FORMER "RIVERDANCE" CAST MEMBER AND WORLD CHAMPION OPENS IRISH DANCE SCHOOL IN GREEN BROOK

Irish dancing comes to Green Brook this fall, when Heritage Irish Dance Company opens its doors to dancers of all levels at its new studio located in Sansone Plaza, 319 Rt. 22 East, Green Brook.

The school will offer several free classes including a demonstration of hard and soft-shoe dancing, a trial class for prospective new students and a discussion with parents on September 6th, 7th and 8th at 6 pm. Classes are open to boys and girls ages 2.5 to 18.

Classes will be taught by Amy Siegel Loxley of Bridgewater, formerly of Warren, World Champion Irish Dancer and former cast member of "Riverdance the Show" and "Riverdance on Broadway," and her team of licensed Irish dance teachers. Ms. Siegel Loxley, one the few American women to have won the World Championships of Irish Dance, has performed in countless cities across the United States and Canada. She studied Irish dance under the tutelage of Peter Smith for 18 years before passing her Irish Dance Teacher's and Adjudicator's Exams in 2001 and 2009 respectively.

Heritage Irish Dance Company dancers have performed at Radio City Music Hall, Carnegie Hall, The New Jersey Performing Arts Center in Newark, Rutgers Athletic Center, The Prudential Center, Madison Square Garden and at countless local venues.

After winning the All-Ireland and North American Championships, Heritage Irish Dance Company alumna and assistant teacher, Sarah Oldam, is currently touring with "Riverdance." Each year Heritage Irish Dance Company sends between 15 and 20 dancers to Ireland or Scotland to compete in the World Championships of Irish Dance.

Irish dance is a cultural art form made popular by such long-running shows as "Riverdance" and "Lord of the Dance." As well as being enjoyable, Irish dancing is a way for young people to make friends, keep fit and learn about Irish culture. "Organized physical activity has been shown to be an important part of every child's social, intellectual and physical development," said instructor Loxley. "Boys and girls who take

Irish dance learn valuable skills such as team work, goal setting and discipline that will follow them well into adulthood. It has been a lifelong dream of mine to open an Irish dance studio and I look forward to many years of teaching future generations of 'Riverdancers!'"

INDIRA SERVAIA "REVERIE OF COLOR" AT THE WATCHUNG ARTS CENTER

story-telling colors. Servaia's work will be on display in the Lower Gallery of the Watchung Arts Center, from September 5 through September 30, in an exhibit entitled "Reverie of Color". An opening reception will be held on Sunday, September 10 from 1 to 4 p.m. The exhibit and reception are free and open to the public.

Primarily a self-taught, inner-directed artist, Indira Servaia has applied her studies of arts in India and in the USA with diverse styles and technique. Her endearing style is most strongly inspired from experiences throughout her Indian culture and by her appreciation for the captivating vibrancy of colors. (Inspired by French Fauvist artists). To explain the striking style of Indira's colors, one could look to the multiple cultures from which Indira draws.

For example, in her women's series these influences are sufficient to explain why her portraits make you feel as if you really you know the women's depth of personality and being. Her goal is for people to sense the story within her portrait at a glance.

"When I view a person or object as a potential subject for a portrait, I sense the deep life impressions of that subject and I see them as swirl of colors that tell the story of that subject. I know when there is a story that others would like to know. My hope is for people to take just a glance and to sense the story within the portrait. My intent is for the colors in my paintings to awaken the viewer's sensitivity to those same pulses and rhythm that I sensed. That is how the viewer will come to know the story revealed by the portrait."

Indira's bird series depicts every person's fight to freedom: freedom for mind and spirits;

Indira Servaia introduces you to a world of freedom to pursue the longing of the heart; the boundless and fearless freedom that helps an individual achieve clarity of mind as well as purity of heart. The freedom propels the individual towards spiritual enlightenment, the ultimate goal of every human being.

Her landscapes and still life contain vivid and vibrant colors. She uses her love for beautiful colors to help communicate same pulse and rhythm to the viewers that she sensed herself.

"I hope people see a part of myself in my paintings which is love for beautiful colors of nature. I want them to get pleasure, happiness and let the paintings speak for themselves telling its own story with a life of its own."

She has exhibited in galleries in India as well as in New Jersey, Philadelphia and at different shorelines.






BIG BUILDERS AT WATCHUNG LIBRARY

ROBOTS AT THE WATCHUNG LIBRARY




