On Saturday, September 9th, Imagine held its sixth youth facilitator training. 18 amazing young people, ages 14 to 18, attended the full day training which sensitizes teen participants to the issue of childhood grief and prepares the youth to assist with the facilitation of peer-support groups for children who are coping with the death of a parent or a sibling. Through the development of listening and facilitating skills, these teens are now prepared to be loving listeners, group facilitators and advocates for grieving children in their community.

"We are so grateful for the participation of these youth. The teens bring wisdom, youthful energy and a wonderful presence and skill set to our volunteer program and grief support groups, facilitating groups right along with the adult volunteer facilitators," said Connie Palmer, Imagine Clinical

Training Director. "We've been working with teen facilitators since 2012 and they have added a profound and powerful aspect to our programs."

Imagine provides free year-round peer support groups for children age 3-18 who have had a parent or sibling die, with concurrent groups for parents and guardians. Free support groups are also available for young adults 18 and up who have had a friend, sibling or parent die. Imagine also provides in-home support and support groups for children and teens who have a family member living with a life-altering physical illness. 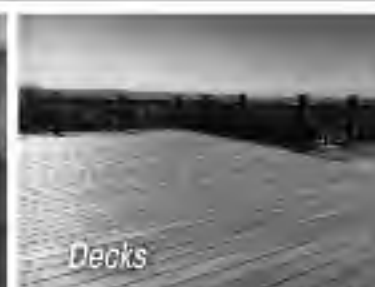

ESTABLISHING, REVISING AND ENFORCING TIME-SHARING WITH CHILDREN

In all cases of divorce or separation where children are involved, the issue of time-sharing (previously referred to as "visitation") is a significant issue to be addressed. Unless the parents have agreed to an equal shared custodial arrangement, an appropriate schedule of time-sharing is particularly important for all those involved: the custodial parent, the non-custodial parent, and the children.

Determining a schedule of time-sharing with the children is sometimes resolved between the parties. However, in those cases where the parties are unable to do so, the Court will order mediation in an attempt to resolve the issue. If the mediation is unsuccessful, the Court will (and has the authority to) determine the time-sharing schedule which will be binding on all involved.

Traditionally, time-sharing consisted of alternate weekend overnights for the non-custodial parent, a division of legal and religious holidays, extended time during the summer, and perhaps one evening per week for dinner. Recently, time-sharing schedules have become more flexible with non-custodial parents demanding (and receiving) more time with their children. Busy work schedules for the parents and academic and activity schedules for the children demand a more fine-tuned approach to time-sharing.

When discussing this issue it is important for all involved to have an understanding of how it will work in real life. Individuals who use terms that state "time-sharing shall be reasonable and liberal" or "as the parties may agree" find that disputes almost always arise in the future. Specificity as to which days and nights the children will be with which parent, times for pick-up and drop-off, birthdays and holidays all need to be included in the schedule together with an acknowledgment that flexibility in scheduling is in everyone's best interest.

Over the course of time as children become older or as parents

relocate, there may need to be changes to the existing time-sharing schedule. When the parties mutually agree to modify the existing time-sharing schedule, the revised schedule should always be in writing preferably in the form of a Court Order to ensure there are no misunderstandings in the future. If the parties cannot agree to modify the existing time-sharing schedule, the matter is best handled by a Court-approved mediator before resorting to filing papers with the Court.

Family lawyers also confront the situation where there has been a refusal to comply with the existing time-sharing schedule or direct interference with the custodial rights of a parent. Interference can be anything that frustrates the parent's right to spend meaningful time with their children. New Jersey law provides remedies in the event the Court finds that there has been a frustration of, or interference with, the time-sharing schedule. The Court has a great deal of latitude to correct such a situation including, but not limited to: (a) ordering "make-up" parenting time; (b) requiring the parent who has interfered to pay any costs which may have resulted from the interference; (c) modifying the time-sharing schedule temporarily or permanently; (d) changing which parent shall be responsible for transporting the children for the scheduled time-sharing; or (e) requiring the parent who frustrates the time-sharing schedule to perform community service. Judges are firm believers in compelling enforcement of Orders regarding the relationship between parent and child.

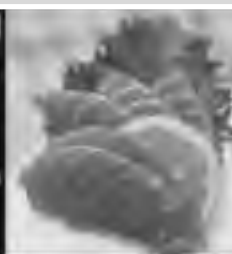

95.5% OF WESTFIELD HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATES CONTINUING EDUCATION

A total of 95.5 percent of the Westfield High School (WHS) graduates of 2017 are pursuing a higher education this fall. According to a report released by the WHS Office of Counseling Services, 401 students are continuing their education with 91% attending four-year colleges and universities, 3.8 % attending two-year colleges, and .7% entering vocational, business and other post high school institutions. The remaining graduates have entered the work force, are taking a year off, or had future plans that were undecided.

The class of 2017 – having earned a 99.3% graduation rate -- is attending a significant list of 148 colleges and universities in 33 states as well as one in France.

The most popular out-of-state colleges and universities selected by this year's graduates include: Virginia Tech (12 students); Indiana University (12); New York University (11); University of Pittsburgh (10); Penn State University (9); Northeastern University (9); and University of Delaware (9) . Ten graduates are attending five Ivy League schools: Brown, Columbia, Cornell, University of Pennsylvania and Princeton.

A total of 61 WHS graduates are continuing their education in New Jersey, with 47 attending four-year colleges and universities and 14 entering two-year colleges.

The most widely attended 4-year New Jersey school is Rutgers University with 15 WHS

graduates, followed by Seton Hall, Rowan and Kean, where 6 grads are enrolled in each. Looking at two-year secondary institutions, Union County College welcomed 12 WHS graduates this fall.

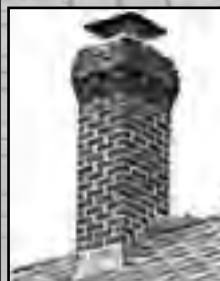

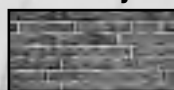

102ND SEASON OF MUSICAL CLUB BEGINS OCT 11

Both pieces were edited by Ferruccio Busoni who dedicated thirty years of his career to transcribing the organ, harpsichord, clavichord, violin and other works of Bach for the modern piano. Yehudi Menuhin called the Chaconne "the greatest structure for solo violin

that exists" and we shall hear through the piano mastery of Busoni and Helen Ryba. The Choral Prelude in f minor is an organ piece that Busoni transcribed.

The afternoon concert will close with Four Dances by Astor Piazzolla performed by flutist Jenny Cline and guest artist Fumi Kuwajima at the piano. Best known for his role in elevating the music of Argentina's national dance, the tango, from the dance hall to the concert stage, Piazzolla studied composition in Paris with Nadia Boulanger, who encouraged him to return to his roots and write music that came from his native country's traditions. The pieces that Ms. Cline and Ms. Kuwajima will perform include two tangos, a milonga, and a waltz.

The audience is invited to a reception following each concert to enjoy light refreshments and to meet the artists.

UNION COUNTY DAY OF PRAYER SCHEDULED FOR OCTOBER 24

In the challenging time of racial and religious intolerance as displayed in Charlottesville, fevered anti-immigrant xenophobia and political discord of historic extremes there comes the balance of a nation pulling together to support the victims of Hurricane Harvey.

With this backdrop the Fourth Annual Union County "Day of Prayer and Reflection: Unifying Our Community through Prayer" will be held Tuesday, October 24, 7:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. at the Parish Community of St. Helen at 1600 Rahway Avenue in Westfield.

The annual Day of Prayer is an interfaith gathering of the faith-based, nonprofit and government communities to unite people from throughout the county regardless of religion, race or disability, according to Deacon Tim Williams of the First Baptist Church in Kenilworth and chairman of the steering committee of the Union County Interfaith Coordinating Council, which sponsors the event each year.

The 2017 Day of Prayer will feature prayers, songs and meditations of Christian, Jewish, Muslim, Buddhist, Hindu and Sikh religious leaders from throughout Union County and neighboring counties. The opening prayer will be given by the Most Rev. Manuel A. Cruz of the Archdiocese of Newark, regional bishop of Union County, vicar for the Archdiocese's

Hispanic Apostolate and rector of the Cathedral Basilica of the Sacred Heart.

"The Union County Day of Prayer has brought together all faiths to focus on the common needs and concerns for all of the people of Union County and our nation," Williams said. "Coming together to pray has shown us the commonalities of our faiths and helped us to strengthen our relationships with our brothers and sisters of all faiths."

The Union County Interfaith Coordinating Council is an organization comprising interfaith congregations and community-based nonprofits, including Community Access Unlimited (CAU). The council promotes inclusion of all people within the community and creates a clearing house of faith-based, nonprofit and government community services available to the public while bringing greater awareness of these services to the greater community, according to Sid Blanchard, executive director of CAU.

CAU is a statewide Elizabeth-based nonprofit providing support programs and services to adults with disabilities as well as youth served under the Department of Children and Families (DCF) to enable them to live independently in the community, providing supports in areas including housing, vocational skills and life-skills training, education, advocacy and recreation.

JAZZY 1920'S WHODUNNIT THE WILD PARTY OPENS 99TH SEASON AT CDC THEATRE

In Andrew Lippa's *The Wild Party*, decadence and excess roar across the stage in this steamy prohibition tale based on Joseph Moncure March's 1928 narrative poem of the same name. This darkly brilliant show, featuring one of the most exciting, pulse-racing scores ever written, will open the 2017-2018 season at CDC Theatre in Cranford, NJ. This marks the 99th season at New Jersey's oldest continuously producing community theatre.

"The musical is like a Jazz Age take on Shakespeare's *A Midsummer Night's Dream*; a potent cocktail of an all-night party in late 1920s Manhattan," says director Sean Lough. Adapted from a book-length poem written in and about the Roaring Twenties, *The Wild Party* tells the story of one wild evening in the Manhattan apartment shared by Queenie and Burrs, a vaudeville dancer and a vaudeville clown. a party to end all parties. As the guests arrive, we meet an assortment of people living on the edge. Queenie and Burrs set out to make each other jealous, but Queenie begins to fall in love with her conquest named Mr. Black. After a long night of decadence, Burrs' jealousy erupts and he comes to a violent end at Mr. Black's hand. In the stark light of a new day, Queenie moves out into a brighter world, although not necessarily a brighter future, leaving the passed-out revelers in her wake. An award-winning score by Andrew Lippa provides excitement and drive for this tale of passions out of control. Capturing the sound of a bygone era with a nod to the present one, he makes us realize that moral decadence is not only limited to our past.

Held at Shackamaxon Country Club in Scotch Plains, Bagger will receive the Dream-Keeper Award for Outstanding Volunteerism and Robinson, a long-time board member until a recent out-of-state move, will receive the Honorable Jo-Anne B. Spatola Dream-Maker Award.

Bagger, an adoptive and biological mother, and wife to former state Sen. Richard Bagger, formerly practiced law. Her four CASA youth have histories of substance abuse, homelessness, medical and educational needs, sexual and physical abuse, and neglect. After 14 court appearances, the judge has accepted 56 of Bagger's 71 recommendations. Prior to Robinson's decade of board work focused on

fundraising, assisting at events and guiding the nonprofit's growth, she trained as an advocate in Morris County and advocated for a teen with Tourette's Syndrome and ADHD, and a pair of siblings whose parents were jailed for abuse. Marité's language prowess as an interpreter and language teacher were critical when the youth were placed in a Spanish-speaking home.

CASA of Union County recruits, trains, supervises and supports community volunteers to be the voice for children removed from home and placed into foster care due to abuse, neglect or abandonment. Trained volunteers are sworn in as advocates by a Union County family judge and empowered by court order to contact foster parents, teachers, doctors and therapists involved with the child. Advocates spend time with their youth regularly and report findings to the judge to ensure needs are met and best interests remain a priority.
