


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'GUYS AND DOLLS' ANNUAL SPRING MUSICAL SUCCESS!

Annual spring musical, 'Guys and Dolls,' was a living-learning experience for a cast and crew of hundreds. Staging the annual spring musical at Watchung Hills Regional High Schools (WHRHS), which this year, 2018, was the iconic Broadway and Hollywood musical, "Guys and Dolls," was a livinglearning experience for hundreds of students, teachers, parents, community volunteers, and supporters.

And, as if simply staging a high quality high school musical isn't enough of a challenge every year, this year had the added challenge of performance dates during March 2018, when there were multiple snow events during a roller coaster three weeks leading up to the scheduled musical performances. Lost school days due to inclement weather and icy and snowy driving conditions cut into the crucial last-minute days of mastering the acting, singing and dancing rehearsal and set production required for a massive 24-scene Broadway classic.

Plus, one of those snow events was during the very week of the scheduled and always-important dress rehearsal and the three days of evening performances and a Saturday matinee. Fortunately, only one performance had to be cancelled. Instead, that time was used for the dress rehearsal. The wait was well worth it, it turns out, as the school's Script and Cue student drama program thrilled audiences with memorable and stellar performances.

Mastering this living-learning experience was the collaboration, like the creation of a finely-tuned interdisciplinary independent study thesis project, of not just the actors, singers, and dancers on stage, but also the musicians on the Orchestra Pit. Plus, behind the scenes, there was another whole set of "crew" specialists, including set designers and artists for costume and make-up. Additional stage crew members hone the crafts of stage managing, prop coordination, lighting and sound technology, directing, and applied graphic arts support for media items such as programs, posters, and ancillary media press materials.

There are also related applied lessons for students to learn about the business of staging a musical, including budgeting, supplying and organizing refreshments, even coordinating an army of ushers to handle the orderly seating of hundreds of audience members.

ST. VINCENT'S CHURCH RAISES MONEY FOR HAITI AT FISH & CHIPS FUNDRAISER

A recent Fish & Chips fundraiser for Haiti event hosted by St. Vincent's Church, 250 Bebout Avenue, Stirling, New Jersey, totaled monies of \$60,774.

An April 10, 2018 update from Fr. Richard:

"Our goal was to raise \$30,000 to place a water filtration system there so that for the first time in their history they will have access to water that is fit for human consumption. To date \$60,774 has been raised; \$58,043 from 104 individuals/families and \$1731 in cash donations placed in the water containers in the vestibule of the church. The water filtration system has been ordered. They are assembled as ordered and so within a few weeks it should be ready to be shipped to Haiti and then on to Nanpol for installation and use. This is an awesome, life

changing and wonderful gift to our sisters and brothers. Thank you to all who have contributed in this great act of love and care. We did it, praise Jesus!"

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

CRISIS HOTLINE SCREENS FILM TO RAISE SUICIDE AWARENESS

The crisis hotline Caring Contact will present a special screening of "Suicide: The Ripple Effect," the remarkable story of Kevin Hines, who at 19 attempted to take his life by jumping from the Golden Gate Bridge.

The screening will take place May 16, at 7:30 p.m.

AMC Loews at 1021 Route 22 East, Mountainside, New Jersey.

Following the screening, there will be a question and answer session and discussion on the topic, featuring some of the area's leading suicide prevention advocates. This discussion will be led by trained volunteers who are involved with Caring Contact.

Tickets are \$12, plus a processing fee, and can be purchased by visiting gathr.us/s/22327, where visitors can also view the film trailer and screening page. Tickets are limited so reservations are highly recommended.

With endorsements from some of the world's leading suicide prevention experts, "Suicide: The Ripple Effect" began worldwide screenings on March 13, 2018. Since surviving the jump, one of only 25 to live among the more than 1700 people who have jumped from the bridge, Hines has been on a mission to use his story to help others find recovery and stay alive. The film features some of the world's leading suicide prevention experts and shines light on people who are using their personal experiences with suicide to help others find the hope they need to stay alive.

"Kevin Hines' 'Suicide: The Ripple Effect' is a marvel of inspiration, a film that should be seen by anyone who has known despair and anyone who is or has been close to someone in a suicidal crisis," said Dr. John Draper of the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline.

Caring Contact is an award-winning, volunteer-staffed crisis hotline and listening community serving North and Central New Jersey, an area with 3 million inhabitants in Union, Essex, Middlesex, Morris and Somerset counties. More than 100 listeners attentively and compassionately serve those in emotional distress and educate communities about the power of personal connection. Caring Contact responded to more than 10,200 calls in 2017.


