THE CRANFORD VFW COLOR GUARD MARCHES ON

Cranford's VFW Post #335 has been a veteran's mainstay in Cranford for over 97 years. During a good many of those long ago years it boasted of an award winning Color Guard, with dedicated men, wearing snappy uniforms, shouldering polished rifles doing parades and patriotic presentations all about our state. Over time however, with dwindling World War II membership, the Color Guard became only a hint of what it once was. It sank to being unseasoned unit performing only once a year on Memorial Day using members who had little or no color guard experience. But, they have turned that page and the good ol' days are marching back again at the Post.

Armed with newly discharged Afghanistan/Iraq vets and boosted by some older Viet Nam standbys, the Post #335 Color Guard has once again emerged as one of the premier groups of that type in the Central Jersey region.

It started with a mutual desire to be more than a once a year phenomena. The group began earnestly practicing each Saturday in the hall upstairs in the post home and on the parking lot outside. Instructed by Color Guard Captain Brauleo Lorenzo who himself was in the Marine Corp Color Guard, the training was arduous and testing. "We decided we were not just going to be a so so group of vets carrying old rifles and flags

looking blah. We wanted to be sharp, and make our Post proud" said Roselle Park resident Lorenzo. "It was something we really wanted to work for", he added.

And so they did. Each Saturday morning over the past year they have marched and drilled trying to bring discipline and muscle memory to the fore. "It was really tough at first", said Viet Nam Vet Lee Blowe of Cranford. "It's been a long time since I've shouldered a rifle like that and performed all the commands, but it slowly comes back and so do the aches and pains" he smiles.

With help from the membership of the Post and some personal contributions, they have managed to purchase some much needed uniforms, giving them a "professional look" they felt they needed. "Without proper uniforms and equipment" Lorenzo explained, "people just don't notice you the same way.

You have to look the part as well."

As word has gotten out about the Cranford VFW Color Guard, more and more requests have come in for their presence. They have recently done parades not only in Cranford, but in South Plainfield (Labor Day Parade) and Plainfield (4th of July Parade). They presented the flags at a Veterans Ceremony for the New York Jets Football Team at their training facility in Florham Park and did a presentation at a World War II Navy Veterans reunion in Elizabeth.

They have become a fixture at the home opener of the Cranford High School Football Team, which is a favorite of the guard's members. "Marching out onto the field with the colors flying and your home town fans clapping just makes all the work worthwhile", stated Afghanistan veteran John Grainger of Cranford.

The group still practices every Saturday morning, honing their skills and keeping sharp. "We find that the comradery among the members is a big driving force for them" said Post Commander Jay Boxwell. "They criticize and praise each other all during the practices and when things go right, they celebrate as a team. It's a great group of guys."

CASA of Union County is so lucky to have the support of such passionate and generous local businesses like TimberRidge Construction. I'm wishing my own children were still the age to enjoy a custom playhouse like this, and secretly wondering if

instead it can be my own backyard retreat? Kidding, of course. But, maybe I can have a playdate at the winner's house?"

For the Carbones, the project was a no-brainer. "When Marla first reached out," Lisa said, "it was never a question of should we do this. The dialogue centered around, 'How do we make this the best playhouse?' Both Anthony and I have been familiar with the great work of CASA of Union County since we moved to Cranford in 2007. Any organization centered around a child's best interest will always pull at our heartstrings! 
This family friendly show will be directed by


> Ebenezer Scrooge is a prosperous curmudgeon who believes that personal wealth is far more valuable than the happiness and comfort of

MEET CAPTAIN ARCHIBALD B. CAMERON, U.S. ARMY WORLD WAR 2 HOMETOWN HERO, ONE OF OUR CRANFORD 86

As my thoughts turn to the next Cranford hometown hero to spotlight, I go back to last month's Cranford 86 honoree and his siblings who told the story of Nick Vassallo. I was saddened to receive a call this past weekend informing us that Dan Vassallo, 100-year-old World War 2 Army veteran and brother of Nick, had passed away after surgery. Meeting Dan, his Marine brother John and their extended families last month while researching Nick's story had me thinking. The wonderful lives they all were charmed to live here in Cranford, surrounded by loving children, grandchildren and greatgrandchildren, were experiences that all of our Cranford 86 and the thousands of American soldiers who paid the ultimate price for freedom did not get a chance to enjoy. Thoughts like these give me the drive to complete all 86 stories of these brave young Cranford men.

After sorting through our Cranford Historical Society archives, what caught my eye this month were the incredible accounts of Captain Archibald B. Cameron, one of the most decorated members of our Cranford 86.

A Cranford resident since birth, Arch, as known to his friends, lived at 33 Retford Ave. He graduated Lincoln School's kindergarten in 1923 and progressed into Cranford High School at Cleveland School, now Cleveland Plaza, where he was an outstanding athlete in football and track. He graduated in the class of 1935 and was accepted into the R.O.T.C program at Virginia Polytechnic Institute of Blacksburg Va., now known as Virginia Tech. While there, he was named an All American football player. Upon graduation in 1939, he was commissioned a lieutenant in the U.S. Army and reported for duty to the 18th U.S. Infantry Regiment of the 1st Infantry Division, nicknamed "the Big Red One" because of the single red "1" on its shoulder patch.

Arch shipped out to Scotland and then England to prepare for the invasion of North Africa under General George S. Patton, which was made on November 8th, 1942. From there, he saw much combat action, including at St. Cloud, Longstop Hill, Goublant, El Guettar and Mateur. For his acts during the battle of Longstop Hill in Tunisia on Christmas Eve 1942, he was awarded the Silver Star for gallantry in action and promoted to captain two days later. He also received the Purple Heart for shrapnel wounds from Longstop







Hill.

As the path to Berlin was set by General Dwight D. Eisenhower, Arch continued his war journey. Italy was targeted as the next battlefield for the Allied troops. He took part in the amphibious landings on Sicily with his regiment on July 10, 1943, and engaged in many more battles, notably Gela, Caltanissetta, Troina and Mistretta. Sailing from Sicily on October 18, 1943, Arch was ordered to return to England with his men as preparations were underway for the impending D-Day invasion in Normandy.

On June 6th 1944, in the largest amphibious attack in the history of the world, Arch, along with 156,000 soldiers, 5120 aircraft and 6900 ships, stormed Fortress Europe on the shores of Normandy. His unit entered on the beaches of Colleville-sur-Mer, code-named "Omaha." With the grace of God he survived the battle. Sadly, over 12,000 Allied troops did not. Of the five beaches attacked, Omaha was the bloodiest, accounting for more than half the casualties. Many brave men remain in vast military graveyards just a few yards from the cliffs overlooking the beaches.

With the success of the Normandy landings and the apparent turning point of the war at hand, the road to Berlin continued as the Allies chased the German army across France. Many tough fights still lie ahead. Our Cranford hometown hero would meet his end less than two months later, on July 26, 1944, as the Allied forces attempted a breakthrough to Paris in a 30-day battle outside the French town of St. Lo. During a fierce hedgerow battle, with many hand-to-hand encounters, Arch's battalion was surrounded by enemy forces. While attending to the wounds of

his commanding officer, Lt. Col. Joseph W. Sisson, Arch himself was hit with machine gun fire and died. A letter was uncovered written by his closest friend, Captain E.W. MacGregor of Brooklyn, NY, who fought beside Arch through much of the war. It best tells the story.

"The happy warrior has gone to Valhalla of all fighting men and I have lost the finest friend and buddy that any man could ask. Yes I regret to tell you that old Archibald B. Cameron has made his last charge and bade farewell to the stormy world in the same way that he lived.

"While he lived Arch was a most unusual man. He was beloved by all and never spoke an unkind word of anyone. He was a great fighter and didn't have a nerve in his body, but he wasn't a soldier in the typical sense of the word for he was always looking at the humorous side of life, playing pranks, raising hell mildly at times and being full of sentiment. Arch was honest and honorable as the day is long and led a clean life.

"It is tragic that we have lost him. He was killed instantly by a Jerry machine gun while trying to assist our Battalion Commander who had been wounded a few seconds before. Shells and casings were crashing and pinging all about me as I knelt in prayer beside his long frame, but I wasn't aware of them even if I heard them. I could hear his ringing voice in the distance saying 'Carry on, Mac' and suddenly realized, the battalion C.O. being wounded meant I was in charge. I said, 'so long Arch', and moved quickly off to continue the attack.

"Arch is gone, and I am quite heartbroken about it, but his influence will stay with me forever and whatever qualities I possess in laying claim to being a man will be due in large part to his underlying friendship and influence. When Arch passed, something went out of me and I'll be oh so happy when this whole rotten mess is over and we can return to a peaceful, quiet, normal life."

Capt. McGregor finished by saying "that of all the fights they had been in together, he had seen tougher. But this fight was from all directions, including the rear. We took more surrendering prisoners than they could handle and we had no sleep for days on end."

In a letter to his parents just days before his

death, Arch wrote, "We are taking many prisoners that tell us they believe that they have already lost the war, but they will fight to the very end."

The battle of St. Lo ended victoriously for the Allies, sadly, two days after Arch's death. For the wounds that ended his young life he received his second Purple Heart.

Our research of the events surrounding Arch's death revealed that his commanding officer, Colonel Sisson, for whom he gave his life, survived his wounds. Col. Sisson went on to serve 31 years in the Army, later fighting in Korea and Vietnam. Thus, Arch's heroism in 1944 touched even future wars. We were further surprised to learn that the officer saved by Arch on a distant French battlefield was the nephew of another longtime Cranford family. Colonel Sisson's uncle was Harry R. Sisson of 313 N. Union Ave.

The road to Berlin would continue without Arch, coming to a victorious end 10 months after his death, on May 7, 1945, with the unconditional German surrender signed in Reims, France.

Arch was buried at Arlington National Cemetery with full military honors. His father, a Spanish American War veteran, was laid beside him just three years later.

Captain Archibald B. Cameron was a great American and one of our Cranford 86. He was just 26 years old when he made the supreme sacrifice for his town and country.

If you personally know, or know someone else who knows the story of one of our hometown heroes, we ask you to come forward and help us fill the many blanks we have in our research.



CRANFORD PUBLIC SCHOOLS RECEIVES \$23,000 FROM CFEE

Nearly \$23,000 in grants from the Cranford Fund for Educational Excellence have been officially released and awarded directly to the Cranford public school teachers who applied for them earlier this year. The grants will bring new resources to students at all levels — from kindergarten through high school — and across subjects, from science and literacy to math and music

This is the third annual round of awards since the 2014 re-launch of the CFEE, a Cranfordbased nonprofit foundation that supports excellence and innovation in the Cranford public schools by generating additional resources through community involvement.

All grant funding comes from Cranford residents, businesses, and organizations. This year's grant awards were made possible by the CFEE's second annual Trivia Night fundraiser in February, which raised more than \$20,000, and by a Back to School appeal sent to parents in September.

The CFEE received 30 grant applications and made 12 grant awards, working with applicants and the school district to make sure funds would be spent in a strategic and effective manner that





was aligned with the district's mission. In addition, alternative solutions were found within the district and community that may accomplish the goals of several applicants who were not awarded funding.

The grants awarded funding are as follows:

The Creative Mindset Literary Project. Orange Avenue School. Applicant: Thais Jackson. Sixthgraders will develop and publish their literary works and present them at a book release event.

PebbleGo Database Subscription. Bloomingdale Avenue, Brookside Place, Hillside Avenue, and Walnut Avenue schools. Applicant: Arline McCloskey. This is the second CFEE grant providing access to this database, which uses videos, read-along audio, and other supports to help all the district's K-2 students build literacy skills and learn about social studies and science.

Intergenerational Book Study. Cranford High School. Applicant: Jennifer Hilborn. Students in grades 9 through 12 will meet with school staff and community members after school to discuss five texts having to do with privilege as a way to build empathy for challenges facing other people.

Ellison Starter Set. Cranford High School. Applicant: Lisa Williams. The multiple disabilities class will use this letter- and shape-cutting tool — which they can manipulate with little assistance — for making posters and other crafts for use around the high school, learning a skill in the process.

Middle School Band Instruments. Hillside Avenue School. Applicant: A.J. Falisi. Outdated band instruments, some of them more than 50 years old, will be replaced with new equipment to meet the needs of the growing music program and allow for more challenging lessons.

Robots. Orange Avenue School. Applicant: Shannon Pena. Older robot kits used by third-through seventh-graders will be replaced by newer, better models to support robotics education, which integrates math, programming, and engineering.

We Do Need STEAM! Livingston Avenue School. Applicant: Kimberly Scutieri Crowder. LEGO Education WeDo 2.0 sets will help students develop problem-solving and other skills by making challenging STEAM topics (science, technology, engineering, the arts, and math) more approachable.

3D Printer. Orange Avenue School. Applicants: Marc Edery, Shannon Pena. A 3D printer will be used to build STEAM and computer science/design skills schoolwide.

BOY SCOUTS COMPLETE 12-DAY NEW MEXICO TREK

This past July, eight Boy Scouts from Troop 75 along with four adult leaders went to the Philmont Scout Ranch located in the Sangre de Cristo mountains west of Cimarron, New Mexico. Philmont gives Troops the opportunity to send their scouts out on 12 day treks, hiking the backcountry and roughing it in the New Mexico dust and heat. Treks consist of hiking during the day between camp sites and participating in an array of activities at many of the campsite locations. Some locations even have a theme based on the site's history. There are 35 different treks that Philmont offers, which vary based on the mileage covered, the locations you stop at, and the level of difficulty (based on mileage and elevation changes). Our Crew 714-Q1 did an 84 mile trek which, including side hikes and other activities, we estimated yielded a total mileage closer to 120 miles.

The group of Scouts and adult advisors left early in the morning of July 12th to catch a flight to Denver, Colorado. Our crew was one of four from the Patriots Path Scout Council all on the same flight. Our travel to and from Philmont was arranged by Blue Sky Adventures (BSA), a travel agency which specializes in Scout related travel and has partnered with Patriots Path Council for the past 20 years to bring Scouts to Philmont. Once we arrived in Denver, the Blue Sky Adventures bus picked us up and took us to Colorado Springs. We would spend the next day and a half there, enjoying locations such as the Garden of the Gods and the Air Force Academy, taking a train up to Pike's Peak and getting to experience some whitewater rafting. This also allowed the crew to begin acclimating to the 5,000 ft. and above elevation. Two days later, we arrived at Philmont base camp to prepare for our 12 day hike. We were given our initial food allocation (we had three food distribution days during the trek) and crew equipment, dividing the gear amongst the group for the trek. The following day, we set out on the trail with a Philmont Ranger, our guide who would help the crew get settled into the daily routine for the first

two days. We didn't know it at the time, but our first day was the easiest when compared to the rest of the trek.

At our first campsite, the Crew learned about Native American Rock Writings and Archeology, with crew members excitedly getting into indepth conversations with the extremely engaged staff about the area.

After that the troop headed out to a new camp called Metcalf Station where we replaced old railroad ties and rode on a self-propelled rail car, and then headed back out on the trail to stay that night at the first of many trail camps, a campsite without any Philmont staff presence.

The days following included a lot of hiking and fun activities such as mountain biking, conservation work and blacksmithing, visiting an old mine and panning for gold. The Crew was able to earn the conservation oriented 50 Miler award which required the crew to work for a total of 10 hours on conservation projects (3 hours while at Philmont and 7 hours for the Cranford community). For our conservation project at Philmont, we cut down young Ponderosa pine trees, removing them as potential fuel sources, acting as a fire break in the event of a forest fire. After completing our conservation project, we spent the next few days getting closer to Baldy Mountain, the tallest mountain on Philmont property.

We hiked an overall elevation change of 10,000 feet to get to our layover campsite (two nights) in the shadow of Baldy. The following

morning we set out early to hike to the top of Baldy. Our perseverance was rewarded when the crew stood atop Baldy, at about 12,441 feet above sea level, and enjoyed the view of the surrounding country.

The hikes after descending from Baldy were progressively less strenuous, providing more of a chance to see the sights and enjoy the backcountry programs offered by Philmont. At the remaining staff camps, the crew climbed spar poles at Pueblano campsite like old time loggers and enjoyed a nice campfire show put on by the rangers stationed there. The next day, the crew hiked to their most engaging campsite at Ponil where we shot cowboy repeater rifles and revolvers, followed by a Chuckwagon dinner which was a good break from trail food. The last campsite we visited was Dean Cow where we could have done some rock climbing. Although this was dashed by inclement weather, we played a vigorous and fun game of volleyball with the camp staff. Finally, the crew hiked the last few miles to an historic ranch which had been recently donated to Philmont for a bus ride back to base camp. The trek finally complete, we enjoyed some delicious burgers at a local restaurant in Cimarron. The following day we returned to Cranford, content in knowing that even though we had to endure heat exhaustion, purifying our water, eating less than desirable meals, hike and climb dusty steep trails all day, in the end it would be an experience none of us Scouts and adult leaders would ever forget.

The dedication service was attended by



LIBRARY PRESENTS "WORLD WAR II TURNING POINTS" LECTURE




> Along with all the work she has done for the Crane's Ford DAR chapter, Barbara is an active member of the Cranford community serving on various committees or commissions.
