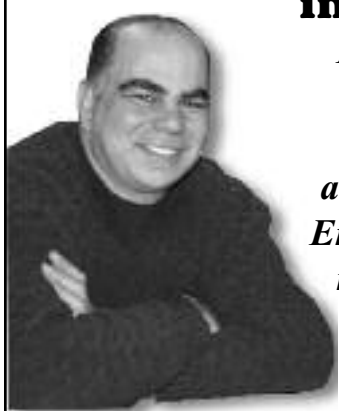

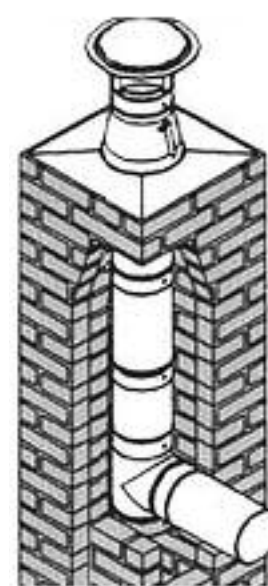

With the holiday shopping season upon us, it is important to be mindful of the many benefits of shopping local. Here are 5:

- 1) Shopping local dollars stay local-going local with your spending by supporting locally owned, independent businesses causes a "multiplier-effect" that keeps more money circulating in our community. The Andersonville Study of Retail Economics found that as much as 68 out of \$100 spent in local independent businesses stays local, compared to only 43 out of \$100 spent in chain stores. Local businesses are also more likely to source supplies and services from other local businesses.
- 2) Local businesses give back to the community- studies show that local businesses donate to community causes at more than twice the rate of chains. Here in our community, it is mostly the small, independent businesses that support and sponsor events and activities such as Little

League Teams, Millington Downtown Day, the Stirling Street Fair, and several small charity events held each year.

- 3) Local businesses provide jobs-the small businesses in our community employ thousands of people, most of whom are residents of our area.
- 4) Local businesses provide tax dollars-spending locally instead of online ensures that our sales tax dollars are utilized where they belong--in our community.
- 5) Local businesses provide character and economic diversity- unique, one-of-a-kind businesses are a distinctive part of our community and add history and charm to our township. And as an extra bonus, shopping locally is fun- seeing friends and neighbors while shopping in local businesses helps us stay connected to each other, and provides a far more personal shopping experience without the stress of the crowds and the long lines.

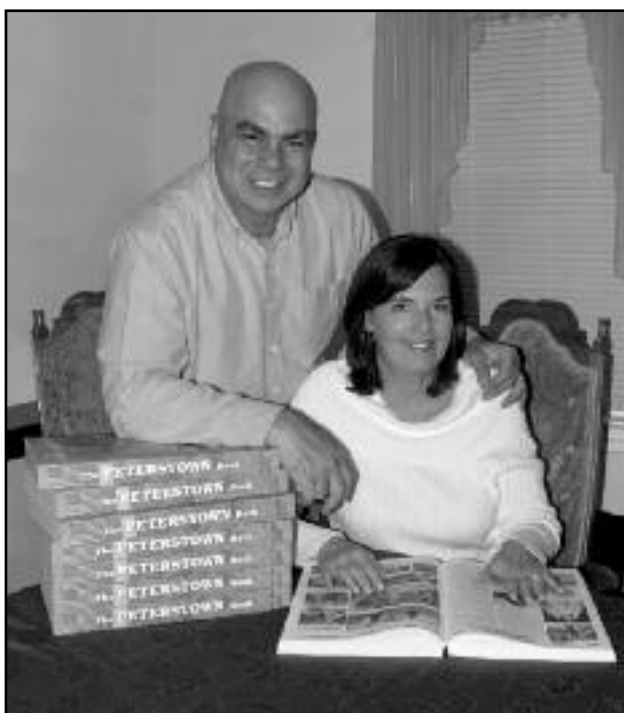
