

On Monday, February 26, 2018, the Township of Union firefighters joined together with 24 other teams of firefighters from around New Jersey to compete in 'The Ultimate Fire Department Cook-off,' part of the Cooked and Uncorked Food and Wine Festival held at the Pines Manor in Edison New Jersey. Union Firefighters took home 1st Place in the "People's Choice" category.

The event benefited the New Jersey State Firefighter's Mutual Benevolent Association and The Burn Center at Saint Barnabas Medical Center.

The Fire Department Cook-off is part of a



culinary extravaganza where participants were able to experience the tastes and flavors of more than 30 of New Jersey's finest restaurants, caterers and dessert shops all in one location. This event, held at The Pines Manor in Edison, NJ, drew more than 1000 people from across New

Jersey. According to event organizers, \$65,000 was raised this year, St. Barnabas will receive half. The Cooked and Uncorked event has provided The Burn Center at Saint Barnabas Medical Center with over \$170,000 over the past 8 years.



The annual Yom HaShoah Holocaust Commemoration at Kean University will take place on Wednesday, April 11, 2018 at 6:45 p.m. at the Wilkins Theatre for the Performing Arts, 1000 Morris Avenue, Union, New Jersey.

This year's featured speaker will be Robert Bielsky, the youngest son of the legendary

partisan commander Tuvia Bielski, portrayed by Daniel Craig in the 2009 film "Defiance." He lectures throughout the world about the heroics of his father and uncles, and about their successful mission that saved over 1200 Jewish lives during the Holocaust, whose descendants today number in the tens of thousands.

Robert Bielsky is active in many Jewish organizations. He is a member of the Associates Board of the Museum of Jewish Heritage: A Living Memorial to the Holocaust in New York City, and is past president of the Holocaust Memorial Committee of Brooklyn.

This event is free and open to the public; and is sponsored by the Jewish Federation of Greater MetroWest NJ and Kean University's Holocaust Resource Center. 

Come and join us at the Taste of Union... it is known as a foodie destination. Each year, the Taste of Union committee assists individuals in our community with a need. Please help us in our efforts to support the Cosico family, our 2018 Taste of Union recipient.

The Cosico family has recently gone through many challenges due to multiple hospitalizations and surgeries for their little girl, Elyse, who was born with a rare congenital condition called APERT's Syndrome. This syndrome is characterized by abnormal skull development, fused fingers and toes, and some facial deformities. This condition requires multiple surgeries as Elyse grows.

In the recent past year, Elyse had to undergo three trips to Dallas, Texas, where she gets her care because her condition is not common in New Jersey. She recently had LEFORT 3 surgery with Halo placement to move her middle face forward

and fix her protruding eyes. After that surgery, she had to be hospitalized at Saint Barnabas Medical Center as she acquired a C-diff infection. She returned to Texas six weeks after the LEFORT 3 surgery to have the Halo removed. Last August 24, 2017, Elyse had neck spine surgery, after an MRI showed instability in her neck spine, specifically C1 and C2. This instability at this location can render her paralyzed on all four extremities if not immediately corrected. On December 19, Elyse had to undergo a CVR (Cranial Vault Reconstruction), where the skull bone was reopened again to allow normal brain development. She was transferred to the PICU after surgery.

All these surgeries are performed at Medical City Children's Hospital in Dallas, Texas, because of their expertise in Elyse's case. Because they are out of state, their medical insurance does not cover most of her bills and requires upfront payment fees to the doctor and hospital before she can be scheduled for surgery. As well as booking flights and hotel accommodations on every trip to Texas.

We are counting on your support, so Elyse will be able to keep getting the care she needs. Elyse is expected to have a few more surgeries in the future and her hope of continuing her medical follow-up in Texas will rely solely on your help. All proceeds will be used for medical bills and her ongoing care.


