JASON EITEL CYCLING FOR CANCER RESEARCH

On August 5 and 6, Jason Eitel of Berkeley Heights will cycle up to 192 miles in the Pan-Mass Challenge (PMC) with the goal of raising \$48 million for critical research and cancer care at Dana-Farber Cancer Institute.

During PMC weekend, more than 6,200 cyclists from more than 40 states and eight countries will return to Massachusetts to participate in the PMC, choosing from 12 routes of varying mileage that run through 46 towns. Cyclists are anywhere between 15 and 84-years-old and range from seasoned triathletes to weekend warriors who trained for this event alone.

"We are thrilled to be approaching our 38th PMC ride weekend. Seeing our growth over the years has been truly incredible and we look forward to achieving our fundraising goal of \$48 million for Dana-Farber," said Billy Starr, founder and executive director of the PMC. "We want to wish all of our riders and volunteers a safe and enjoyable ride weekend – I'll see everyone out on the road."

Many riders participate in the PMC to honor a family member or friend lost to, or being treated for, cancer. More than 820 riders and volunteers are cancer survivors or current patients, considered "Living Proof" of the PMC mission to find a cure. The average cyclist trains for three months, solicits 40 sponsors and raises more than \$7,000. Volunteers, spectators, donors and sponsors are part of the camaraderie on ride weekend, all working together toward a cure.

No other single athletic event raises or contributes more money to charity than the PMC. Since 1980, the PMC has raised \$547 million dollars for Dana-Farber through the Jimmy Fund, its fundraising arm. In fact, the PMC is Dana-Farber's largest single contributor, raising more than 52 percent of the Jimmy Fund's annual revenue.

SPRINGFIELD AVENUE BRIDGE CLOSURE INFORMATION

According to Union County government, the culvert on Springfield Ave between Snyder Ave and Kuntz Ave in Berkeley Heights will be under construction beginning on or about July 17 for approximately 2 months.

The work being performed will consist of reconstruction of the culvert beneath the roadway. Due to the nature of the work involved, the amount of men and machinery required, the road will be closed 24/7 for the entire length of the project in the area of work to optimize the safety of the work crews and motoring public alike. A clearly marked detour route will be

established and maintained by the county contractor for both cars and trucks. Emergency vehicles will need to plan alternate routes around the closure. Access to residences and businesses, including deliveries and other services will be allowed from either end of the road closure but no thru traffic will be allowed in the work zone.





Bridges Outreach (www.bridgesoutreach.org) has been providing the necessities to people experiencing homelessness for almost 30 years. Reeves-Reed Arboretum has been transforming lives through nature-rich experiences for well over 40 years. This job readiness pilot program trains vetted homeless candidates in basic gardening and facilities management skills at the Arboretum. 
