CITY OF SUMMIT PROVIDES HOLIDAY PARKING INCENTIVES TO PROMOTE LOCAL BUSINESS

To help promote area businesses and encourage local shopping this holiday season, the City of Summit Parking Services Agency is partnering with Summit Downtown, Inc. to implement a number of parking modifications and incentives in the Central Retail Business District through the start of the new year.

From Tuesday, November 28 to Friday, December 22 (Tuesday to Friday) from 10 a.m. to 9 p.m. free valet service will be provided in the Springfield Avenue Tier Garage with the purchase of daily parking.

Employees and shoppers will be able to text or call ahead to have their vehicle waiting when business in Summit is complete.

Users of the Parkmobile app will receive push notifications to utilize valet parking when in the downtown.

From December 11 to December 23, 90-minute street meters in the center of downtown will be bagged, offering complimentary parking with a 90-minute time limit strictly enforced to encourage turnover and deter long-term parking.

Monday, January 1, 2018 is designated as a parking holiday in Summit with no fees required in lots or at meters.

"The holiday season is an excellent time to implement parking incentives to encourage people to spend time and money in downtown Summit," explains Summit Mayor Nora Radest. "It will be a boost for local merchants and enhance the experience of visiting our downtown."

SUMMIT POLICE CHIEF ROBERT WECK ISSUES TRAFFIC & RESIDENTIAL SAFETY REPORT

Summit Police Chief Robert Weck presented a traffic and residential safety report, Keeping Summit Safe, on the Roadways and in Your Homes, at the November 1 Common Council meeting focusing on the success of the expanded Summit Police Department traffic safety, community policing and patrol units.

"It is important for the community to be educated about the number of pedestrian and vehicle accidents in Summit," explains Police Chief Robert Weck. "There is often a significant difference between perceptions and reality, and how effective the SPD is in modifying behavior and making the streets even safer for travel."

Chief Weck reviewed statistics for accidents among pedestrians and motorists from 2012 to the present, showing a progressive overall decrease in the number of serious accidents.

Weck continues: "While our goal for the number of accidents is always zero, we are encouraged by the effectiveness of our initiatives and ability to use a combination of education, engineering and enforcement to address traffic-related concerns within the community."

In the presentation, Chief Weck also addressed the inaccurate perception among some members of the community that the number of residential burglaries is on the rise.

"In almost every instance, an unlocked door of a car is how the perpetrator gets access to the vehicle," reports Chief Weck. "If you see something, say something and please lock your doors and remove keys from cars."

Chief Weck further reinforced that the Summit Police Department wants citizens to reach out to them with issues and concerns: "We are here for you, and want to hear from you."

CASA GALA LAUDS SUMMIT VOLUNTEER STILL 'URGENT NEED' FOR MORE LOCAL ADVOCATES

More than 300 community members, movers and shakers, advocate volunteers and other supporters of Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of Union County gathered recently for its fifth annual Foster the Dream gala to celebrate the volunteer-based nonprofit's success in protecting the best interests of local youth placed in foster care due to abuse, neglect or abandonment — and highlight in particular the exemplary work of two, including long-time Summit resident Marité Robinson.

Previously a CASA volunteer out-of-county who then volunteered 10 years as a board member for CASA of Union County, Robinson received the Honorable Jo-Anne B. Spatola Dream-Maker Award for her passion to bettering the lives of local foster youth and commitment to the organization's growth. In addition, Longtime Westfield resident Barbara Bagger received the Dream-Keeper Award for Outstanding Volunteerism. An adoptive and biological mother, and wife to former state Sen. Richard Bagger, Barbara advocates for four foster youth with histories of substance abuse, homelessness, medical and educational needs, sexual and physical abuse, and neglect. Through 15 court appearances, the judge has accepted 60 of her 76 recommendations.

As dinner guests celebrated with cocktails, dancing, auctions, raffles, wine pulls, ice cream bar, fresh popcorn takeaways, and a gif-photo booth that stole the social-media show, there was another more serious message of the

evening: there continues to be a dire need for additional community volunteers to serve as advocates.

Said Executive Director Higginbotham, "Barbara and Marité are shining examples of the power of passionately preserving the welfare of others. Each have busy lives and other responsibilities yet they choose to serve and change the course for children without a safety net. They are that safety net. It's CASA of Union County's privilege to have them. Despite these great strides and all the work of our dedicated advocates, nearly half the local youth in foster care still need their own Barbara or Marité, their voice in the system. As the only organization in the county providing this service to the judiciary, it's our duty to trumpet the urgent need for more volunteers to step up, speak up and lift up a fragile child. The power to change the trajectory of a life is there for the taking."

CASA volunteers are court-empowered to speak to all parties in the child's life and serve as eyes and ears for the judge. Nearly half of the more than 500 Union County youth in care still need a CASA volunteer to protect their best interests. Two advocate training sessions are forming now that incorporate six in-person classes with online coursework: Saturday mornings starting Feb. 24 and Tuesday evenings starting April 3.



Commemorating John Curry and the 1879 Vision at Knock, Ireland

The Pipes of Christmas will celebrate its nineteenth season with performances in New Jersey and New York this December.
