"JOURNEY THROUGH THE PAST" WITH GREEN BROOK HISTORICAL SOCIETY

Well, it's October and the leaves are turning lovely colors, and we are preparing again for Somerset County's 12th annual Journey Through the Past event.

For this year's there will be 29 historic sites open on the weekend of October 14 and 15. Many are open only periodically throughout the year. All are free of charge. This is an excellent opportunity for a family to learn a little about our county and the history that made us what we are today.

The weekend hours for the 14th and 15th event are from 10 a.m. until 5 p.m. on Saturday and 12 p.m. until 4 p.m. on Sunday. Site maps and booklets can be picked up at whatever site you choose to visit first. We suggest that once you have the booklet you pick out three or four to visit each day. That and using the driving map will give you an efficient and full experience.

In Green Brook we will present Washington Rock. Members will explain how important this lookout was in June and July of 1777 by allowing General George Washington to watch the movement of the British troops from Amboy and New Brunswick. And the feint the British attempted to capture our Capitol of Philadelphia. Luckily General George did not come down from the mountain to take the bait. On a clear day one can see the skyscrapers of Manhattan 26 miles distant and the Atlantic Highlands 31 miles away where, with telescopes, the tops of the British high-masted sailing ships could been Preservation Committee and The Green Brook Historical seen in Sandy Hook Harbor.

We are also highlighting the Dr. John Vermeule House on Rock Avenue. Since the house is still undergoing renovation, interior access will be limited. However, we shall tell you about the Doctor in the early 1800's and the history of the house and those that have occupied it. There will be artifacts from the various time periods on display.

The weekend of October 14 and 15 is also a chance to visit our neighbors, including The Texier House Museum, which is located on the Watchung Circle. Here you can learn about the glove magnate who resided there as well as the general history of the Watchung area. In Warren, at the Codington Farmstead you can learn the story of a brother and sister and see wonderful antiques dating back over the last century. Also located in Warren are the Kirch-Ford-Terrill House and the nearby Mt. Bethel Meeting House.

Come and enjoy learning more about the area's history. More information about this event, including a list of all 29



participating historic sites throughout Somerset County, a guide book, and map, can be found on the Somerset County website at www.co.somerset.nj.us.



Performing a self exam on your feet can alert you to any potential signs of skin cancer. Addressing foot melanoma early on may catch the situation in time to tackle and cure it. Detecting melanoma in its early stages is critical. The soles, around or under the toenails, and between the toes are the most common locations of foot melanoma even though they typically do not get much, if any, sun exposure. WHRHS TEACHERS WELCOMED BACK WITH CONVOCATION AND BBQ

Superintendent Elizabeth Jewett, Principal George Alexis and Director of Human Resources Beth Scheiderman welcomed teachers back on Tuesday, September 5, to the 2017-2018 School Year Opening Day at Watchung Hills Regional High School (WHRHS).

Following opening remarks at a Staff Convocation, the teachers were treated to a Luncheon BBQ in the south cafeteria, with burgers and hot dogs barbecued by members of the WHRHS Football Team and Touchdown Club. The teachers also attended two days of departmental meetings and breakout sessions on Sept. 5, and Wednesday, Sept. 6.

"It is truly a pleasure to be standing here in front of all of you this morning and it is my privilege to welcome you back for the 2017-2018 school year," Jewett said in addressing the school's teachers to start the speaking program at the Staff Convocation. "I truly enjoy getting to share with you all the progress we made over the summer as well as celebrate all of our district accomplishments and the role that you have played."

Highlights from the summer of preparation for this school year, Jewett said, included the kitchen expansion and modernization in the south cafeteria. This construction project was the last major project funded through the 2013 referendum. The voter-approved improvements have covered over the last several summers multiple other physical facility improvements to the WHRHS physical plant, ranging from refurbished parking lots to kitchen and bathroom upgrades and modernizations.

Other improvements this summer included the replacement of a large walk-in refrigerator in the north kitchen, replacement of the aging water boiler in the south building, replacement of ductwork in ceramics and photography rooms, remediation of sinks and fountains that had failed lead testing requirements with new fixtures and filters, and continued exterior work on the Mountain Avenue athletic field.

Jewett also listed the broad and numerous upgrades added over the summer in technology, including a website upgrade, a new 1:1 Chromebook Initiative which has provided more than 500 Chromebooks to the incoming Ninth Grade students, new teacher laptops, 11 new SMART Boards, server upgrades and more.

She also listed the numerous awards, championships, academic honors and community-based accolades earned last year by students, as well as distinctions, and ongoing academic and professional improvements pursued by faculty and staff over the summer and throughout the school year.

Among the academic achievements that stand out were the ongoing excellence by WHRHS students in Advanced Placement testing and National Merit achievement, Jewett said. The average AP Exam score last year for the 1,169 tests taken was 4.19 out of 5. Out of 68 recognized students in the class of 2018, 15 have been named National Merit Semifinalists, the most ever at Watchung Hills.

The district continues to implement the goals set out in the Board of Education adopted Strategic Plan 2015-2020. Jewett said she is excited to start the 2017-2018 school year. She also announced that WHRHS has been awarded a Bronze Certificate and an accompanying \$2,000 grant by the Sustainable Jersey for Schools program., which has been used to purchase new color-coded recycling bins.

"I look forward to an amazing year with all of you," Jewett told the staff. "Watchung Hills is truly a world-class learning community."

Human Resources Director Scheiderman introduced new staff at the opening convocation. They are: In the English Department, teachers Michelle Germinario, Sarah Sheridan, Michael Stultz, and Alicia Michalitsianos; in Math, Matthew Crawford; in Special Services, Danielle Esteves, Cynthia Sacco, and Douglas Graiver; in Guidance, Lauren Sagat and Patti Lampa; in Buildings and Grounds, Jennifer Zervopolous; in Transportation, Jannette Vega; and three student interns, Caelynn Robinson in Social Studies, Simone Waters in social work, and DeAnna LaSasso with the school psychology staff. Also welcomed back after leaves of absence are:

Nancy Suppin, Kyla Garcia, and Heather Guirguis.

Numerous volunteers, staff, parents and students pitched in to help make the luncheon BBQ a festive return to the school year.
