MILITARY VETERAN FIREFIGHTERS RECOGNIZED

A recognition ceremony for Morris County firefighters who were military veterans or who are currently in the military was conducted by Morris County Clerk Ann F. Grossi, Esq at the Frelinghuysen Arboretum on October 17, 2017. The event started with a light dinner followed by welcome comments from Ms. Grossi and the Pledge of Allegiance by a former US Marine who was in the battle to take Iwo Jima during World War II.

Lt. Col. Jeffrey Ivey, the US Army Garrison Commander of Picatinny Arsenal, gave a keynote speech thanking the firefighters for their selfless dedication to their country and communities. Brief comments were made by Morris County Sheriff James Gannon and former Freeholder and Morris Township Firefighter John Murphy thanking the firefighters for their service and underscored the importance of volunteer

firefighters to their communities.

The presentation of certifications of recognition to each firefighter - veteran was made by Ms. Grossi. A brief military background on each was given by master of ceremonies Joe Garifo as he called each firefighter individually to the front of the room to receive their certificate.

Stirling Fire Co's three active veteran firefighters were former Deputy Fire Chief George Armenti, former Fire Chief Louis Aroneo, and Firefighter Frank Reilly. All three are US Army veterans. Aroneo was in artillery unit, Armenti in a tank battalion, and Reilly was in a combat ready infantry battalion.

Inactive Stirling Fire Co. members who were recognized were Angelo Cerulli, Nicholas Falzarano, Peter Falzarano, and David Tyrone. No other Long Hill Township firefighter veterans were named.



15 WHRHS STUDENTS NAMED 2018 NATIONAL MERIT SEMIFINALISTS

A record 15 Watchung Hills Regional High School (WHRHS) students in the Class of 2018 have been named Semifinalists in the 2018 National Merit Scholarship Program.

Another 53 WHRHS students have qualified for the honor "Commended," the category just before Semifinalists. These designations were made based on the scores of students who took the 2016 Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test (PSAT)/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (NMSQT).

The total of 68 recognized students – combining Semifinalists and Commended students - ranks WHRHS 9th among all high schools in New Jersey, as well as 6th among comprehensive public high schools in the state, and 1st among all high schools in Somerset County, according to Principal George Alexis.

"The National Merit results are impressive and provide further evidence that our sustained focus on inquiry and collaboration is advancing learning in our school," Alexis said. "We are proud of our students and grateful for our teachers' hard work and commitment. The quality of teaching and learning taking place each day is making a difference for our entire school community."

This year's 15 WHRHS National Merit Semifinalists means that as many as 42 WHRHS students have qualified as National Merit Semifinalists during the most recent four years, including 10 in the Class of 2017, six in the Class of 2016, and 11 in the Class of 2015.

These students have the opportunity to continue in the PSAT/NMSQT competition for some 7,500 National Merit Scholarships worth more than \$32 million that will be offered in the spring. Each scholarship is for \$2,500.

To advance to Finalist, Semifinalists must fulfill several requirements. About half the Finalists win the National Merit Scholarships.






