'GUYS AND DOLLS' ANNUAL SPRING MUSICAL SUCCESS! Submitted by Denis Kelley

Annual spring musical, 'Guys and Dolls,' was a living-learning experience for a cast and crew of hundreds. Staging the annual spring musical at Watchung Hills Regional High Schools (WHRHS), which this year, 2018, was the iconic Broadway and Hollywood musical, "Guys and Dolls," was a livinglearning experience for hundreds of students, teachers, parents, community volunteers, and supporters.

And, as if simply staging a high quality high school musical isn't enough of a challenge every year, this year had the added challenge of performance dates during March 2018, when there were multiple snow events during a roller coaster three weeks leading up to the scheduled musical performances. Lost school days due to inclement weather and icy and snowy driving conditions cut into the crucial last-minute days of mastering the acting, singing and dancing rehearsal and set production required for a massive 24-scene Broadway classic.

Plus, one of those snow events was during the very week of the scheduled and always-important dress rehearsal and the three days of evening performances and a Saturday matinee. Fortunately, only one performance had to be cancelled. Instead, that time was used for the dress rehearsal. The wait was well worth it, it turns out, as the school's Script and Cue student drama program thrilled audiences with memorable and stellar performances.

Mastering this living-learning experience was the collaboration, like the creation of a finely-tuned interdisciplinary independent study thesis project, of not just the actors, singers, and dancers on stage, but also the musicians on the Orchestra Pit. Plus, behind the scenes, there was another whole set of "crew" specialists, including set designers and artists for costume and make-up. Additional stage crew members hone the crafts of stage managing, prop coordination, lighting and sound technology, directing, and applied graphic arts support for media items such as programs, posters, and ancillary media press materials.

There are also related applied lessons for students to learn about the business of staging a musical, including budgeting, supplying and organizing refreshments, even coordinating an army of ushers to handle the orderly seating of hundreds of audience members.







'BIRD IN HAND' ABSTRACT SCULPTURES IN STRIP MALL PLAZA

If you're driving down Route 22 in Green Brook, New Jersey, you might notice a hand approximately 10 feet high waving at you. Don't worry, you're not seeing things. I drive by Arthur's Plaza Strip Mall in Green Brook a few times a week and started to notice this mysterious hand sometime late last year, so I decided to investigate. Past the Dollar Tree and Duck Donuts in the far end of the parking lot by Bone Fish Grill stands a large metal hand sculpture that has been weathered to an almost wood type appearance. A small trail of bird footprints are found on the metal base and a large red metal cardinal is perched on its pointer finger, like a cherry on an ice-cream sundae. After examining the piece, I found the artist's signature and date of creation written on its side in the metal: Dale Rogers 2017.

Dale Rogers is a metal sculptor from Massachusetts. According to his website: Dale is proud to have his sculptures displayed in private collections in 49 states, Puerto Rico, and Canada. In addition to these private acquisitions, he is actively expanding his reach into the public realm. He has always believed that art should be accessible to the public and should be an integral part of our everyday surroundings. "It is important to add art to the landscape of public venues. Art triggers the imagination of its observers, encourages them to view the world differently, and stimulates conversation. It adds an extra layer for the public to connect with at any park, office building, common area or trail," stated Dale on his site.

I found a sculpture similar to the one in Green Brook in his catalog of work under the name "Bird in Hand." The one in the catalog is just like the one in Green Brook except it has two cardinals, one on the pointer finger and another in the palm of the hand. Out of curiosity, I went back to see the "Bird in Hand" in Green Brook and checked for a hole where a second cardinal would be located, and there was in fact a hole. I also found a second version of "Bird in Hand" in his catalog that has two crows instead of


