#### 'GUYS AND DOLLS' ANNUAL SPRING MUSICAL SUCCESS!

Annual spring musical, 'Guys and Dolls,' was a living-learning experience for a cast and crew of hundreds. Staging the annual spring musical at Watchung Hills Regional High Schools (WHRHS), which this year, 2018, was the iconic Broadway and Hollywood musical, "Guys and Dolls," was a living-learning experience for hundreds of students, teachers, parents, community volunteers, and supporters.

And, as if simply staging a high quality high school musical isn't enough of a challenge every year, this year had the added challenge of performance dates during March 2018, when there were multiple snow events during a roller coaster three weeks leading up to the scheduled musical performances. Lost school days due to inclement weather and icy and snowy driving conditions cut into the crucial last-minute days of mastering the acting, singing and dancing rehearsal and set production required for a massive 24-scene Broadway classic.

Plus, one of those snow events was during the very week of the scheduled and always-important dress rehearsal and the three days of evening performances and a Saturday matinee. Fortunately, only one performance had to be cancelled. Instead, that time was used for the dress rehearsal. The wait was well worth it, it turns out, as the school's Script and Cue student drama program thrilled audiences with memorable and stellar performances.

Mastering this living-learning experience was the collaboration, like the creation of a finely-tuned interdisciplinary independent study thesis project, of not just the actors, singers, and dancers on stage, but also the musicians on the Orchestra Pit. Plus, behind the scenes, there was another whole set of "crew" specialists, including set designers and artists for costume and make-up. Additional stage crew members hone the crafts of stage managing, prop coordination, lighting and sound technology, directing, and applied graphic arts support for media items such as programs, posters, and ancillary media press materials.

There are also related applied lessons for students to learn about the business of staging a musical, including budgeting, supplying and organizing refreshments, even coordinating an army of ushers to handle the orderly seating of hundreds of audience members.

Classical pianist, Sophia Agranovich will perform on Saturday, May 19, 2018, at 8 p.m. There will be a dessert reception and an opportunity to meet the performer.

Her concert will be a Romantic and Modern Virtuoso program including works by Beethoven, Chopin, Liszt and Debussy; and pieces dedicated to Sophia by the contemporary French composer Françoise Choveaux. A Steinway Artist, Ms. Agranovich has performed in USA, Europe, Israel, and Canada. Among her venues are Lincoln Center, Carnegie Hall, Merkin Hall, Steinway Hall, and Bargemusic, Salle Cortot, and Ehrbarsaal. Ms. Agranovich has collaborated with prominent musicians and members of major orchestras. She is a First Prize winner of Ukrainian Young Artists and Bergen Philharmonic competitions, and a recipient of a Gold Medal and four Silver Medals from Global Music Awards, two Gold Medals from Prestige Music Awards, Best Classical Solo from Akademia Music Awards, Best Classical Piano Album from Clouzine International Music Awards, and Albert Nelson Marquis Lifetime Achievement Award. Her CD albums are broadcasted on major stations worldwide, most recently in Brazil, Canada and New York on WWFM and WQXR.

Ms. Agranovich holds Bachelor and Master Degrees from the Juilliard School where she had a full scholarship and Fellowship teaching Piano Minor at Juilliard, and continued Doctoral studies at Columbia University. Her professors at Juilliard were legendary Sascha Gorodnitzki and Nadia Reisenberg.

Sophia Agranovich is an esteemed pedagogue and adjudicator and is a recipient of numerous teaching awards. Her students are consistently winning top prizes in regional, national and international competitions. 

#### MAY IS FUND DRIVE MONTH FOR WATCHUNG RESCUE SQUAD

In 1950, the 100 percent volunteer Watchung Rescue Squad (WRS) started with 15 men as members. They responded to their first call on December 31, 1950 in a 1929 Buick they purchased for \$1 from the Borough of North Plainfield.

Today, Watchung Rescue Squad is still allvolunteer, but they are now 40 members strong, men and women, with two state-of-the-art ambulances and a First Responder Vehicle. Their members range in age from 16 to 90, and many of them are Watchung residents; neighbors helping neighbors. Whether it's an allergic reaction, cardiac emergency, accident-related injury, or other medical issue, WRS is on call seven nights a week, holidays, and weekends, high-quality providing service and compassionate care.

Members of the squad pride themselves on being professional, knowledgeable, and handson. The EMTs, drivers, and cadets, ages 16 to 18, are trained to quickly assess what needs to be done, and then do it without hesitation. This training, experience, and genuine caring for each

During the last major snowstorm, Life Member and past Captain Adam Wexler got out of the ambulance and walked in knee-deep snow up an exit ramp to Route 78 to reach a patient that had a medical emergency while stranded in his vehicle. During the month of January 2018, WRS EMT Emma Reedman performed CPR at Watchung Hills Regional High School, successfully saving the life of a fellow student who experienced sudden cardiac arrest while in class. These are only two examples of many where the squad's quick action and knowledgeable decision-making under pressure made all the difference.

WRS' members come from all backgrounds, and walks of life, but it is their passion for what they do and their sincere desire to help others that brings them together and makes it work. Former President Lysandra Plotkin says, "I initially joined the squad as a high schooler looking for community service hours, but the squad has become a part of my life. Being a member of the rescue squad gives you the opportunity to save lives, help out your neighbors, and to feel more like you're a part of the community. After the first time I saved a life, I felt a huge sense of fulfillment and accomplishment."

In our small Borough of Watchung, it hardly seems possible that the Squad responded to 316 calls last year, but they did. Residents Angel Quiros and Denise Wilson were last month's top responders to calls, with 62 and 61 calls, respectively, under their belts as of the end of March. While most calls occur in Watchung's residences, stores, and other businesses, and on the highways that run through the Borough, WRS

professionalism and confidence comes from also lends a hand to neighboring towns whenever the need arises.

> All Watchung Rescue Squad's members are certified in Healthcare Provider CPR. Those that successfully complete the course to become statecertified Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs) put in over 200 hours of classroom training, which is in addition to any member's day job, school schedule, family time, and other responsibilities. Monthly in-house training drills, membership meetings, and seminars and workshops offered by neighboring squads and local hospitals are all in a day's work for WRS members.

> Past President, Life Member, and Watchung resident Don Monetti notes that the great relationship that WRS has with the Police Department, Fire Department, Department of Public Works (DPW), the Borough Council, Mayor, and employees are what helps keep everything running smoothly even when the going gets tough.

> Watchung Rescue Squad always responds freeof-charge, but donations are needed to purchase and maintain ambulances; buy medical supplies and equipment; provide training, protective clothing, and uniforms for volunteers; and, last, but not least, maintain their building on Watchung Circle at 10 Stirling Road. The majority of their income is derived from Watchung residents' donations. They are fully tax-deductible and greatly appreciated, in any amount. #### WHO'S AFRAID OF THE BIG BAD WOLF? CUB SCOUTS PACK 32 AREN'T!

Two wolves visited the Cub Scouts of Watchung. The wolves came from Howling Woods Farms, Jackson, New Jersey. Pack 32 raised money from popcorn sales in 2017 and donated the funds to the wolf rescue.

The BEAR scouts began the evening at the Watchung Exempt Fireman's Hall with the Scouts' opening flag ceremony. Megan Quinn, HWF animal trainer and tour guide, and Michael Hodanish, president, and founder of Howling Woods Farm, brought Samson and Kotori, two hybrid wolves that live in the wolfdog rescue. The leaders began with a special presentation about the wolves. The Scouts learned that wolves are not dangerous; humans have more chance of being hit on the head by a coconut than being attacked by a wolf. Real wolves avoid people, are can travel 50 miles or more per day looking for food. Wolves once lived in all 50 states of U.S. and were exterminated primarily by ranchers, farmers and early settlers who feared the animals. They now exist in abundance in Alaska and Minnesota and following reintroduction, wolves now also live in Arizona, Idaho, Michigan, Montana, New Mexico, Wisconsin, and Wyoming. Wolves are federally protected by the Endangered Species Act.

During the evening the Cub Scouts were able to meet Samson and Kotori, who appeared in the November issue of Vogue with Daisy Ridley (Rey from "Star Wars"). Samson is a 13-year old mix of wolf and Alaskan malamute. He is 110 pounds and in 2010 he appeared in a Disney movie, "Sorcerer's Apprentice." Kotori is an 8-

extremely shy and not confrontational. Wolves year old white wolf-German Shepherd mix and is 90 pounds. Kotori's name means "screech owl spirit" in Hopi. Both wolves love company and that was demonstrated by their behavior whilst the cub scouts were close to them.






