HISTORICAL SOCIETY "HISTORY OF DINERS"

The Union Township Historical Society will host Michael Gabriele for a program on his book, "The History of Diners in New Jersey," at 2 p.m. on Sunday, March 18, 2018. The event will be held at Connecticut Farms Presbyterian Church, 888 Stuyvesant Avenue, Union, and is free and open to the public.

New Jersey is universally recognized as the "Diner Capital of the World." Gabriele's book, published by The History Press, tells the story of New Jersey's diner business and the evolution of the American diner phenomenon.

Friendly, familiar beacons on the Garden State's highways and byways and in downtown business districts, diners play an important role in New Jersey's culture and community life and serve as the ultimate egalitarian dining experience.

The book pays tribute to New Jersey as the diner manufacturing capital of the world during the 20th century. This was the period when prefabricated, modular diners were designed and built in factories as engineered products, much like cars and planes. These Garden State companies had built thousands of diners during the 20th century; the streamlined, stainless steel gems that are admired around the world and recognized as iconic examples of American industrial design. Nearly all the major U. S. diner builders were based in New Jersey: O'Mahony, Kullman, Paramount, Silk City, Fodero, Mountain View, Master, Swingle, Manno, and others. Unfortunately, the state's diner manufacturing sector is extinct; a forgotten chapter of New Jersey's history. Today, virtually all current diners in the Garden State and beyond are site-built structures.

More than just roadside attractions that serve coffee, pie, hamburgers, and French fries, diners are a vibrant part of the state's culture, history, commerce, and mythology. Many classic, factory-built, stainless steel diners have survived and continue to operate throughout New Jersey as landmarks and architecturally significant structures in the state's "built landscape."

Gabriele has written three books on New Jersey history, all published by The History Press. A lifelong New Jersey resident, he has been a journalist for more than 40 years. He is a 1975 graduate of Montclair State University; a member of the executive board of the Nutley Historical Society; and serves on the advisory board of the Clifton Arts Center.

UNION CELEBRATED BLACK HISTORY WITH 'THE AMEN CORNER'

Union celebrated their 3rd Annual Black History Month Celebration on Saturday, February 24, 2018 with a staged reading of the acclaimed play "The Amen Corner" by James Baldwin. The event took place at Central Five-Jefferson School on Hilton Avenue in Vauxhall, New Jersey.

"The Amen Corner" is a three-act play by James Baldwin, first published in 1954. It was Baldwin's first attempt at theater following "Go Tell It on the Mountain," and addresses themes of the role of a church in an African-American family and the effect of poverty, born of racial prejudice, on an African-American community.

"The Amen Corner" takes place in two settings: a "corner" church in Harlem and the apartment dwelling of Margaret Alexander, the church pastor; her son, David; and sister, Odessa. It is a moving drama which examines issues of community, faith, and forgiveness, and is filled with evocative music and language to stir the soul.

The performance was directed by Vauxhall native Daryl Stewart. Stewart grew up on Hilton Avenue and fondly recalls staples of his childhood there.

"My cousins and I spent bright summer mornings at 'The Box' with Miss Bailey on the Central Five School playground; and on Friday

The Mayor and Committee of the Township of nights, Joe's Pizza was the standard and staple for dinner," Stewart said. "Saturday nights were for skating at Skate 22 unless I had intense rehearsals for the musicals and plays at Union High School."

> According to Stewart, the Vauxhall section of Union was his hometown, but the theater was truly his home. As a result, he was proud to return to where it all started to share his craft with the community that nurtured him.

> "There is not a more appropriate art form for me to serve and honor my community with than theater, and there is not a more appropriate time for this play than right now," Stewart said.

> Stewart is an actor, director, performing and teaching artist, and arts advocate. He is a theater teaching artist at the New Jersey Performing Arts Center (NJPAC) in Newark, New Jersey. There he has collaborated with several dozen schools, groups and arts organizations teaching, curating, and creating musical theater, dance, and drama programs. He also serves as a lead teaching artist for the internationally recognized Disney Musicals in Schools program.

> "TV/Film credits include "Lipstick Jungle" (NBC), "School Spirits" (SYFY) and "106 & Park" (BET). Stewart's self-produced original one man show "Fully Versatile" premiered Off-Broadway at Playwrights Horizon, NYC.

UNION COUNTY CLERK JOANNE RAJOPPI TO BE PRESENTED WITH "WOMEN IN AMERICAN HISTORY" AWARD

March is Women's History month and the Crane's Ford Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) chapter will be presenting Joanne Rajoppi, Union County Clerk, with the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution "Women in American History" award on Saturday, March 10, 2018, at noon at the Cranford Community Center, 220 Walnut Avenue, Cranford, NJ.

The "Women in American History" award, sponsored by the NSDAR, is designed to recognize worthy women, and celebrate their contribution to history, culture, and society.

Joanne Rajoppi is the first woman County clerk in the 154-year history of Union County. She is the former Mayor of Springfield, former Union County Freeholder and first woman chairman of the Freeholder Board, and former NJ Assistant Secretary of State during the Byrne Administration. She has been an advocate for women running for public office, writing her first book, "Women in Office: Getting There and Staying There" in 1993.

As an author, her first book published in 2013 chronicled the military service of her greatgrandfather during the American Civil War titled "New Brunswick and the Civil War: The Brunswick Boys in the Great Rebellion" letters he wrote to his family. She followed the story with the Hamilton women after the war writing her most recent book: "Northern Women in the Aftermath of the Civil War: The Wives and Daughters of the Brunswick Boys." This book was published in 2017. Ms. Rajoppi will be presenting a power-point program on her most recent book and copies of the book will be available for purchase.

The public is invited to join us for the presentation with a reception to follow. The Crane's Ford chapter will also be celebrating its 74th Anniversary, chartered on March 8, 1944.

The NSDAR is a volunteer women's service

organization dedicated to promoting patriotism, historic preservation, service to veterans and meaningful community service. Membership is open to any woman 18 years or older who can prove lineal descent from an ancestor who aided in achieving American Independence. IRS WARNS PUBLIC ABOUT SCAMS TARGETING TAXPAYERS

The IRS is urging the public to be aware of **SURGE IN EMAIL. PHISHING** suspicious individuals claiming to be from the IRS.

Thousands of people have lost millions of dollars and their personal information to tax scams. Scammers use the regular mail, telephone, or email to set up individuals, businesses, payroll, and tax professionals.

The IRS doesn't initiate contact with taxpayers by email, text messages, or social media channels to request personal or financial information. Recognize the telltale signs of a scam.

SCAMS TARGETING TAXPAYERS **IRS-IMPERSONATION TELEPHONE SCAMS**

A sophisticated phone scam targeting taxpayers, including recent immigrants, has been making the rounds throughout the country. Callers claim to be IRS employees, using fake names and bogus IRS identification badge numbers. They may know a lot about their targets, and they usually alter the caller ID to make it look like the IRS is calling.

Victims are told they owe money to the IRS and it must be paid promptly through a gift card or wire transfer. Victims may be threatened with arrest, deportation or suspension of a business or driver's license. In many cases, the caller becomes hostile and insulting. Victims may be told they have a refund due to try to trick them into sharing private information. If the phone isn't answered, the scammers often leave an "urgent" callback request.

Some thieves have used video relay services (VRS) to try to scam deaf and hard of hearing individuals. Taxpayers are urged not trust calls just because they are made through VRS, as interpreters don't screen calls for validity.

Limited English Proficiency victims are often approached in their native language, threatened with deportation, police arrest and license revocation, among other things. IRS urges all taxpayers caution before paying unexpected tax bills. Note that the IRS doesn't:

- Call to demand immediate payment using a specific payment method such as a prepaid debit card, gift card or wire transfer. Generally, the IRS will first mail you a bill if you owe any taxes.
- Threaten to bring in local police or other law-enforcement groups to have you arrested for not paying.
- Demand payment without giving you the opportunity to question or appeal the amount they say you owe.
- Ask for credit or debit card numbers over the phone.

SCAMS TARGETING TAX PROFESSIONALS

Increasingly, tax professionals are being targeted by identity thieves. These criminals many of them sophisticated, organized syndicates - are redoubling their efforts to gather personal data to file fraudulent federal and state income tax returns.

AND MALWARE SCHEMES

Phishing (as in "fishing for information") is a scam where fraudsters send e-mail messages to trick unsuspecting victims into revealing personal and financial information that can be used to steal the victims' identity.

The IRS has issued several alerts about the fraudulent use of the IRS name or logo by scammers trying to gain access to consumers' financial information to steal their identity and assets.

Scam emails are designed to trick taxpayers into thinking these are official communications from the IRS or others in the tax industry, including tax software companies. These phishing schemes may seek information related to refunds, filing status, confirming personal information, ordering transcripts, and verifying PIN information.

Be alert to bogus emails that appear to come

from your tax professional, requesting information for an IRS form. IRS doesn't require Life Insurance and Annuity updates from taxpayers or a tax professional.

Variations can be seen via text messages. The IRS is aware of email phishing scams that include links to bogus web sites intended to mirror the official IRS web site. These emails contain the direction "you are to update your IRS e-file immediately." These emails are not from the IRS.

The sites may ask for information used to file false tax returns or they may carry malware, which can infect computers and allow criminals to access your files or track your keystrokes to gain information.
