Kelly explained the process by which the King and Queen were selected.

"Upon returning to Watchung Hills this September,' Kelly said, "the current Senior class nominated their peers to comprise our 2017 Homecoming Court. The students were told to nominate a male and female student who embodies

our Watchung Hills values and traditions.

"The top five nominees for King and Queen were tallied. Thereafter, the entire student body was able to vote on the King and Queen. We accepted and tallied votes up until the end of the first quarter of the game. Prior to the game the court and their families were welcomed with a Homecoming Reception sponsored by our WHRHS All School Council."

In the game, the Warriors battled Phillipsburg High School Stateliners, but in the end WHRHS lost to perennial state football powerhouse, 35-0.

Warrior senior quarterback Connor James finished with 9 of 21 for 149 yards passing and ran the ball another 10 times for 47 yards. Among the highlights, senior receiver Mike Asante had three catches for 61 yards. Senior running back had two receptions for 42 yards. Senior tight end Jeff Poggi had three catches for 37 yards.

WHITE-OUT AGAINST BULLYING

Homecoming Night was also "White-Out being bullied." against Bullying" Night, sponsored by the students' Diversity Club. Many students, parents and staff wore white in support of an ongoing initiative at the school to raise awareness and support for the anti-bullying movement at WHRHS and in the community.

State Sen. Tom Kean Jr., as well as Somerset County Sheriff Capt. Tim Pino, were special guests. They also have been present at several White Out assemblies at the school over the

During his remarks to attendees, Sen. Kean acknowledged that only six days earlier in Las Vegas, Nev., the week, "began with such sorrow," and in contrast, "tonight we offer hope – hope to others that Watchung Hills stands against bullying and is ready to extend a hand to those

Kean continued, "In a week that began with such chaos, tonight we all stand together on this field – together, united, firm in our mission – as a team, as a school, and as a community against bullying."

The WHRHS White Out initiative has been credited with having coined a new word, "Upstander," a person who stands up against bullying. Kean made reference to that in his remarks.

"Let us look around tonight," Kean said, "and remember this image and let it remind us that our commitment to each other and to the pledge we have taken to always stand up to hate, injustice and prejudice. Do your part to make this world a better, safer, and happier place for all of us."

In closing, Kean said, "Now, Go Warriors!"



ENVIRONMENTALLY-FRIENDLY REFILLABLEWATER STATIONS INSTALLED IN SCHOOLS

There is a small display in the upper right corner of the new water bottle filling stations installed over the summer in Warren Township Schools that acts as a simple reminder of the amount of waste eliminated by choosing to use refillable water containers over disposable plastic bottles

The display counts the number of plastic bottles avoided each time a student or staff member chooses to refill his or her own reusable version. At last count, Warren Middle School had bypassed nearly 7,000 disposable plastic bottles at its four new water stations and close to 16,000 at an existing refillable station.

Twelve new bottle filling stations have been installed across the school district – 4 at the middle school and 2 in each of the four elementary schools.

"It was important for us to be able to provide students and staff access to cold, filtered water in a way that allows them to fill water bottles for continued use back in the classroom. Not only is this good for environmental stewardship but it helps with proper hydration to assist in supporting a healthy lifestyle," says Superintendent Dr. Matthew Mingle.

Due to the painstaking efforts of skilled maintenance workers Calvin James and Ralph Circelli, the Elkay ezH20 stations were in place by the start of school, which was no small task.

"Old fountains had to be removed and plumbing and electric was relocated to fit the new stations. In some cases, new electrical wires were run," says Buildings and Grounds Supervisor Michael Pate. "Some relocation involved breaking open the block wall and reinstalling new masonry blocks before mounting the new fountain and touching up the paint around them."

Traditional drinking fountains remain at each of the schools. The new water filling stations include such additional features as water filters, a low energy LED light that helps users see when their bottle is full and, of course, the chance to contribute to taking care of Mother Earth.

15 WHRHS STUDENTS NAMED 2018 NATIONAL MERIT SEMIFINALISTS

A record 15 Watchung Hills Regional High School (WHRHS) students in the Class of 2018 have been named Semifinalists in the 2018 National Merit Scholarship Program.

Another 53 WHRHS students have qualified for the honor "Commended," the category just before Semifinalists. These designations were made based on the scores of students who took the 2016 Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test (PSAT)/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (NMSQT).

The total of 68 recognized students – combining Semifinalists and Commended students – ranks WHRHS 9th among all high schools in New Jersey, as well as 6th among comprehensive public high schools in the state, and 1st among all high schools in Somerset County, according to Principal George Alexis.

"The National Merit results are impressive and provide further evidence that our sustained focus on inquiry and collaboration is advancing learning in our school," Alexis said. "We are proud of our students and grateful for our teachers' hard work and commitment. The quality of teaching and learning taking place each day is making a difference for our entire school community."

This year's 15 WHRHS National Merit Semifinalists means that as many as 42 WHRHS students have qualified as National Merit Semifinalists during the most recent four years, including 10 in the Class of 2017, six in the Class of 2016, and 11 in the Class of 2015.

Nationwide about 16,000 National Merit Semifinalists have been named semifinalists based on their scores on the Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT) taken by 1.6 million juniors last Fall.

These students have the opportunity to continue in the PSAT/NMSQT competition for some 7,500 National Merit Scholarships worth more than \$32 million that will be offered in the spring. Each scholarship is for \$2,500.

To advance to Finalist, Semifinalists must fulfill several requirements. About 90 percent are expected to advance to Finalist. About half the Finalists win the National Merit Scholarships, along with earning the title, National Merit Scholar.

WOODLAND SCHOOL EARNS PRESTIGIOUS BLUE RIBBON AWARD

Woodland School has been named a 2017 National Blue Ribbon School, one of only five public elementary schools in Somerset County to receive the prestigious recognition in the program's 35- year history.

U.S. Secretary of Education Betsy DeVos made the announcement in Washington, D.C. on September 28, 2017.

"National Blue Ribbon Schools are active demonstrations of preparing every child for a bright future," DeVos said in the announcement, live streamed to Woodland's library media center for staff to view. "You are visionaries, innovators and leaders. You have much to teach us: some of you personalize student learning, others engage parents and communities in the work and life of your local schools and still others develop strong and forward-thinking leaders from among your teaching staff."

Woodland School received the Blue Ribbon Schools award in the category of "exemplary high performing schools."

"The prestigious Blue Ribbon award is the result of years of remarkable educators who do everything that it takes to ensure that the students of Woodland are successful," says Jeffrey Heaney, who joined the district as principal of Woodland in 2014. "While academic achievement, engaging lessons and high performance on standardized assessments are all important at Woodland, we are so much more than numbers, so much more than books, and so much more than tests and quizzes. The staff, students and parents truly deserve the highest honor bestowed upon them. I am privileged and proud to work alongside such remarkable people."

Created in 1982, the National Blue Ribbon Schools Program recognizes outstanding public and non-public school achievement for overall academic excellence and/or progress in closing achievement gaps among student subgroups. To be nominated, a school has to demonstrate high or strongly improving student scores on state or national normed assessments in the last year tested, as well as meet annual measurable objectives.

Specifically, the performance of all tested students in a school in both reading and mathematics has to be in the top 15 percent of all schools in New Jersey in the most recent year tested. Additionally, for each of a school's student subgroups, the performance of all tested students in a subgroup in both reading and math must be in the top 40 percent of all schools statewide.

"This honor is well deserved for the entire Woodland School community, past and present. Without consistent expectations for excellence shared among students, staff, administration, and parents over the years, such a recognition could not occur," says Superintendent Matthew Mingle. "This is an exciting day not only for Woodland School but for all of us in the Warren Township Schools."

"We are filled with pride for Woodland School. This award recognizes the extraordinary talent of our staff, the hard work of our students, and the ongoing involvement of our parent community,"

president Tia Allocco. "The achievement affirms the high quality of education we deliver to the children of Woodland Elementary School, and all of our schools, on a daily basis. We celebrate the Blue Ribbon Award with the entire Warren community whose commitment to our schools has been vital to our success."

Principal Heaney and one other staff member will travel to the nation's capital on November 6-7, 2017 to accept the award on behalf of the school during a special Blue Ribbon ceremony.

Nine public schools across New Jersey earned the Blue Ribbon designation.

"I want to congratulate these nine New Jersey

adds Warren Township Board of Education public schools for being selected as National Blue Ribbon Schools, the highest recognition bestowed by the United States Department of Education," says New Jersey Education Commissioner Kimberley Harrington. "These schools area being honored thanks to the dedication of their teachers, administrators, students, and school communities working together to achieve educational excellence."







1ST GRADERS RECEIVE LESSON ON BUTTERFLIES

What started as a simple rescue mission turned into an impromptu science lesson on the life cycle of the Monarch butterfly for first graders at Angelo L. Tomaso School.

During a recent recess, students and teacher Mary Balkonis noticed caterpillars enjoying a meal on milkweed, among the varied plant life in the outdoor classroom. Worried that hungry birds would make a meal of the caterpillars, the group rescued 10 of the crawlers, providing them haven in a netted enclosure and plenty of fresh milkweed leaves.

It wasn't long before caterpillars became chrysalises. Not long after that, the Monarch butterflies began to emerge in all their bright orange and black splendor.

"One caterpillar got out and formed a chrysalis on the underside of a table [in the classroom,]" says Balkonis. When the Monarch showed its colors, Balkonis "used sugar water to coax the butterfly back to the enclosure."

On Sept. 26, giddy first graders in Elena Marinello's class joined Balkonis in releasing the Monarchs into the skies outside of ALT.

As educators, it is not only our responsibility to prepare our students to succeed in a changing world, but also to help ensure the world's resources are still abundant for future generations to enjoy as we have," explained Elizabeth C. Jewett, Superintendent, Watchung Hills Regional High School District.

"As students and teachers head back to school this year, they will learn the good news that their hard work has paid off," said Randall Solomon, executive director of Sustainable Jersey. On October 24, 2017, the certified schools and their districts will be celebrated at a reception held during NJSBA Workshop 2017 in Atlantic City. Workshop 2017 will feature Sustainable Jersey for Schools sessions along

with NJSBA sustainability support programs for schools.
