American Repertory Ballet (ARB), New Jersey's premier professional ballet company, will return to Rahway, N.J., this year with two performances of Nutcracker at Union County Performing Arts Center. ARB is celebrating its 54th year of this classic holiday ballet. Furthering its connection with the local Rahway community, American Repertory Ballet held auditions and selected local Rahway children ages 6-10 years old to perform alongside its professional dancers in Nutcracker on Saturday, November 19 at 2 p.m., and Sunday, November 20 at 1 p.m.

The mice take part in the ballet's famous Act I Battle Scene. The main character, Clara, dreams that tiny mice in her living room grow into giant rats and confront an army of toy soldiers and the Nutcracker Prince.

The six children performing as this year's Community Mice are Makayla Addisyn Slater, Raquella Reinoso, and Hailey Lynn Gatling, students at Madison Elementary School; Mia Pravia, a student at Roosevelt Elementary School; as well as Sophia Kendall Douglas and Zoë Collins-Murphy, students at Grover Cleveland Elementary School.

"We are delighted to have the Rahway Community Mice for the third year" says Douglas Martin, Artistic Director of American Repertory Ballet. "These lovely young dancers get

a chance to perform on stage with professional dancers of American Repertory Ballet and students from our affiliated school, the Princeton Ballet School, in the professional production of Nutcracker. It is an experience they will hopefully never forget."

The mission of American Repertory Ballet is "to bring the joy, beauty, artistry, and discipline of classical and contemporary dance to New Jersey and nationwide audiences through public performances, and to dance students through artistic and educational programs." This year's Community Mice Initiative aims to fulfill this mission in an immersive way that introduces children to a professional environment and challenges them to achieve performance goals.

HUNDREDS GATHER FOR FOURTH ANNUAL UNION COUNTY DAY OF PRAYER

At a time when the country is being torn apart by hate rhetoric and fear of those unlike oneself, more than 650 members from Christian, Jewish, Muslim, and Buddhist communities came together October 24 in a show of unity at the Fourth Annual Union County Day of Prayer in Westfield.

"It is great to be together with leaders of other faiths," said Rev. Michael Saporito, pastor of The Parish Community of St. Helen, which hosted the event. "This is such a year of turmoil for people in the country. It is great to bring different people of faiths together, and what faith doesn't want love, peace and unity and want to treat other people with the dignity they deserve?"

The annual Union County Day of Prayer, whose theme this year was Unifying Our Community Through Prayer, is hosted each year by the Union County Interfaith Coordinating Council, comprising more than 40 interfaith congregations and community-based nonprofits, including founding member Community Access Unlimited (CAU). The evening featured prayers, songs and meditations from religious leaders of various faiths from throughout Union County.

"Martin Luther King once said that the most segregated time in this country is 11 a.m. on Sunday when everyone goes to their segregated church," said Sid Blanchard, CAU's executive director. "People with disabilities can't go because they are excluded, they are unwelcome. By bringing the community together and meeting each other, we are seeing that all people have value. People with disabilities and young people who have been abused and neglected will be welcomed in the faith community of their choice."

Imam Khalil Abdul Aziz of Plainfield's Mosque Masjidullah, agreed, saying, "Here in 2017, I think we haven't made the effort to get to know each other. We live next to synagogues, churches and mosques, but we don't really know each other. Interfaith efforts are very productive in bridging that gap."

That was a belief shared among the other religious leaders and reflected their denomination's teachings. Said Rev. Ann Marie Alderman of the First Unitarian Society of Plainfield, "Part of our faith is the interconnected web of all beings. We believe that all the various

ways to reach the holy are legitimate and it is important for us to work together so the beloved community arrives."

The Interfaith Coordinating Council was created by Community Access Unlimited CAU, a statewide Elizabeth-based nonprofit providing support programs and services to adults with disabilities as well as youth served under the Department of Children and Families (DCF) to enable them to live independently in the community, providing supports in areas including housing, vocational skills and life-skills training, education, advocacy and recreation.

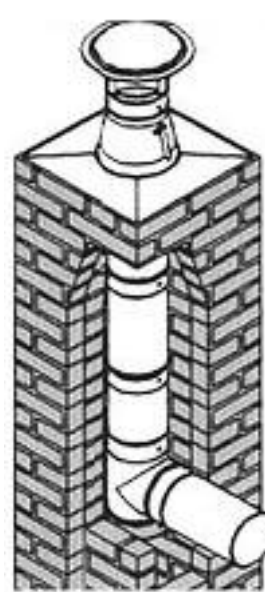

AMERICAN GOLDFINCH (PART ONE) WINTER BIRD FEEDING

Easy to recognize, the American Goldfinch is a small bird in the finch family. During the summer the male is bright yellow with black wings, a tail with white markings, and a black forehead. The female is olive green with black wings, a tail with white feathers and she has no marking on her forehead. She can be identified from other yellow birds by her short bill. In winter both sexes look like the summer female and the male loses his forehead patch.

The Goldfinch has a large range from Southern Canada to Mexico. Although some migrate south, many Goldfinches overwinter in our area where they flock together with Pine Siskin and Common Redpolls.

All year long the Goldfinch are almost totally vegetarian only occasionally eating a few insects. Their diet consists mainly of sunflower seeds, asters, composite plants such as coneflowers, and "thistle" seeds. During the winter months Goldfinch frequently visit backyard feeders, especially when the ground is covered with snow. Goldfinches are attracted to black-oil, grey stripped sunflower seeds, and are most attracted to 'nyjer' (niger) seeds.

Nyjer seeds is commonly called thistle but it is actually from a different plant grown in Africa, India and Southeast Asia. It is highly nutritional and is grown mainly for human consumption. Because of its size and shape there are many specialized thistle feeders on the market. The tiny holes on these feeders prevent waste and stop other larger birds from gobbling it up and scaring your Goldfinches away. Well worth a onetime investment, these feeders will last many years. There are also inexpensive cloth feeders that can be purchased. During the depths of

winter these cautious birds will come to a thistle feeder attached to a window.

Place your feeders in an area easy to view from a window but close enough to evergreens for protection, and if need be a quick escape. Sit back, stay warm and enjoy your garden all long year.

CLIFFORD P. CASE – ONLY RAHWAY RESIDENT TO REACH THE U.S. SENATE

Clifford P. Case (1904-1982) began his political career as a Rahway councilman and would later be elected to the New Jersey General Assembly, the United States House of Representatives, and the United States Senate. In total, he represented his city and the state of New Jersey on both the state and federal levels for forty years and is the only Rahway resident to have ever become a United States Senator.

Born in 1904 in Franklin Park, New Jersey and raised in Poughkeepsie, New York, Case was a lifelong adult resident of Rahway, having moved to the city in 1929. His long and distinguished political career began when he ran and won a seat on the Rahway City Council in 1937. During his campaign to serve as the Republican representative of Rahway's Third Ward, Case was characterized as a man who had "a strong conviction that it was the moral duty of every citizen to actively participate in the civic life of his or her community." His influential work on Rahway's council and his highly personalized style of campaigning caught the attention of state leaders who drafted him to run for the state's General Assembly in 1942. Case would win that election and would complete one term. In 1944 he was chosen to run for a seat in the United States House of Representatives to serve New Jersey's 6th Congressional District. His ultimate election resulted in a difficult decision for him and his family. Rather than move everyone to Washington, the congressman decided to commute to D.C. and keep his residence in Rahway.

As a member of Congress, Case earned a reputation as a liberal Republican and was often endorsed by liberal organizations that usually supported Democratic legislators. A strong supporter of civil rights, he voted in favor of an anti-poll tax measure, the creation of a Fair Employment Practices Commission, and a proposal to prevent segregation in the Women's Reserve of the Coast Guard. He also opposed the establishment of a permanent House Un-American Activities Committee.

Case would be re-elected to the House for a total of four terms (1944-1953) and his popularity would be illustrated in the 1952 election when he won 20,000 more votes than any other candidate had ever received in the 6th District and even out-drew President-elect Dwight D. Eisenhower by more than 10,000 votes.

In March, 1954, Case announced his candidacy for a seat in the United States Senate that had been vacated by Republican incumbent Robert C. Hendrickson. During the campaign, Case openly denounced the demagoguery of the infamous Senator Joseph McCarthy raising the ire of factions within the Republican Party who attempted to force Case off the ballot. With the endorsement of both President Eisenhower and

Vice-President Richard Nixon, however, Case narrowly won the election of November 2, 1954 by a margin of only 3,369 votes, the closest Senate election in New Jersey's history. His three later elections (1960, 1966, and 1972) produced progressively larger pluralities with the last two being landslides. In the election of 1960, the contest that took John F. Kennedy to the White House, Case's popularity was again shown when he was re-elected with a record plurality of 332,000 votes.

While in the Senate, Case compiled one of the most liberal records of a Republican in the U.S. Senate. He once defended his ideology by stating, "If the needs of this country are not met by middle-of-the-road progressivism, the problem won't be met, and the time will come when only extremist solutions are possible." He believed strongly that each political party should maintain a cross-section of belief to keep the country firmly in the center and decisions should be based on facts, not ideologies. In 1973 he co-sponsored the Case-Church Amendment which prohibited further U.S. military activity in Vietnam, Laos, and Cambodia.

Senator Case sought a fifth term in 1978, but lost the Republican primary to an anti-tax conservative who would lose in the general election to Bill Bradley. The Senator's loss in the GOP primary that year has often been called the biggest political upset in New Jersey history. Since Case's last victory in 1972, no Republican has been elected to represent New Jersey in the U. S. Senate.

After his death on March 5, 1982, Rahway Mayor Daniel L Martin said, "The things he stood for and fought for are cause for all Americans to hold their heads high. As a man of dignity and integrity, he made an indelible mark and he will never be forgotten by his friends and fellow citizens of Rahway." On the Tuesday after his death, flags throughout the city were lowered to half-mast in honor of the city's favorite son who was always quick to say when he returned to Rahway, "It's good to be home."

RAHWAY'S OWN UNITED IN SHARING

Perhaps the most valuable lesson to be learned throughout one's education is that knowledge is meant to be shared. It can be imparted in many ways, on many levels, and in many different arenas. It is to this spirit of sharing that each of this year's inductees into the 'Rahway's Own' class of 2017 has firmly dedicated himself and continues to act as 'mentor' to the youth of Rahway in hopes that each may find his or her way on the path to realizing his or her dreams and to achieving success.

Leading jazz musician Darryl Dixon, who has received national acclaim as composer, arranger, and leader of Chops Horns – the horns section for several major contemporary musicians, paid moving tribute to his former teacher and mentor Ron Dolce, now retired and serving as Vice President of the Rahway Board of Education, for keeping his dream alive of pursuing a career in his first love, music. Mr. Dixon believes his recognition as one of 'Rahway's Own' "proves my high school years were not in vain." He wishes to stress to the students that this award demonstrates their community's true appreciation of the arts and that these avenues of creativity and personal expression are encouraged and open to all who wish to follow them.

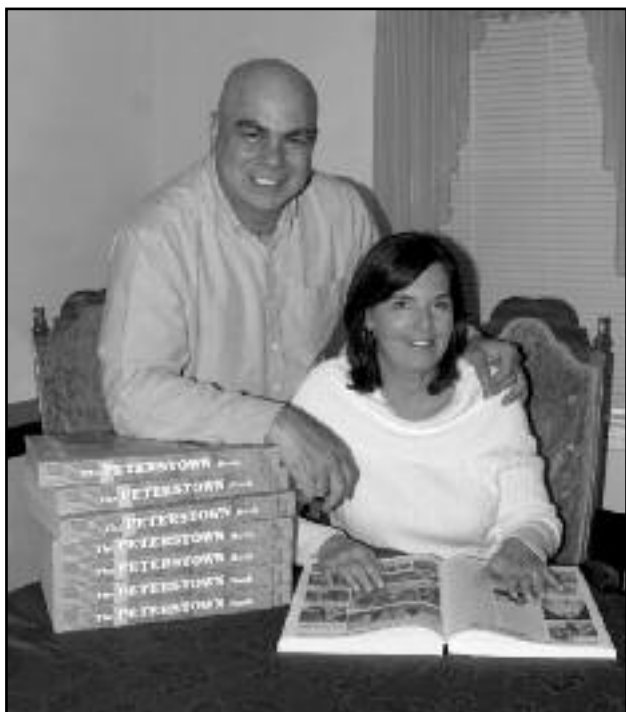
