JASON EITEL CYCLING FOR CANCER RESEARCH

On August 5 and 6, Jason Eitel of Berkeley Heights will cycle up to 192 miles in the Pan-Mass Challenge (PMC) with the goal of raising \$48 million for critical research and cancer care at Dana-Farber Cancer Institute.

During PMC weekend, more than 6,200 cyclists from more than 40 states and eight countries will return to Massachusetts to participate in the PMC, choosing from 12 routes of varying mileage that run through 46 towns. Cyclists are anywhere between 15 and 84-years-old and range from seasoned triathletes to weekend warriors who trained for this event alone.

“We are thrilled to be approaching our 38th PMC ride weekend. Seeing our growth over the years has been truly incredible and we look forward to achieving our fundraising goal of \$48 million for Dana-Farber,” said Billy Starr, founder and executive director of the PMC. “We want to wish all of our riders and volunteers a safe and enjoyable ride weekend – I’ll see everyone out on the road.”

Many riders participate in the PMC to honor a family member or friend lost to, or being treated for, cancer. More than 820 riders and volunteers are cancer survivors or current patients, considered “Living Proof” of the PMC mission to find a cure. The average cyclist trains for three months, solicits 40 sponsors and raises more than \$7,000. Volunteers, spectators, donors and sponsors are part of the camaraderie on ride weekend, all working together toward a cure.

No other single athletic event raises or contributes more money to charity than the PMC. Since 1980, the PMC has raised \$547 million dollars for Dana-Farber through the Jimmy Fund, its fundraising arm. In fact, the PMC is Dana-Farber’s largest single contributor, raising more than 52 percent of the Jimmy Fund’s annual revenue.

The PMC has since raised \$547 million for adult and pediatric patient care and cancer research at Dana-Farber Cancer Institute through the Jimmy Fund. The event donates 100 percent of every rider-raised dollar directly to the cause. The PMC generates more than 52 percent of the Jimmy Fund’s annual revenue and is Dana-Farber’s single largest contributor. The PMC has successfully melded support from committed cyclists, volunteers, corporate sponsors and individual contributors. All are essential to the PMC’s goal and model: to attain maximum fundraising efficiency while increasing its annual gift. The PMC’s hope and aspiration is to provide Dana-Farber’s doctors and researchers with the necessary resources to discover cures for all cancers. SPRINGFIELD AVENUE BRIDGE CLOSURE INFORMATION

According to Union County government, the culvert on Springfield Ave between Snyder Ave and Kuntz Ave in Berkeley Heights will be under construction beginning on or about July 17 for approximately 2 months.

The work being performed will consist of reconstruction of the culvert beneath the roadway. Due to the nature of the work involved, the amount of men and machinery required, the road will be closed 24/7 for the entire length of the project in the area of work to optimize the safety of the work crews and motoring public alike. A clearly marked detour route will be

established and maintained by the county contractor for both cars and trucks. Emergency vehicles will need to plan alternate routes around the closure. Access to residences and businesses, including deliveries and other services will be allowed from either end of the road closure but no thru traffic will be allowed in the work zone.



SAGE VOLUNTEERS WERE LIFESAVERS FOR BERKELEY HEIGHTS WOMAN

It's no exaggeration when Geraldine says the volunteers at SAGE Eldercare "saved [her] life."

She fell getting out of bed and broke her hip the night before she was to receive groceries from SAGE, a grocery shopping and errand service. When volunteer Judy Leane arrived with groceries that morning, she knew something was amiss when Geraldine didn't greet her at the door of her Berkeley Heights home. She called SAGE Volunteer Coordinator Amy Stuart, who went by to check for herself and found the house still locked and dark. She felt in her gut something must be wrong, as it wasn't like Geraldine to miss her weekly visit. Stuart called family members and then the police, who ended up breaking down the door. Geraldine was found inside and had been on the floor all night. In the following days, she found herself dealing with a pin in her leg and a broken hip. Geraldine underwent a two-week stay in the hospital and a full month of rehabilitation before she returned home and resumed the SAGE services.

"And here I am, thanks to the people of SAGE who were insistent that I was home," Geraldine said. "The grocery shopping service saved my life, literally."

Another SAGE volunteer, Judy Chicka of Summit, was holding Geraldine's hand as she woke up from her surgery – before Geraldine's family could arrive – and helped her with getting to follow-up doctor appointments. Chicka had met Geraldine in her capacity as a volunteer for Meals with Friends, a friendly visitor program that SAGE offers to minimize social isolation. The two have lunch and chats once a week, and talk on the phone regularly. "We have a special friendship. If we had met some other way, we would have become friends. Geraldine is a very interesting person with a wonderful, creative mind," Chicka shared.

Now, Geraldine is equipped with a medical alert monitoring system (which SAGE can also

help arrange) and she happily greeted Leane with a big smile on a recent visit. Her smile only grew larger when she saw the bags of food, especially the eclairs and the banana she'd ordered – Leane had been extra careful to pick out "just the right one."

"When you're shopping for someone else, you really feel like you have to do the best job. If she's only getting one banana, I'm going to make sure it is a really good one. When you're shopping for yourself, you might not realize how many choices there can be," said Leane, a Chatham resident.

The grocery shopping service offered by SAGE helps homebound seniors get personalized shopping for a small fee. Volunteers take the senior's grocery list each week, pick up the items in the Shop-Rite of Millburn (on Thursdays) or Stirling (on Wednesdays), and then deliver the groceries to their kitchen, while providing a watchful eye and a friendly visit. The grocery shopping and errand service reaches older adults living in areas surrounding Summit, where SAGE is based.

"For us, it's good to get out and see different people and feel helpful," said Chris Finazzo, Leane's neighbor and her shopping helper. And for Chicka, who wasn't able to be around when her parents were older and relied on others to keep them company, volunteering for SAGE is her way of "paying it forward."

For Geraldine and other grocery shopping service recipients, it's both a chance to get fresh groceries when they otherwise couldn't get out of the house, and to entertain a friendly visitor. She responds to Leane's farewell of, "It's good to see you, have a great day," with her own enthusiastic, "It is ALWAYS good to see SAGE!"

REEVES-REED AND BRIDGES JOIN FORCES TO CULTIVATE PEOPLE

Bridges Outreach (www.bridgesoutreach.org) has been providing the necessities to people experiencing homelessness for almost 30 years. Reeves-Reed Arboretum has been transforming lives through nature-rich experiences for well over 40 years. This summer the Arboretum and Bridges have launched a remarkable partnership that brings together the best of both organizations and, potentially, can be modeled by similar organizations moving forward. This job readiness pilot program trains vetted homeless candidates in basic gardening and facilities management skills at the Arboretum. Upon successful completion of the program, the Arboretum vendors will work together in seeking job interviews and possible placement as the ultimate goal.

"Reeves-Reed Arboretum is honored to partner with this extraordinary organization, and to use horticulture and nature to help people seeking second-chance opportunities," says RRA Executive Director, Frank Juliano. Currently, the Arboretum staff is working with Stanley Simms. According to Lois Bhatt, Executive Director of Bridges Outreach, "The reasons for his (Stanley)

current situation aren't as important as his willingness to learn to work on a team. The obvious intent of this program is to foster employment, to 'cultivate people', and to act as a 'Bridge' to a new life. Mr. Simms is a wonderful fit for the Arboretum. 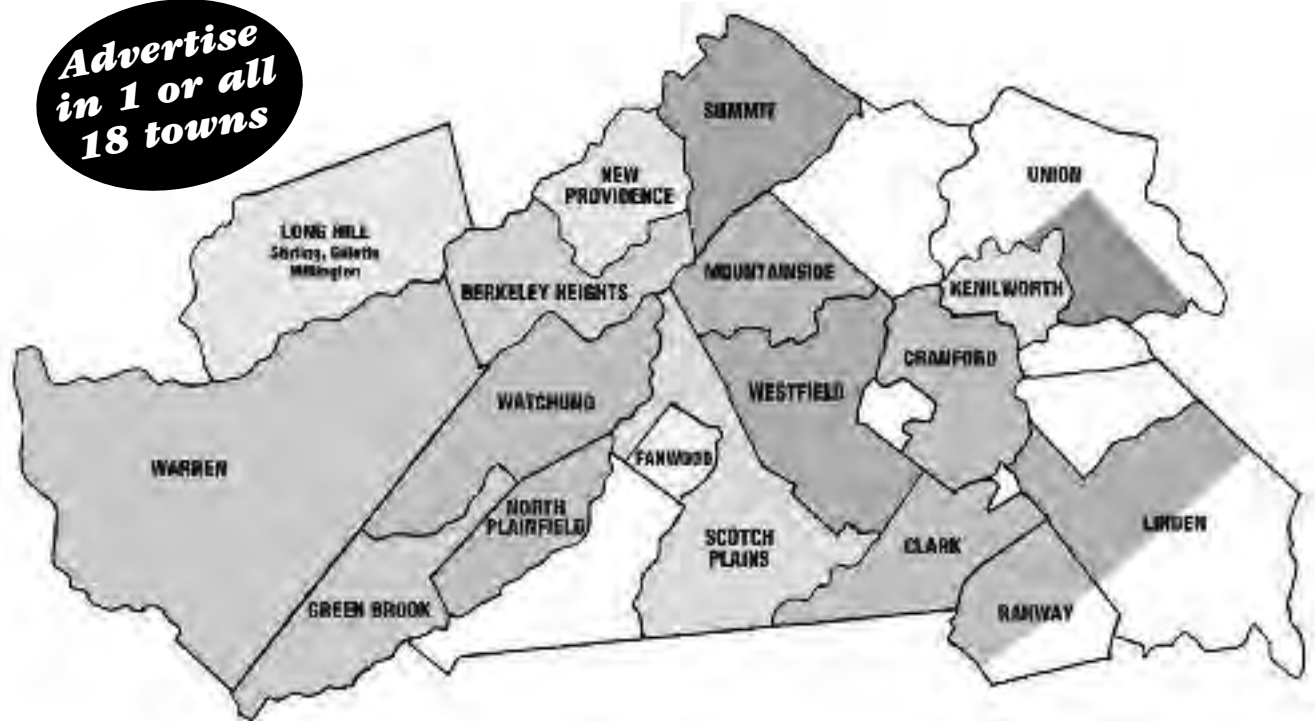

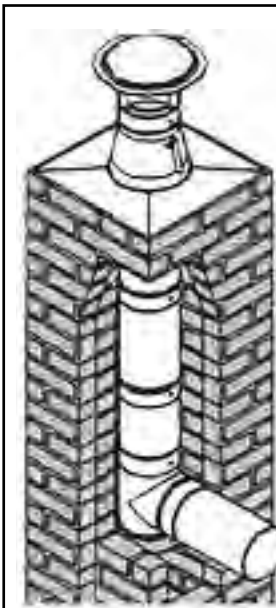
