to-day" decision. Such "day-to-day" decisions are generally determined by the primary custodian.

Major decisions can be as varied as the children they affect. The most common major decisions parents face are medical or health related issues of the child, choice or change of religious affiliation, choosing a summer camp, international travel, interstate travel for time-sharing when one parent has relocated, the appropriateness or cost of extracurricular activities, choice of private school and/or college, course of study or selection of major course of study at college, etc.

Unfortunately, the acrimony the parties displayed during the marriage does not always subside after the matter is resolved. The parents often continue the battle between themselves when discussing issues affecting their child. When discussion and compromise does not result in a resolution by the parties, our Courts are called upon to make decisions regarding these major issues regarding the child. This is seldom the best remedy.




