

#### **SUMMIT PUBLIC ART INSTALLS NEW ARTWORKS DOWNTOWN**

Summit Public Art is pleased to announce the installation of two new artworks, one on the Village Green and the other in the Lyric Park on Bank Street.

On the Village Green is a pair of figures sculpted in bronze, "Hector's Return" and "Andromache," based on the Greek myths. These sinuous, life-like pieces are exaggerated to reveal an emotional situation, something that the sculptor, Emil Alzamora, strives for in his work, which focuses on the human form. The large sculptures were installed with the help of City of Summit workers, and we thank them for their assistance.

Alzamora, a Peruvian native, was raised and studied in Florida and began his sculpting career in the Hudson Valley working with Polich Art Works. He now works independently and shows regularly throughout the United States and Europe. He lives in Beacon, NY.

The wall sculpture on the trellis in Lyric Park is by Paul Santoleri, who refers to the art as a mixed-media wall-piece because it is three-dimensional. Entitled "Crystal Starfish Bloom," the art was commissioned by Summit Public Art for

this space. The sculpture consists of aluminite panels, concrete over a steel frame, with hand-blown glass, glass crystals, acrylic and epoxy. It will be displayed for nine months at this site.

Santoleri is an internationally renowned artist with works throughout the United States, Europe, South America, and Africa. Several of his wall murals are on view in Philadelphia where he has received numerous commissions from the city's Mural Arts Program.

Other new installations are in the pipeline and will be hung soon. All these pieces are temporary and will be on display for 6 months to a year.

Summit Public Art receives no city funding; all money is raised through grants and private and corporate donations.

## SCHOOL SUPPLIES DISTRIBUTED TO SUMMIT CHILDREN IN NEED

The Christ Child Society of Summit and Bridges Outreach, Inc. recently partnered together to help provide school supplies to local children for an eighth year. Their collaboration helped to provide Summit students who are eligible for free and reduced price lunches with new school supplies before the start of the school year. This year 335 students each received approximately \$81 worth of school supplies and a new backpack. The school supplies distributed were based on the schools' requested lists of supplies by grade. Parents were able to direct funds that otherwise would have been used for school supplies toward necessities such as food and rent.

"The children are so excited about selecting their new school supplies, and the parents are grateful," commented Sally Golding of The Christ Child Society and co-chair of the event.

"It's gratifying to help children in our own community," said Jane Murphy, of The Christ Child Society and event co-chair.

#### CITY PROCLAIMS SEPTEMBER AS SUMMIT FIRST AID SQUAD MONTH

During the September 19th Common Council meeting, Summit Mayor Nora Radest presented a proclamation naming September as First Aid Squad month while acknowledging the squad and its all-volunteer membership for more than 55 years of dedicated service to the Summit community.

"The Summit Volunteer First Aid Squad provides an essential service and is truly dedicated to protecting and serving the citizens of Summit," said Mayor Radest. "Whether it is for a simple injured ankle or a serious cardiac arrest, these highly-trained and committed volunteers are always prepared to help and ready when needed. I am honored to recognize the squad this evening and proclaim September as

First Aid Squad month. Thank you for the important role you play in our community."

Founded in 1962, the Summit Volunteer First Aid Squad serves as the City's primary Emergency Medical Services (EMS) agency, answering 9-1-1 medical calls 24 hours a day as well as providing stand-by coverage at community events, non-emergency medical transport for Summit residents, community safety and health training and frequent mutual aid assistance to surrounding towns. Staffed entirely by volunteers and funded solely through private contributions, the Squad operates 3 fully equipped ambulances, a first response truck, a special operations trailer and one of New Jersey first EMS bike teams.

Neither their patients nor the taxpayer have ever received a bill for the squad's services. Most of the squad's funding is raised during the annual fund drive appeal which was recently mailed to each residence and business in Summit..

The all-volunteer First Aid Squad has 65 adult members, 20 junior members and is always looking for new members to join its ranks. All needed training, uniforms and equipment is provided. 


