## **GLHS INTERACT CLUB WINS PRESIDENTIAL CITATION**

On Tuesday, November 21, the club was visited by Berkeley Heights Rotary Club President Jim Ramentol, to present the Rotary Presidential Citation for 2016-17. After two postponements, Mountainside's historic Levi Cory House (circa 1818) was finally moved on November 2, 2013 and situated on its permanent lot on November 9th. The foundation was built and the 4-foot crawl space is complete. The house was lowered onto its new foundation on September 5th, 2014. Soil has been backfilled around the house. Two chimneys were replaced and work has been completed on the new roof. Fascia and sill repair are in the process. The "modern add-on" bow window has been removed and cedar siding has been replaced. A staircase has been built inside to access the crawl space basement. First floor rooms have had walls replaced and are freshly painted. The exterior has a fresh new paint job. Future plans include interior repairs and painting, and replacement of exterior porches which were original to the house. The house now has electricity! Other utilities (water, sewer, gas) need to be brought to the house.

The Mountainside Restoration Committee has acquired the historic structure and raised funds to save it from demolition, but it had to be moved. The Borough of Mountainside allowed the house to be permanently placed on Borough property on Constitution Plaza. The house, now relocated to its new home, is a fitting neighbor to the Hetfield House.

### **ART PROGRAM FUNDED THROUGH BILL AND MELINDA GATES FOUNDATION**

On November 8, 2017, Deerfield Art teacher, Victoria Tiscia, received a surprising email from Donors Choose, a crowd funding organization specifically geared to support classroom projects. The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation provided the final matching money to complete her request to fund a pottery wheel for the Deerfield art program. Mrs.Tiscia received a total of 10 donations to fund the \$1,700 project, but the largest donation came from the Gates Foundation. Donors may or may not reveal their identity when they decide to contribute.

Here is an excerpt of Mrs. Tiscia's grant proposal:

I would like to provide my students with access to new mediums and techniques on a daily basis. My classes range in ability from beginner artists to spatially gifted students. For many students, this could be the first and last time that they will be able to work with clay in their



academic career. I want to be able to provide every outlet possible for my students to create and explore in a three-dimensional art setting.

"Can we use the wheel?" This is the first question my students ask when they hear that we are making pottery. With your help, the answer will turn into a "yes!"

Founded in 2000 by a high school teacher in the Bronx, DonorsChoose empowers public school teachers from across the country to request much-needed materials and experiences for their students. Teachers make their request through the DonorsChoose website and individuals and organizations across the country make contributions.

Mrs. Tiscia is not the only teacher in Mountainside to have received funding from DonorsChoose. As part of a district wide initiative, this will be the fifth year that every classroom teacher in Mountainside participates. It began as a way to get more books into each classroom for the new Language Arts program, and as a way for the community to get more involved. But support has expanded. In the past four years teachers have received over \$60,000 in grants to enhance their classroom instruction, including such items as class sets of books and magazines, science lab materials, a scanner, and a weather station.
