NEW JERSEY YOUTH SYMPHONY PRESENTS FALL CONCERT DECEMBER 3

The New Jersey Youth Symphony (NJYS) presents a Fall Concert featuring Youth Orchestra and Youth Symphony on Sunday, December 3 at 3:00 p.m. at New Providence High School located at 35 Pioneer Drive in New Providence. Tickets are \$20 for adults and \$15 for students and seniors. Tickets are available at the door or online at www.NJYS.org. Youth Orchestra, led by Conductor and Artistic Designate Helen Cha-Pyo, will open the concert with Dvořák's Slavonic Dances, Op. 46, Liszt's Hungarian Rhapsody No. 2, and Sibelius's Symphony No. 2, Op. 43. Youth Symphony, led by Conductor Simon Lipskar, will perform Debussy's Nocturnes and Shostakovich's Symphony No. 10 in E Minor.

Both Youth Orchestra and Youth Symphony are advanced, full orchestras in the NJYS family of ensembles. Youth Orchestra is open to students in grades 7-12 and Youth Symphony is open to students in grades 9-12. Youth Symphony has appeared at New York City's Carnegie Hall, the Musikverein in Vienna, and at the Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C. Youth Orchestra was selected to perform last April at the 2017 NAfME Eastern Division Conference in Atlantic City.

Helen Cha-Pyo has been named Artistic Director Designate and New Jersey Youth Symphony Conductor of The Wharton Institute for the Performing Arts starting 2018-2019 Season. She is serving as interim conductor for NJYS's Youth Orchestra during 2017–2018 season.

For the past 15 years, Cha-Pyo has inspired hundreds of young musicians to perform at the highest levels, resulting in Empire State Youth Orchestras being recognized as one of the nation's premier music organizations for youth. As Music Director and conductor of the ESYO Youth Orchestra, Helen regularly programs a wide range of music embracing many different cultures. Her vision resulted in a \$100,000 grant to partially fund a music festival that commissioned nine works (one for each ESYO ensemble), and winning three prestigious ASCAP awards. She has conducted the orchestra in outstanding concert halls including Troy Savings Bank Music Hall, the Massry Center for the Arts, EMPAC, Tanglewood's Ozawa Hall, and Carnegie Hall. She has led the orchestra on three international tours: to Europe in 2008, and to China and South Korea in 2012, and to Portugal in 2016. Helen's vision was instrumental in the founding of ESYO CHIME in 2015, a music education program dedicated to serving underprivileged youth. From 1996 to 2002, Cha-Pyo served as artistic director and conductor of the Riverside Philharmonic Orchestra and Choir and associate director of music at The Riverside Church in New York City. A committed music educator, she pioneered the Riverside Music Educational Program, which served thousands of New York City public school children. As artistic director for the Kenya Jirani Choir and Harlem Jirani Ensemble of the Jirani Cultural Organization from 2009 - 2012, Cha-Pyo traveled regularly to Kenya and Korea to oversee artistic

activities. In 2011, she toured Korea with Kenya Jirani Choir.

Born in Seoul, Cha-Pyo immigrated to the US when she was 12. She studied piano and organ in the Pre-College Program at The Juilliard School. She holds a Bachelor of Music in organ performance from Oberlin Conservatory and a Master of Music in conducting and organ performance from the Eastman School of Music. She is a frequent guest conductor for All State and Regional Festival Orchestras as well as summer festivals including Kinhaven School (VT) and Arco Youth Orchestra Festival (NJ). She resides in New Jersey with her husband and two sons.




