We are so ready for spring at METC!

The Museum of Early Trades & Crafts is offering an abundance of new and different programs for all our visitors with the goal that everyone will be able to find something of interest at the museum to celebrate Spring.

First up is our new exhibition, "Are We There Yet? Stories of Travel by Stagecoach and Steam" opening in our Main Gallery on Friday, March 9, 2018. It will tell the story of the major expansion in travel during the 19th century, featuring personal accounts from letters in our collection, of journeys throughout New Jersey. It will also examine through actual artifacts, how the transportation networks were built, from the surveyors' compasses, to rail roaders' equipment to the tracklayers tools, that helped connect these early travelers with their world. METC will host a special opening reception on Thursday, March 15 at 6:30 p.m.

On March 10, we have a very special Makers Day project featuring the construction of a scale model of an East Jersey Cottage. This architectural style is a hybrid form, first seen

around 1730 almost exclusively in what is now Essex, Union, and Morris Counties. The project, our interpretation of a "spring barn raising," will be led by Master Carpenter Tyler Merson.

And finally, the Museum is expanding its After School Programs for spring and we are pleased to offer two new programs for kids. Museum Curators will explore the art of collecting, and offer insight into how museums use collections to create exhibits. Participants will be work with a museum educator to create their own min-exhibit. Our second program, "Introduction to Tabletop Game Design" will incorporate the mechanics of game design, story-telling and strategy development culminating with each student creating their own unique table top game. This program is led by guest instructor, Jennifer Graham-Macht of Play Satellite, who brings years of experience as a gaming industry consultant, designer, educator, and game store owner. Both are eight-week programs starting in April and registration can be done on line at metc.org/after-school-program-2/ or by calling the Museum at 973-377-2982.

'SAVING THE GREAT SWAMP' FREE SCREENING AND DISCUSSION

Fifty years ago, a group of committed citizens came together to block a jetport at what is now the Great Swamp National Wildlife Refuge. To celebrate this inspiring example of community activism, The Madison Environmental Commission is hosting a free screening of "Saving the Great Swamp" on March 10 at 2 p.m. at the Chase Room of Madison Public Library, 39 Keep Street, Madison, New Jersey.

"This is a story about local residents with no experience in community activism coming together to overcome financial and political obstacles," says Ellen Kranefuss, event organizer and member of the Madison Environmental

Commission. "It's a story that's as important today as it was fifty years ago."

The one-hour documentary will be introduced by Karl Fenske, whose mother Helen, led the fight to save the Great Swamp, a 55-square mile watershed located in Morris and Somerset Counties. Scott Morris, the documentary's director and co-producer will be on hand for a discussion afterward.

FRIENDS OF THE MADISON LIBRARY'S GALA BENEFIT

The Friends of the Madison Public Library, a nonprofit organization, will honor The Thursday Morning Club at its annual Gala Benefit to be held on Saturday, March 10, 2018 from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m., at the library which is located at 39 Keep Street, Madison. "The club founded the Friends of the Madison Library in 1938, so it is most appropriate that the Friends honor their founder on the Library's 80th anniversary" said Sylvia Lubner, Chairman of the Friends. "The Thursday Morning Club has contributed so much, not only to the library, but also to Madison and the surrounding area, that it is a privilege to recognize their work. Many on our library board are also members of the club as are most of the volunteers who prepare the mailing of the Friends' newsletters," she added.

"The Thursday Morning Club is 122 years old," said Carol Schessler, club president. "The club's founders anticipated the needs of Madison and contributed to the educational, social, and recreational fabric of the town at the turn of the century. In 1906, they hired the first District Nurse; in 1907, they began the Shade Tree Commission, and in 1908, they opened the first playground, at what is now Dodge Field, which they operated until 1924 when the Borough assumed responsibility for its operation.

Lubner added, "In 1924, a bequest from member Mary B. Cash enabled the club to construct a Settlement House, now known as the Madison Community House, at 25 Cook Avenue.

Today the club sponsors a Preschool, Before and After School Care Programs, and after-school enrichment classes. More than 25 local organizations also use the Community House as their meeting place. "Michal Holzman, a past president and current chair of the Archiving Project of the club, will give more of the club's background at the Gala," said Lubner.

The Friends will also formally welcome the library's new director, Lynn Favreau, who began on May 1, 2017. Lynn was the former Director of Mountainside Public Library. In addition to her graduate degree in Library Science from McGill University in Montreal, she earned a Diploma of Education and taught elementary education classes before becoming a reference librarian. "The Friends have enjoyed working with Lynn and look forward to another successful year at the library."

Wine and beer, and a variety of delicious hors d'oeuvres prepared by the Catering Department of the Thursday Morning Club will be served at the March 10 Gala Benefit at the library.

All are cordially invited to attend. Invitations have been mailed and are also available at the

front desk of the library, as well as tickets for a fund-raising event with prizes. Reservations also can be made online at <http://friendsmadisonnjlibrary.org> Admission is \$50 per person. Checks should be made payable to Friends of the Madison Public Library and mailed to 39 Keep Street, Madison, NJ 07940 along with the RSVP card. Cancelled checks will serve as a receipt; no tickets will be mailed.

Proceeds from the annual Gala Benefit will be used to support special library programs for children, teens and adults, and to expand the book and media collections. The Friends also fund new museum passes as part of the library's popular Museum Pass Program. Adult education programs sponsored by the Friends include Drew University Mini-courses, "Tech Tuesdays", and the Summer Seminar Series that is co-sponsored with the Madison Senior Center. 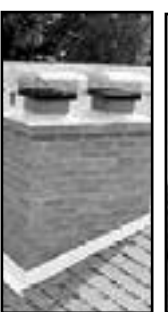

IRS WARNS PUBLIC ABOUT SCAMS TARGETING TAXPAYERS

The IRS is urging the public to be aware of suspicious individuals claiming to be from the IRS.

Thousands of people have lost millions of dollars and their personal information to tax scams. Scammers use the regular mail, telephone, or email to set up individuals, businesses, payroll, and tax professionals.

The IRS doesn't initiate contact with taxpayers by email, text messages, or social media channels to request personal or financial information. Recognize the telltale signs of a scam.

SCAMS TARGETING TAXPAYERS

IRS-IMPERSONATION TELEPHONE SCAMS

A sophisticated phone scam targeting taxpayers, including recent immigrants, has been making the rounds throughout the country. Callers claim to be IRS employees, using fake names and bogus IRS identification badge numbers. They may know a lot about their targets, and they usually alter the caller ID to make it look like the IRS is calling.

Victims are told they owe money to the IRS and it must be paid promptly through a gift card or wire transfer. Victims may be threatened with arrest, deportation or suspension of a business or driver's license. In many cases, the caller becomes hostile and insulting. Victims may be told they have a refund due to try to trick them into sharing private information. If the phone isn't answered, the scammers often leave an "urgent" callback request.

Some thieves have used video relay services (VRS) to try to scam deaf and hard of hearing individuals. Taxpayers are urged not trust calls just because they are made through VRS, as interpreters don't screen calls for validity.

Limited English Proficiency victims are often approached in their native language, threatened with deportation, police arrest and license revocation, among other things. IRS urges all taxpayers caution before paying unexpected tax bills. Note that the IRS doesn't:

- Call to demand immediate payment using a specific payment method such as a prepaid debit card, gift card or wire transfer.
- Generally, the IRS will first mail you a bill if you owe any taxes.
- Threaten to bring in local police or other law-enforcement groups to have you arrested for not paying.
- Demand payment without giving you the opportunity to question or appeal the amount they say you owe.
- Ask for credit or debit card numbers over the phone.

SCAMS TARGETING TAX PROFESSIONALS

Increasingly, tax professionals are being targeted by identity thieves. These criminals – many of them sophisticated, organized syndicates – are redoubling their efforts to gather personal data to file fraudulent federal and state income tax returns.

SURGE IN EMAIL, PHISHING AND MALWARE SCHEMES

Phishing (as in "fishing for information") is a scam where fraudsters send e-mail messages to trick unsuspecting victims into revealing personal and financial information that can be used to steal the victims' identity.

The IRS has issued several alerts about the fraudulent use of the IRS name or logo by scammers trying to gain access to consumers' financial information to steal their identity and assets.

Scam emails are designed to trick taxpayers into thinking these are official communications from the IRS or others in the tax industry, including tax software companies. These phishing schemes may seek information related to refunds, filing status, confirming personal information, ordering transcripts, and verifying PIN information.

Be alert to bogus emails that appear to come

from your tax professional, requesting information for an IRS form. IRS doesn't require Life Insurance and Annuity updates from taxpayers or a tax professional.

Variations can be seen via text messages. The IRS is aware of email phishing scams that include links to bogus web sites intended to mirror the official IRS web site. These emails contain the direction "you are to update your IRS e-file immediately." These emails are not from the IRS.

The sites may ask for information used to file false tax returns or they may carry malware, which can infect computers and allow criminals to access your files or track your keystrokes to gain information.

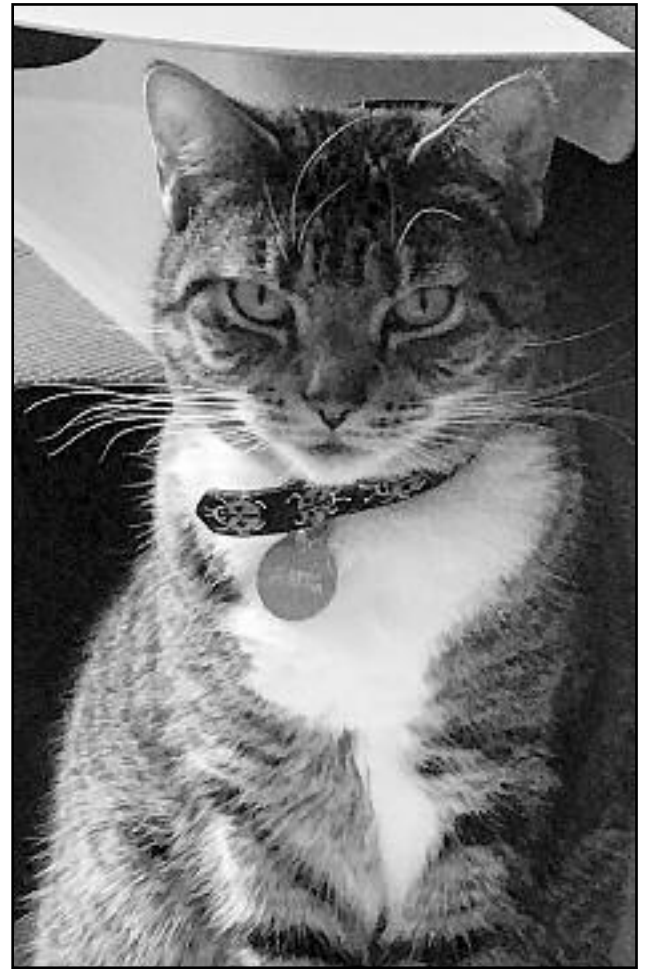
