AMY SIEGEL LOXLEY OPENS IRISH DANCE SCHOOL

Irish dancing comes to Green Brook this fall, when Heritage Irish Dance Company opens its doors to dancers of all levels at its new studio located in Sansone Plaza, 319 Rt. 22 East, Green Brook.

The school will offer several free classes including a demonstration of hard and soft-shoe dancing, a trial class for prospective new students and a discussion with parents on September 6th, 7th and 8th at 6 pm. Classes are open to boys and girls ages 2.5 to 18.

Classes will be taught by Amy Siegel Loxley of Bridgewater, formerly of Warren. Amy graduated from Watchung Hills Regional in 1997. Her parents still live in Warren and her father, Alan A. Siegel, is the Planning Board attorney. Amy is a World Champion Irish Dancer and former cast member of "Riverdance the Show" and "Riverdance on Broadway." Ms. Siegel Loxley, one the few American women to have won the World Championships of Irish Dance, has performed in countless cities across the United States and Canada. She studied Irish dance under the tutelage of Peter Smith for 18 years before passing her Irish Dance Teacher's and Adjudicator's Exams in 2001 and 2009 respectively.

Heritage Irish Dance Company dancers have performed at Radio City Music Hall, Carnegie Hall, The New Jersey Performing Arts Center in Newark, Rutgers Athletic Center, The Prudential Center, Madison Square Garden and at countless local venues.

After winning the All-Ireland and North American Championships, Heritage Irish Dance Company alumna and assistant teacher, Sarah Oldam, is currently touring with "Riverdance." Each year Heritage Irish Dance Company sends between 15 and 20 dancers to Ireland or Scotland to compete in the World Championships of Irish Dance.

Irish dance is a cultural art form made popular by such long-running shows as "Riverdance" and "Lord of the Dance." As well as being enjoyable, Irish dancing is a way for young people to make friends, keep fit and learn about Irish culture. "Organized physical activity has been shown to be an important part of every child's social, intellectual and physical development," said instructor Loxley. "Boys and girls who take

AUGUST 16TH IS NAMED ANN LAHOFF DAY

Anne LaHoff, a former dance teacher who once danced with Fred Astaire, celebrated her 101st birthday at The Chelsea at Warren surrounded by friends and family, on Wednesday, August 16, 2017.

Warren Mayor Carolann Garafola read a proclamation honoring Mrs. LaHoff and naming August 16th Ann LaHoff day in Warren.

Mrs. LaHoff, who was born in Jersey City and later moved to North Arlington, was a career employee of RCA in Harrison where she supervised the manufacture of vacuum tubes. The highlight of her second career as a ballroom dance instructor came in 1949 when she won the Viennese Waltz portion of the Harvest Moon Dance competition in New York. The prize was a dance with legendary performer Fred Astaire. "Fred Astaire was a good dancer," recalled Mrs. LaHoff, "but not as good as my husband." Mrs. LaHoff was joined at her Chelsea birthday party by her many Chelsea friends, her nephew Michael Miller of Oradell and his wife Elaine.



MT. HOREB SCHOOL SERVES AS WAY STATION FOR YOUNG MUSICIANS

If you happened to be driving past Mt. Horeb School in the predawn hours of Wed, Aug. 2, you may have wondered aloud as a huge caravan of buses and trucks arrived, with weary teens and adults filing out onto the elementary campus normally so quiet during these dog days of summer.

The convoy belongs to The Cadets, one of the world's oldest continually operating drum and bugle corps. The group of about 150 young adults and 30 staff members and volunteers stopped in Warren at Mt. Horeb School for some much needed rest before moving onto their next competitive performance in Clifton.

"Oh boy," says Kevin Carlsen, a 20-year-old Mechanicsville, player from Pennsylvania, when asked to how many states over how many days the corps has travelled. "It's about 17 states in 85 days."

The Cadets are one of about 45 drum corps who tour the country each summer, performing nightly in stadiums across the United States. Each corps is made up of brass musicians, percussionists, and a color guard. The group travels as a self-contained unit with tour buses, equipment trailers, a mobile kitchen, instructional staff and a team of parent volunteers.

"Every day I wake up and think 'where are we?" says 18-year-old Amelia Wang, a color guard member from Chapel Hill, North Carolina. "It's intense, but it's a lot of fun."

Typically, a drum corps like this spends overnights between performances in high schools where members have access to showers and rehearsal facilities. On this particular drive up from a late performance in Annapolis, Maryland, however, this group just needed a place to lay their heads for several hours.

Warren Township Schools Superintendent Dr. Matthew Mingle, Business Administrator Patricia Leonhardt, Buildings and Grounds Supervisor Michael Pate and Mt. Horeb Head Custodian Luis Marciscano and his crew worked together to make sure all was in order for the unique visit.

"It is wonderful to be able to support a group of dedicated young people. The level of drive and determination it takes to persevere through the challenges of a summer drum corps season prepares participating students to become leaders in the future," says Mingle, who played trumpet in the Crossmen, a drum and bugle corps now based out of San Antonio, Texas and who spent a summer working in support of The Cadets and Crossmen while they were on the road.

An advance team member arrived at Mt. Horeb shortly after midnight on Aug. 2 to tour the school and prepare for the corps' arrival. At about 5 a.m., the buses and trucks pulled in. Each young musician and adult staff/volunteer set up his/her own air mattress in the gymnasium, all purpose room or library and promptly went to sleep. Wake-up call was at 9:00 a.m. and by 10:30 a.m., the group was packed and on the road to Clifton, leaving the school as spotless as it was before their arrival.

been more appreciative of their time in Warren. One young man took the time to track down our custodial staff to tell them that Mt. Horeb was the cleanest school the corps has stayed in all summer," says Mingle. "Knowing how much pride our staff puts into maintaining our facilities, this was the ultimate compliment and reflects positively on the entire Warren Township Schools community."

The Cadets range in age from 14 to 21. Most hail from the mid-Atlantic region but others come from as far as Texas and even Germany. Each year, roughly 750 musicians audition for one of the 150 coveted spots with the drum corps. This year's team auditioned last winter and held monthly rehearsals and training into June before taking the show on the road. They've performed in Texas, Oklahoma, Tennessee, Arkansas, Florida, Ohio and many more states, ending the season in mid-August with a national competition in Indianapolis, Indiana.

"Every year is different... the students, the music," says George Hopkins, CEO & Executive Director of Youth Education in the Arts, the nonprofit organization that runs The Cadets and other performing arts teams. "Two nights ago we had a standing ovation."

"Each show is a way for us to make it our best show," adds trumpeter Kevin Carlsen. "The show we had in May, for example, is nothing like the show we'll have today."

MOVING WITH YOUR CHILDREN OUT-OF-STATE AFTER A DIVORCE

One of the most contentious issues faced by many divorced parents has always been whether the custodial parent has the right to relocate with the parties' children out of state. In an increasingly mobile society this has become an issue for many parents. Often custodial parents decide that they cannot continue to reside in New Jersey. They need to explore job opportunities in other states and/or move back to a state where they were raised and may have a family-type support system in place. They may have started a relationship with someone who resides out-of-state or may be contemplating marriage with that person who has an established career in another state. For years, the custodial parent could not permanently remove the children from the state of New Jersey without the written consent of the other party or a court Order. If there was no agreement, the party wishing to move would petition the court for permission. Over the past several decades the standard our Courts have used to make this determination has evolved. For more than 15 years, the standard has been that the prospect of moving the children out of state would be granted unless it was "inimical to the child's interest."

Last month, the New Jersey Supreme Court changed the standard that lower courts are to utilize when determining whether or not a custodial parent may relocate the children out of New Jersey. It was also determined that this new standard would apply whether or not the party seeking to move has been the child's primary residential parent. This ruling represents a significant departure from existing law by changing the standard a court is obligated to interpret. It also gives the noncustodial parent considerably more input and seeks to protect the rights of both parents.

When examining the issue of relocation our courts are now charged with determining whether there is "cause" (to be interpreted under the existing statute) to authorize a child's relocation out of New Jersey. To do so, courts are now obligated to weigh many factors including, but not limited to: "the parents' ability to agree, to communicate and cooperate in matters relating to the child; the parents' willingness to accept custody and any history of unwillingness to allow parenting time not based on substantiated abuse; the interaction and relationship of the child with its parents and siblings; the history of domestic violence, if any; the safety of the child and the safety of either parent from

physical abuse by the other parent; the preferences of the child when of sufficient age and capacity to reason so as to form an intelligent decision; the needs of the child; the stability of the home environment offered; the quality and continuity of the child's education; the fitness of the parents' homes; the extent and quality of the time spent with the child prior to or subsequent to the separation; the parents' employment responsibilities; and the age and number of children."

The court found that such a showing of "cause" was required "to preserve the rights of the noncustodial parent and the child to maintain and develop their familial relationship." Furthermore, in making the determination of "cause" the court must examine the custodial parent's interest in freedom of movement as qualified by his or her custodial obligation, the State's interest in protecting the best interests of the child, and the competing interests of the noncustodial parent."

In conducting their best interest analysis, the Supreme Court has directed the lower courts to consider the position of the parent of primary residence who might have important insights about the current and proposed arrangement that will most effectively serve the child. Of similar importance is the input of the parent of alternate residence who may similarly offer significant information about the child. The court also stated that the views of other adults who have significant relationships with the child may also lend assistance to the Court in making its determination. Lower courts were instructed to consider all of the above in addition to other evidence including documentary evidence, judicial interviews with the child conducted at the court's discretion and expert testimony. Courts often rely on the expertise of psychologists and other mental health professionals when making these determinations.

This new standard has a great impact on those parents who are either seeking to move out of New Jersey with their children or wish to object to such a request by their former spouse. Each case in this regard is extremely fact sensitive and requires a family lawyer with experience.





"UNEXPECTED: WHAT IS A PAINTING?" AT THE WATCHUNG ARTS CENTER

With the upcoming exhibit, the Watchung Art Center asks the question, what is painting. The exhibit titled, "Unexpected: What is a Painting?" will be on view from September 5th thru September 30th, 2017. A reception will be held on September 10th from 1-4pm with other events to be announced. The exhibit will be on display in the Heinz W. Otto Gallery at the Watchung Art Center, 18 Stirling Road, Watchung, NJ. The reception and exhibit are free and open to the public.

In this exhibit, the curators carefully selected

a group of established and emerging artists whose art challenges us to consider what is a painting. Historically a canvas sits on an easel. With brushes and knives, an artist applies paint. But the paradigm and boundaries of what is considered a painting continue to change. This may range from an intentionally torn canvas to painting on metal. The concept of what painting materials can be used has been altered radically. Contemporary artists are creating 'paintings' with paper, found objects, coffee, mud, paint, bicycle tubes and even electronics.

Where artists once reveled in emphasizing a flat 2D picture plane, the canvas now takes on a new dimension. One artist in the exhibit, pours skeins of acrylic paint on a glass pallet before attaching the dried paint to a structure. The idea of paint being applied to a flat surface has been turned on its head. Another exhibitor paints in a traditional manner with brushes and casein paint, but plays with our understanding of painting by adding elements to the canvas that break up the division between painting and sculpture. Pushing the envelope further, several participants explore

the use of technology on art with digital printing, plastics and light as their materials. This exhibit features renowned established artists as well as younger artists who are emerging, experimenting, and slowly beginning to make their mark in the art world.

Guest curator, artist and painter, Gail Winbury and Watchung Art's Center's board member and artist, Paul XO Pinkman, jointly curate this exhibit.

The artists in this exhibit include Gregory Coates, Steve DeFrank, Monica Delgado, Pat Lay, Laura Petrovich-Cheney, Kaare Rafoss, Christine Romanell, Fausto Sevila, Eric Valosin, Gail Winbury, and Etty Yaniv.

The exhibit runs from September 5th through September 30th. The Gallery is open Tuesday through Saturday each week from September through June.

Parth's Eagle service project was the construction of a wooden trailhead in the parking lot of Stransky Farms, a Warren township green-space where members of the community hike and enjoy nature. His trailhead included a map of the area, some background information and history of the farm, and a QR link for those hikers seeking more information. 
