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# **2017 WHRHS GRADUATION**

Under brilliant mid-morning late-June skies, and in front of family, relatives, friends, administrators, teachers and each other, more than 540 students received their diplomas on Thursday, June 22, on the field in Tozier Stadium at the 60th Commencement of Watchung Hills Regional High School (WHRHS).

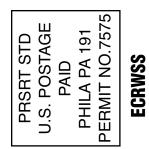
Principal George Alexis said humans are drawn to stories. "They delight us. They teach us. They touch our souls. They help us make sense of the world, and remind us we are part of a larger world."

A graduate of WHRHS himself, Alexis said the Class of 2017 had left its mark on the school, which first opened its doors to students in 1957. He urged the Class of 2017 to continue to reason critically, ask questions freely, solve problems, be curious, explore new ideas, forge their own narrative journeys boldly, and write their own stories. "Do your best," Alexis said.

He ended, quoting the late beloved Juan Carlos Cruz, the Spanish Teacher, soccer and track coach, cultural ambassador, mentor and friend who died unexpectedly and quite young in October. The quote is something many members of the Class of 2017 had heard Cruz say often, urging students to put everything into what they were doing. Alexis said, "As Señor Cruz would say, "Empty The Tank!"

The TEDx event, which was the brainchild of 2017 WHRHS graduate Vineet Parikh, championed student empowerment, innovation and inspiration. Youth@WHRHS was an example of immediate discussions about how student inspiration, innovation, and empowerment can be turned into real, everyday improvements for WHRHS.

For some individuals, removing their shoes can be embarrassing because they suffer with foot odor. # **IMAGINE WELCOMES NEW VOLUNTEERS**

On July 7-10th for 32-hours 16 new volunteers were trained to take on a year-long commitment at Imagine, A Center for Coping with Loss as volunteer facilitators. The training is delivered by Imagine clinical staff who model how to provide support using mirroring and reflection and by immersing the volunteers in the experience of a support group. "The training was so rich and gave me a true sense of how to facilitate as well as the value in the work we do," said one newly trained facilitator, Maria Mujica.

"Volunteers are the heart and soul of Imagine and we could not be more grateful to all of the people who take on this commitment," said Mary Robinson, Imagine Executive Director.

"Since moving into our new space (244 Sheffield St., Mountainside, NJ) we have grown quickly as anticipated," said Mandi Zucker, Imagine's Program Director. "These new

volunteers mean we can start a fifth Night of Support in September serving 60 additional children and adults without having to place anyone on a waiting list. We now provide support groups on Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays, offering more choices and flexibility to the participants that need it."

Imagine offers free year-round grief support groups for people ages 3-30 as well as parents/guardians of the children who have had a parent or sibling die, and for people coping with a family member with a terminal or chronic illness. Support groups meet on weekday nights for an hour and a half. Dinner is provided prior to the group meeting.

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# **ALL STUDENTS REQUIRED TO RE-REGISTER BEFORE FALL**

All parents/ guardians are required to complete a re-registration packet for their child or children who will be attending borough schools this fall, and finalize the process in person before 3 p.m., Wednesday, Sept. 6.

Kindergarten students who have registered have already provided this information, according to Superintendent Barbara Resko.

"This summer, the district is conducting a reregistration process to be in compliance with N.J.S.A. 18A:38-1 and N.J.A.C. 6A:22," said Resko. "In addition, this process aligns with the district's initiative to increase safety and security measures."

Resko said re-registration is being done to make sure that all student contact information has the most current information.

The school district wants to be able to reassure taxpayers that only students residing in the

district are getting the benefits of attending Watchung public schools, Resko said.

This re-registration process was last conducted four years ago in the summer of 2013.

The process of re-registering all students is both time and labor intensive, Resko said, so it made sense to administrators to conduct the reregistration during the summer, when schedules are lighter.

Plus parents have all summer to re-register. The process opened on Tuesday, June 27.

When parents/guardians have gathered and completed all of the necessary information, they are asked to visit the Main Office at Bayberry Elementary School to finalize the re-registration process.

"Mike Vignola and/or John Primeau will be available from 9 a.m. to noon, and 1 to 3 p.m., Tuesday through Thursday all summer to assist with this process," said Resko. "For your convenience, we will be open on Wednesdays in August from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m. by appointment only. Please call the Main Office at (908) 755-8184 to schedule an evening appointment."

The following information is required when reregistering: Completed registration form; Original Birth Certificate and/or Passport for each child; and Proof of Residency.

Parents/guardians must use original documents for proof of residence, and only the parent/guardian may register their child and must provide photo identification when registering.

# **ALEXANDRA BENC'S GOLD AWARD PROJECT**

Watchung working toward her Gold Award in Girl Scouts. A 2017 graduate of Watchung Hills, Alexandra earned her Bronze Award in scouting in elementary school and her Silver Award while a student at Valley View Middle School. The Gold Award is the highest achievement within the Girl Scout organization. The project requires a minimum of 80 hours of work in planning and completing the Scout's vision, and the project must provide a sustainable, lasting benefit to the target community. Only 5.4% of eligible Girl Scouts successfully earn the Gold Award.

In considering many different project ideas, Alexandra decided to pursue one that would benefit the local community, combining her love of history and community service by creating a driving scavenger hunt with stops at various historical sites in Watchung. She began her project by visiting with local historians at the Texier House in the fall of 2016. While talking with members of the historical committee, Alexandra learned that the reproduction outhouse on the site of the Texier House needed a few small repairs and repainting. With the help of Michelle DeRocco, Borough Clerk, and Bob Burns, head of the Watchung Public Works

Alexandra Benc is a lifelong resident of Department, paint and supplies for the project were obtained and work got underway during the first week of summer vacation. A team of Boy and Girl Scouts as well as friends led by Alexandra cleaned and painted the outhouse. Repairs to the inside of the structure were made by Tim Logan, a fellow Watchung resident, who offered to lend a hand when he heard about the project. Two local businesses, Dunkin Donuts of Watchung and Dominos of Warren, generously donated food and snacks for the volunteer team.

> Work is underway on the final portion of the project, the driving scavenger hunt. Once the project is complete, groups of scouts and other young people will be able to follow a preplanned, environmentally-friendly route through Watchung that will stop at important sites including Wetumpka Falls, God's Acre, the Arts Center, and, of course, the Texier House and outhouse. Once Alexandra's Gold Award project is completed by the end of the summer, she will meet with the local council for a review of her final project results and report.

> Alexandra has been accepted to James Madison University in Harrisonburg, Virginia, where she will major in political science. Aside from her Girl Scout activities, she and her family

She is a member of the National Dance Honor Society. Academically, she is an AP Scholar and Honor Roll student.
