WATCHUNG ARTS CENTER CELEBRATES 40 YEARS

On Saturday, November 11, eighty supporters, including artists, musicians, elected officials and volunteers, gathered at the Watchung Arts Center to celebrate the Center's 40th year of service to the Watchung community and the surrounding areas.

The elegant evening, Celebrating the Arts in Style for 40 Years, included a Menu of Festive Foods, a live performance, and a Delectable Dessert Table. Board President, Joan Plasner, welcomed Watchung Mayor Stephen Pote, former Mayor Al Ellis, and introduced the members of the Arts Center Board of Trustees as well as others who have contributed over the years to the workings of the Center. "This evening is such a wonderful opportunity to acknowledge and thank the people on the performing, exhibiting, and teaching end of our organization, as well as those who currently and previously undertook the management of this special little gem of an Arts Center."

The evening's entertainment was provided by master pianist, Rio Clemente, known as the "Bishop of Jazz." Mr. Clemente, accompanied by bassist Alex Gressel, led off the program with "Getting to Know You" followed by "The Brotherhood of Man." The show also included a jazz arrangement of "Swan Lake" and a medley of tunes from "West Side Story". A selection of patriotic songs, in honor of Veterans Day, was followed by Rio Clemente's traditional closing song, "God Bless America".

Founded in 1978, the Watchung Arts Center operates in a charming 150-year-old building which once served as the original schoolhouse for the

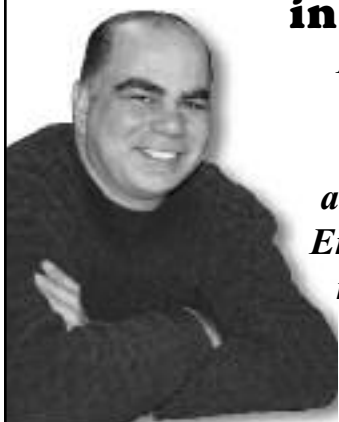

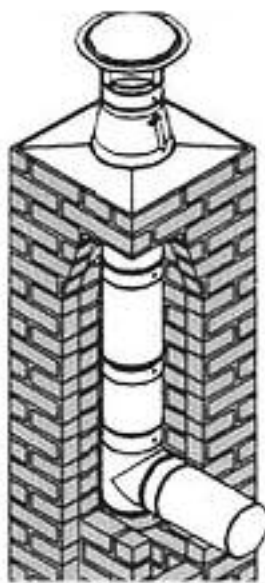

SAFE + SOUND ENDING DOMESTIC ABUSE

Domestic abuse is an epidemic affecting individuals in our communities, accompanied by a pattern of abusive behaviors that are used to gain or maintain power and control over a partner; physical violence, sexual assault, financial control, threats, intimidation, isolation and verbal abuse are methods an abusive partner uses to gain control.

Leaving an abusive relationship is not easy and poses threats to the victim and their family and friends. The victim may still be in love with the abuser, in hopes that the situation will change. Feelings of guilt and remorse may overcome the victim as they evaluate leaving the relationship, especially if they have children.

In other cases, the victim may be afraid to leave because of threatening or harassing behavior. Leaving becomes even more difficult if they do not have an independent source of income or the support of family and friends.

Safe+Sound Somerset, a nonprofit agency whose mission is to empower survivors of domestic abuse and engage the community to break the cycle of violence, provides specialized

crisis and ongoing supportive services for victims of domestic abuse and their children throughout Somerset County. Safe+Sound Somerset offers a comprehensive range of services to adults and children, including a 24-hour toll-free Call or Text Crisis Hotline, (866) 685-1122.

Safe+Sound Somerset provides safe-house protection, transitional housing and support to victims of domestic abuse, individual or group counseling and legal advocacy.

The overall goal is to empower clients with tools to increase their safety and reduce the risk of future harm to themselves and their children. Ultimately, clients and their children have the capacity to live free from abuse.

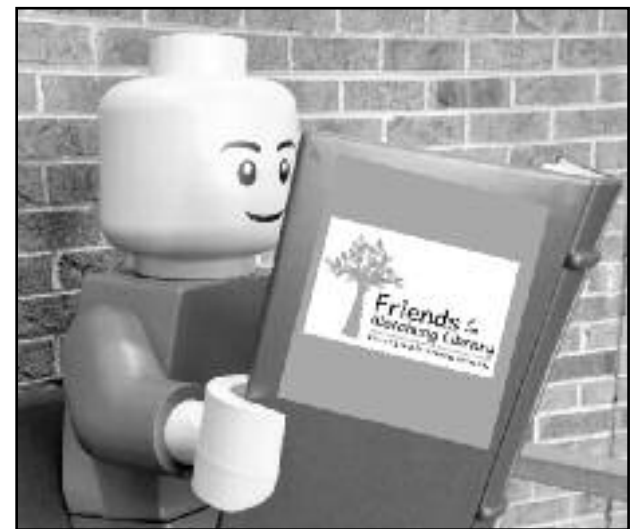

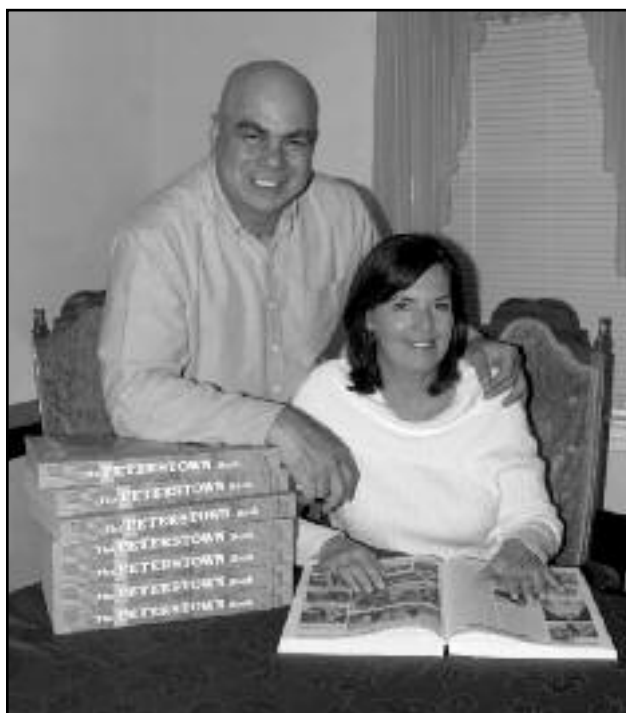

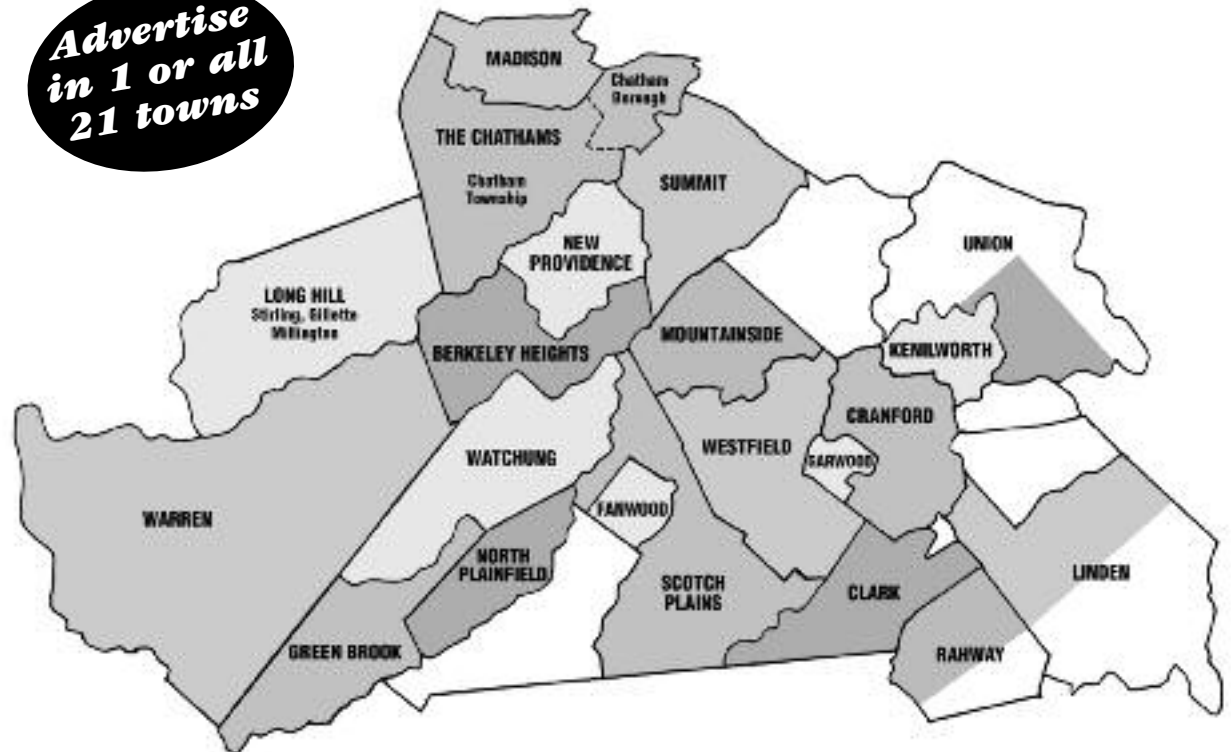
