The Troop also recently welcomed graduating AOLs from Warren's Cub Scout Pack 182 into Boy Scouts. Those fifth-grade scouts are now participants in the Boy Scout program, which develops leadership skills and fosters personal growth. A core part of the program is the opportunity to learn through earning merit

badges. There are over 100 merit badges that a scout may achieve during their time as a Boy Scout. Twenty-one merit badges are required to achieve Eagle Scout. Thirteen of those merit badges must come from a list that includes badges which work on a scout's health, service to community, and family life. Our troop currently has an active group working on achieving one of those merit badges, the Personal Fitness merit badge. The Personal Fitness merit badge will take each of these participants approximately six months to earn, and includes components of aerobic fitness, flexibility, and strength. This comprehensive merit badge also requires each of the scouts to research how to keep themselves healthy through nutrition, exercise, the avoidance of harmful substances, and healthy social and emotional interactions.

On February 24, 2018, the troop also had the privilege to support Andrew Roth at his Eagle Scout Court of Honor Ceremony. Andrew's Eagle project included the installation of a stone labyrinth at Wagner Farm Arboretum. Congressman Leonard Lance was in attendance to help us honor Andrew. Troop 228 had 10 scouts achieve the rank of Eagle in 2017. They were honored at the Patriots' Path Council Eagle recognition dinner in January.



### **MAYOR VICTOR SORDILLO** ATTENDS "HILL DAY" IN WASHINGTON, D.C.

Mayor Victor Sordillo of Warren Township was a guest on Capitol Hill in Washington, D.C. for "Hill Day" sponsored by American Small Manufacturers Coalition. He met with several legislators urging them to step up efforts to promote manufacturing through innovation and skill development.

Mayor Sordillo is a Trustee of the New Jersey (NJMEP) Manufacturing Extension Partnership. NJMEP is a federal public-private initiative that supports manufacturers throughout the country. The National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) provides partial funding and oversight. MEPs provide technical support and

employ industry experts to work directly with manufacturers. This includes consultation on insurance, human resources, supply chain management, codes & standards compliance, manufacturing technologies, et al.

Mr. Sordillo stated to the legislators that entrepreneurs take risks when establishing a business and we must help them identify and minimize all potential downsides to the risks that they are taking.

New Jersey residents pay over \$150 billion in federal taxes each year; while we rank in the top ten givers of taxes, we rank in the bottom five receivers of federal grants.






This year's featured speaker will be Robert




