EAT AROUND THE WORLD, LOCALLY DURING BERKELEY HEIGHTS RESTAURANT WEEK

From Septembell through 17, Berkeley Heights will host its first official Restaurant Week. A total of 23 food and drink establishments are participating, offering a range of cuisines for breakfast, lunch, snacks, and dinner to residents of Berkeley Heights and adjacent towns.

"Berkeley Heights is becoming a real dining destination," said Julie Lloyd, Chairperson of the Downtown Beautification Committee, which is organizing the event in cooperation with local establishment owners and the Suburban Chamber of Commerce. "Our participating establishments range from fine dining to sandwich shops, and with liquor, snack, and convenience stores joining in, there are choices for all tastes and budgets."

The theme, "Eat Around the World, Locally," ties to the Passport diners can download (at ExperienceBH.com) or pick up at participating establishments. Each time a diner makes a purchase, the participating establishment will stamp the Passport. Those diners who collect at least five stamps from any of the participating establishments during Restaurant Week can enter to win a gift card.

Berkeley Heights Restaurant Week is being promoted to residents of Berkeley Heights, Long Hill, New Providence, Chatham, Warren, and Mountainside.

Jeanne Kingsley, Berkeley Heights Town Council member and liaison to the Beautification Committee, said: "Our town's motto is "Where Tradition Meets Tomorrow" and even our Restaurant Week reflects our small-town ethos and focus on family. Both the Berkeley Heights Y and Berkeley Heights Recreation Department are offering childcare activities."

Weekday Lunch Out: BH Recreation Department has created a special Restaurant Week program. Parents can drop off children, age 2 to 6 and potty-trained, along with a bagged lunch at Berkeley Heights Recreation at 56 Columbus Avenue and their trained staff will look after them while you enjoy lunch from a participating establishment. The program runs from 12 noon to 2 pm, Monday through Friday of Restaurant Week, and the fee is \$20 per child. No advance registration is required.

Parent's Night Out—Friday Night is Date Night: The Berkeley Heights Y is offering "Pajama Party at the Y" on Friday, September 15 from 6 pm to 9 pm. Children between the ages of 4 and 11 will be split into two groups to eat a pizza dinner, watch a movie, and play active games. UNION COUNTY INTERFAITH COORDINATING COUNCIL



From 11 a.m. to 4 p.m., the pet-friendly event, which attracts up to 3,000 attendees each year, will feature rescue dog adoptions, food and merchandise vendors, family activities, professional photos, canine contests—including the annual 'Mr. and Mrs. Bark-a-Que' Costume Contest—and on-site prizes and giveaways.

"We're so thrilled to welcome our community to join us for a day of food and fun as we celebrate the more than 5,300 dogs we have rescued since our inception," Richard Errico, Home for Good's co-founder and treasurer, said. "We hope to see so many new faces in 2017 at our exciting new venue in Springfield."

In addition to welcoming the general public and all of Home for Good's adoptive families, "Bark-a-Que" hosts the rescue's largest adoption event of the year. In 2016, the festivities placed nearly 30 dogs with loving permanent households.

"We are committed to rescuing dogs from high-kill shelters throughout South Carolina and Georgia, nurturing them at our rescue facility in Aiken, SC, and transporting them northward to New Jersey for adoption," Errico explained.

As a 100-percent foster-based organization, Home for Good then places each animal with a volunteer family rather than in a kennel or shelter until adoption into a loving, permanent home.

"Seeing our dogs go to good families makes all the hard work worth it," long-time volunteer Anna Newmark of Warren, NJ said. "But even if you're not ready to adopt right now, 'Bark-a-Que' is definitely a great time for adults and kids of all ages. It's just a fun day for any pet lover!"
