POLICE HOLD ANNUAL AWARDS CEREMONY

The Linden Police Department held it Awards Ceremony at the JTG Center on Monday, September 11th. The annual ceremony, traditionally held after the department picture and inspection, recognizes Officers for extraordinary actions taken beyond what is normally encountered.


This family friendly show will be directed by


Ebenezer Scrooge is a prosperous curmudgeon who believes that personal wealth is far more valuable than the happiness and

HIGH SCHOOL TO RETIRE NUMBER OF JETS STAR MUHAMMAD WILKERSON

The Linden High School football team will retire the number of New York Jets star Muhammad Wilkerson, who was a standout football player for the Tigers before graduating in 2007.

Wilkerson has enjoyed one of the best careers of any professional athlete ever to pass through Linden High School. He has been a leader on the Jets defensive line since 2011, was selected to the NFL Pro Bowl in 2015, and was second team All-Pro in 2013 and 2015. He was chosen team MVP in 2013, and has accumulated 41 sacks in his NFL career.

Wilkerson is known for his No. 96 for the Jets, but he wore No. 91 in high school. No. 91 will be retired at Homecoming on November 22 and will hang in a place of honor at Tiger Stadium at Edward R. Cooper Field. A resolution for the plan to retire his number was approved unanimously by the Board of Education. Homecoming is 7 p.m., Nov. 22, at Tiger Stadium at Cooper Field, against Linden's longtime Thanksgiving rival Union Farmers.

Athletic Director Steven Viana. "Muhammad's accomplishments on the field are well-documented, but his contributions to our community and our students are most gratifying. He is a mainstay at our events, an avid supporter of anything and everything Linden."

Wilkerson was selected as first team All-Area by the Home News Tribune and second-team All-Union County by The Star-Ledger in his senior season as a defensive tackle, and accumulated 16 sacks and nine blocked passes over his high school career.

"Mo was one of the most gifted athletes ever to put on a Linden uniform, in football and basketball," said former longtime Linden football coach James "Bucky" McDonald, who coached Wilkerson. "He had that rare size to go with being a great athlete. And every time I see Mo, he's still the same person. That's what's really great about him. He's given so much back to Linden."

Current Linden football coach Al Chiola is thrilled to be able to honor Wilkerson.

"This a great moment for Linden High School and the Linden community," he said.

"Muhammad has gone above and beyond for the city and children of Linden. Retiring his jersey is well-deserved and Linden football couldn't be more proud."

Wilkerson remains a committed member of the Linden Public Schools community. He founded TEAM 96 to offer assistance to college-bound athletes from Linden, and holds a free football camp each year in Linden, as well as bowling events to raise scholarship money for Linden athletes. Wilkerson has also auctioned memorabilia to raise money for Linden athletics, and has donated his own time and money to the Linden Public Schools.

"He hasn't forgotten where he's from," longtime Linden basketball coach Phil Colicchio said of Wilkerson, who was a key part of Linden's back-to-back Group 4 state basketball champions in 2005 and 2006. "A lot of guys can go on to make money and send money back to the community. But he's in the community every day. Still with the same friends he hung out with since they were little kids coming to our basketball games.

"He comes to about 80 percent of our games, no fanfare, he just shows up. It's not just the programs he runs in town for the kids, but the fact that he's physically here and he's visible to the community. That's pretty unique among today's athletes."

Wilkerson played college football at Temple University, where he was named first team All-Mid-American Conference and the team's defensive MVP as a junior. He was selected by the Jets in the first round of the NFL Draft in 2011.

Linden's eight elementary schools received character-education lessons from the schoolbased social worker along with various creative activities throughout the district.



It was during this period that he was granted the title of Il Cavaliere of the Order of Saint George.

In 1990, he opened III Amici Ristorante in Linden, and once again, culinary enthusiasts found his specialties to be extraordinary and the restaurant was greeted with rave reviews. His menu features an extensive array of northern and southern Italian specialties, set within a classic Italian décor, including a Roman lounge. Mr. Lavorato is assisted by his son Dante, who is the

YMCA PROGRAMS COMBAT CHILDHOOD OBESITY

The Y wants families to understand how adopting healthy habits can help reduce childhood obesity. Many families need support changing their family's habits with the ultimate goal of being a healthy weight. That's why The Gateway Family YMCA wants families to improve eating habits and increase physical activity.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), obesity affects one in six children in the U.S. and one in three are overweight, which poses greater risks for many health problems such as type 2 diabetes, high blood pressure, high cholesterol and some cancers. Here in New Jersey nearly 1 in 4 children are overweight or obese according to the Data Resource Center for Child & Adolescent Health.

"Successfully lowering obesity rates in children requires the whole family to change their eating and physical activity habits," said Krystal R. Canady, CEO of The Gateway Family YMCA. "In our preschool and afterschool programs our Healthy U program is included in the curriculum."

"The goal of Healthy U is to promote the healthy behavior changes that will help prevent childhood obesity through a three-pronged approach of nutrition education, increased physical activity, and family involvement," stated Melynda A. Mileski, EVP/COO of The Gateway Family YMCA.

The following tips are some great ways to incorporate healthier eating habits and more physical activity and into your daily family routine:

Eat & Drink Healthy: Make water the drink of choice and encourage everyone to fill half their plates with fruits and vegetables by offering two or three colorful options at every meal. As a family choose a new fruit and veggie every week to taste together. Place a full pitcher of water on the table during meals, and allow children to pour their own water.

Play Every Day & Go Outside: Children should have at least an hour a day of unstructured play (outside when possible) and break a sweat at least three times a week by getting 20 minutes or more of vigorous physical activity. Join your children in games that get hearts pumping and bodies moving.

Get Together: Eat as a family as frequently as possible. Involve kids in meal planning, preparation and clean up. In addition, adults should take a break from electronics and spend one-to-one time each day with their kids, enjoying one another's company.

Reduce Recreational Screen Time: Time spent in front of a television, computer, tablet, cell phone or video games should be limited to two hours or less per day. Make a family plan to reduce screen time at home. For example, turn off screens during meals, go for a walk, set a timer to remind you to power down the screen.

Sleep Well: Kids and adults need to keep a regular sleep schedule; unwind together in the evenings by reading a book or listening to soft music to ensure the body is preparing for sleep. Kids are growing and need 10-12 hours of healthy sleep per night and adults need seven to eight hours.

The Healthy U program is the result of a collaborative partnership between The Horizon Foundation for New Jersey and the New Jersey YMCA State Alliance. Through preschool, after-school and school-based programs, Healthy U impacts more than 90,000 children, ages 3 to 13, at 480 YMCA and elementary school sites statewide. These YMCA afterschool and preschool programs and implementing partnering schools are environmental strategies and activities, and education to increase physical activity and promote good nutrition for students and their families. Since its inception in 2007, The Horizon Foundation for New Jersey has awarded three grants totaling \$4.62 million through 2019.



FIRE CHIEF SPEAKS TO STUDENTS DURING 9/11 REMEMBRANCE

Linden Fire Chief Joseph Dooley spoke we weren't alone. during a unique 9/11 remembrance service held at Linden High School that brought together students from both New Jersev and Texas.

The commemoration included a video conference with high school students in Allen, TX, a school which reached out to Linden in the spirit of unity and compassion shortly after the 9/11 terrorist attacks. The two schools have maintained a close relationship ever since through their "Tale of Two Cities" program.

"As a New Jersey fireman, the idea that people in Texas cared about us opened my eyes," Dooley said to the students in Allen via video conference from Linden High School's Academy of Science and Technology. "The fact that your schoolmates, your alumni, cared enough to come up here to find out about us, what was happening, it meant a lot. It meant

"Now 16 years later, you can see the same thing happening for your state. As you deal with Hurricane Harvey, as Florida deals with Hurricane Irma, there are police, fire and EMS workers from New York and New Jersey in Texas, in Florida, because we've never forgotten. People took care of us during that time, and that's something we will always remember."


The program also featured current and former students who were part of the "Tale of Two Cities" program, which over the years has brought students and faculty from the two schools together in both Texas and New Jersey.

Board of Education member Theresa Villani also spoke at Monday's remembrance about her personal experience working in the World Trade Center and losing co-workers on 9/11. "I think something like this really helps keep the

memory alive of the people we lost," she told students during the video conference.

Joseph Cataline, an administrator who helped found the program in October 2001, said it has been his passion. "I've been in education for 45 years, and this program has been the highlight of my career," he said. "Over the years, I have gained so many personal friends in Allen, Texas, I feel often that they are part of my family."

Linden High School Principal Yelena Horre said the students in the program were able to take the tragedy of 9/11 and make "something really beautiful." "Sitting with me today, and there in Allen, are students that don't remember 9/11. But you keep it going, because you understand the importance of that. Allen and Linden, we're a family," Horre said. "We will continue to keep the charge, and make sure that we never forget the heroes of 9/11."

STUDENT-RUN TV STUDIO IS EYES, EARS AND VOICE OF LINDEN HS

Inside Linden High School's Academy of Science and Technology is the Linden Public Schools' media hub – a TV studio that produces a weekly news show and teaches students reallife technical skills for the 21st century media landscape.

And along the way, everyone tries to have a little fun.

Those are the keys for the Linden High School TV/digital media classes, which produce the weekly school news and various other video projects for school organizations.

The classes are taught by Chris Paskewich, but the work is done by the students, both on camera and behind the scenes.

"It's all hands-on," said Paskewich, who is in his fifth year teaching in Linden and heading the TV production program. "I'm not one to lecture, 'This is how you use a camera.' I let the kids actually pick up a camera and produce videos. That's the way I learned and I feel that's the best way to learn."

Among the highlights for the students is an annual trip to NBC headquarters in New York, where they tour various studios, check out the equipment, and create a "Tonight Show"-style talk show. Last year, as a bonus, they got to see the backing performers for Chance the Rapper rehearsing for "Saturday Night Live."

The TV/Digital Media program is holding a fundraiser this Wednesday, Oct. 25, at Blaze Pizza in Clark to help pay for the trip to NBC. For anyone who shows the group's flier, part of their bill will be donated to the TV/Digital Media program and DECA, the school's student business organization. A similar fundraiser will be held next Wednesday at Chipotle in Clark for the two student organizations.

The TV program is divided into two levels. TV 1 is the entry-level half-year class where students learn the basics of taking camera shots and editing video. TV 2/3 is for students in the 2nd and 3rd years of the program. They produce the weekly news show, and film the Board of

Inside Linden High School's Academy of Education meeting, concerts and other special tience and Technology is the Linden Public events.

"Students in the TV/Digital Media class are vital to the culture of LHS," said Principal Yelena Horre. "Our weekly student-produced show is viewed every Friday during homeroom and is highly anticipated by students and staff alike. Through the efforts of these talented students, events, activities and community service outreach are communicated and the voice of LHS is heard."

The news shows, available on Schooltube.com, aim to inform students, but in a fun way that keeps the creators and the viewers engaged. The students know not to go too far

"We try to keep it professional when we do the school news," said senior Kareem Issa. "We don't try to be a clown on it. Even though we try to make the school look fun, we don't want to give a bad impression because it's public. We don't want to make the school look bad."

Issa is a rarity in the program; it is his fourth year in the three-year program.

"Since I enjoyed this class so much, I talked to guidance and got to do a fourth year," said Issa, who now helps Mr. Paskewich in teaching the others students. "I help show the other kids how to film, how to edit, how the news show gets done, how our production gets done.

"I like showing people new things, and even though I'm teaching someone, I'm still learning."

The program, which has about 125 students through the year including 20 in the advanced class, instills a team atmosphere, with students pitching in wherever needed – hosting, editing, shooting video, working the teleprompter.

"The students are great," Paskewich said. "They're totally involved and it seems like they always have fun. It's just a great program, and I have fun being here and doing this.

"I think this is a very valuable program because this is a field for the future. And I'm using all equipment that's used in the field, from Final Cut Pro editing software to the cameras we use. So I give them real-life experience."

Ludmila Muntian, a junior in the advanced class, was attracted to the program because she likes watching Buzzfeed videos. But as she got involved, she learned more aspects of TV and video production.

"When I started, I would just sit there and let other people do things for me," she said. "But I learned from people, and the experience, and Mr. P taught me things. It's a team thing.

"I think a lot of people should take this class. It's a great experience and it's not super difficult as long as you pay attention and learn to use the tools."

Justin La Pierre is a senior who is just starting out in the intro class.

"Doing the news show was a good experience because it got me out of my comfort zone," he said. "All this is new to me. At first I didn't know how to feel, I was really nervous, because I've never been on camera with someone recording me. But it feels good now. I like it."

Some of the projects the class was working on this week include a promo for the school's homecoming dance featuring football players and cheerleaders, and a Halloween special modeled on the blockbuster movie "It." Last year's Halloween special featured one of the program's news anchors being kidnapped – a project some students listed as among their favorites.

The classes use gear that equals the equipment used by professions – preparing students for what comes after high school.

"I know kids who have taken this and done movies on their own or started little businesses on their own who went through Linden High School," Paskewich said. "And I always hear from them, saying 'I learned a lot from your program.'

"This is something that you can take here and use for the rest of your life."




