COUNCILMAN PUBLISHES FIRST NOVEL

It took ten years of on-again, off-again effort but Fanwood Councilman Tom Kranz has published his first novel, inspired by his experiences in television news and a fantasy of exacting swift justice for an objectionable, even criminal boss.

"Budland" is the story of how Bud Remmick, a successful TV assignment editor, went from newsroom manager to prison inmate. Bud's plan sounded good on paper--do the lenient prison time for killing his blackmailing, criminally abusive boss, get out in a few years, and move on with his life. But the realities of prison, including a near-fatal attack and the strain on his loyal wife, force him to face his lifelong denial of a deep-rooted anger that not even he can fully fathom.

"I know it's a leap of faith to read a first-time novel, but I think you may be pleasantly surprised," Kranz says.

While the self-published novel is based loosely on some of Kranz's own experiences, the characters are composites and not based on any particular individuals.


"There's humor and compassion and a despicable bad guy whose behavior pushes some of today's hot buttons on sexual abuse in the workplace," adds Kranz who previously wrote a non-fiction book, "Liveshot: Journalistic Heroism in Philadelphia". Both are available on Amazon in paperback and Ebook.

A graduate of Temple University, Kranz worked for eleven years at WCAU-TV, the NBC affiliate in his native Philadelphia. He then worked for 15 years at CBS News, where he managed reporters, producers and photographers, wrote and edited scripts and did some field producing that took him to many American cities, Chile, Israel and Japan.

Kranz currently serves as Director of Communications for Chelsea Senior Living, a Fanwood based company. He is in his fifth year as a Fanwood Councilman and approaching twenty years as a volunteer EMT on the Fanwood Rescue Squad.




March 25, 2018 from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m., and the architecture from the 1700's. According to local legend, British General Cornwallis marched through the property after the Battle of Short Hills in 1777, and asked Aunt Betty Frazee to hand over bread for his tired and hungry troops.

To this she replied, "Sir, I give you this bread through fear, not in love." Cornwallis and his troops did not touch the bread, but they did take just about everything else. Betty's husband, Gershom Frazee, was a carpenter and very likely built the home himself between 1720 and 1740, influenced by the area's early Dutch homes.

UNION COUNTY CLERK JOANNE RAJOPPI TO BE PRESENTED WITH "WOMEN IN AMERICAN HISTORY" AWARD

March is Women's History month and the Crane's Ford Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) chapter will be presenting Joanne Rajoppi, Union County Clerk, with the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution "Women in American History" award on Saturday, March 10, 2018, at noon at the Cranford Community Center, 220 Walnut Avenue, Cranford, NJ.

The "Women in American History" award, sponsored by the NSDAR, is designed to recognize worthy women, and celebrate their contribution to history, culture, and society.

Joanne Rajoppi is the first woman County clerk in the 154-year history of Union County. She is the former Mayor of Springfield, former Union County Freeholder and first woman chairman of the Freeholder Board, and former NJ Assistant Secretary of State during the Byrne Administration. She has been an advocate for women running for public office, writing her first book, "Women in Office: Getting There and Staying There" in 1993.

As an author, her first book published in 2013 chronicled the military service of her greatgrandfather during the American Civil War titled "New Brunswick and the Civil War: The Brunswick Boys in the Great Rebellion" letters he wrote to his family. She followed the story with the Hamilton women after the war writing her most recent book: "Northern Women in the Aftermath of the Civil War: The Wives and Daughters of the Brunswick Boys." This book was published in 2017. Ms. Rajoppi will be presenting a power-point program on her most recent book and copies of the book will be available for purchase.

The public is invited to join us for the presentation with a reception to follow. The Crane's Ford chapter will also be celebrating its 74th Anniversary, chartered on March 8, 1944.

The NSDAR is a volunteer women's service organization dedicated to promoting patriotism, historic preservation, service to veterans and meaningful community service.

Membership is open to any woman 18 years or older who can prove lineal descent from an ancestor who aided in achieving American Independence.



As the first black faculty member at they could chase their dreams. Muhlenberg Nursing School in Plainfield, New Jersey, Corliss Henry remembers being on the receiving end of plenty of racist comments from both students and staff.

"I experienced it, yes," she said while chatting at The Chelsea at Fanwood assisted living residence where she now lives. "But you know what, I managed."

A lifelong registered nurse, Mrs. Henry grew up in the Bronx but lived in Plainfield most of her life. Since she was a little girl, she had a passion for helping others, which led her to pursue her career in nursing, earning her Bachelor's degree from Hunter College in New York and then her Masters from New York University. She went on to teach nursing at Muhlenberg when being black and being a nurse was a rare combination. The racism was palpable but Corliss believes that the civil rights movement made a difference.

"I never took it home," she said. "I didn't go to sleep with it. Because I knew I was what I was meant to be. I hung in there, I didn't quit."

During the summer months when there were no classes, she worked as the plant nurse at Lockheed on Route 22 in North Plainfield, now the site of the Watchung Square Shopping Center.

Mrs. Henry took a new job at Middlesex County College in 1968 where she taught nursing for 24 years. She loved reaching young adults so

Free Course on Mental Illness. The NAMI Family-to-Family Education Program begins on Thursday evening, March 22. Presented by the Union County Chapter of NAMI, the course meets 7 to 9:30 p.m. on Thursday evenings, over a consecutive 12-week period. Course ends on May 31. It is free-of-charge, with all necessary materials furnished at no cost.

The course is offered specifically to the parents, siblings, spouses, teen-age and adult children, and significant others of individuals with severe and persistent mental illness. In a confidential setting, loved ones will learn how to understand and support their ill relative while maintaining their own well-being. The program is not appropriate for individuals who, themselves, suffer from one of the major mental disorders. The course is taught by NAMI members who have completed intensive training.

As a result of Mayor Mahr's efforts to revamp buildings in downtown Fanwood into captivating retail and residential spaces, the town has seen a boost in economic growth and investments. The story of redevelopment in Fanwood has become a case study in small-town transit-orienteddevelopment. Spurning the traditional approach of having a single developer work with local government to assemble properties through eminent domain, Mayor Mahr and Fanwood officials worked hand-in-hand with local property owners to create a cohesive and updated

downtown. This approach empowered the local businesses and helped to retain beloved local institutions while making way for additional growth.

Recognized by the State of New Jersey with inclusion in the New Jersey Redevelopment Handbook as well as receiving the 2014 Smart Growth Award for their transit-orienteddevelopment project, the Borough was tapped to host the October 2017 New Jersey Redevelopment Authority for a workshop directed to planners and developers facing similar challenges.

Collum, Summit Mayor Nora Radest, Senior Managing Director of Phoenix Advisors LLC Sherry L. Tracey, Partner of McManimon, Scotland & Baumann, LLC Erin K. 
