CHATHAM EMT, WILL CAREY, EARNS HIS INFANTRY BLUE CORD WITH NATIONAL GUARD

The Chatham Emergency Squad sends many congratulations to Will Carey. Carey is a Chatham resident who recently completed his basic training/boot camp and earned his infantry blue cord with the National Guard. The Squad is excited to welcome him back home to Chatham.

This accomplishment is something Carey aspired to since a young age; he was inspired by his dad who was a firefighter. "I don't know how to feel outside of happy," he said. "I'm happy with the path I chose and happy to be a member of that fraternity."

Carey grew up being a Boy Scout. He enjoys outdoor activities such as hiking and also water sports such as rafting. He grew up in Chatham, went to Chatham High, and to Colorado Mountain College, Leadville, Colorado. He joined the Chatham Emergency Squad in 2014.

Joe Korkuch, Captain of the Chatham Emergency Squad is very proud of Will's accomplishment in earning his blue cord with the National Guard. "Since joining the Chatham Emergency Squad, Will has made his mark as a strong and reliable EMT, and we're lucky to have him," Korkcuch said, adding, "We're very fortunate to have a strong membership base filled with many volunteers who provide great service to the Chatham community."

The Chatham Emergency Squad was created in 1936 by action of the Chatham Borough Council. Since then, as the Borough and Township have grown, so have the responsibilities of the Squad. The number of emergency calls handled annually has grown from 22 in 1950 to about 1100 in recent years.

The Squad always welcomes inquiries from potential volunteers to fill openings on their team. They are most eager for volunteers who can serve on daytime shifts on weekdays or nighttime shifts on weekends. If you are at least 18-years-old and not enrolled in high school, you can volunteer to be a full-fledged member. If you are at least 16-years-old and enrolled in high school, you can volunteer for their cadet program.

All new members are enrolled in an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) course taught by professionals in emergency medicine. Tuition is fully paid by the Squad. On successful completion of the course, a member is certified as an EMT by the State of New Jersey.

There are also fringe benefits which include discounts, accident disability insurance, education assistance, special license plates, and jury duty exemption.

CHATHAM POLICE OFFICER RESCUES ORPHANED SQUIRRELS

A homeowner on Green Village Road in Chatham, New Jersey recently dispatched a call about an orphaned baby squirrel in a tree and another on the ground near a tree. Officer Brian McGrath was first on the scene and one of the squirrels ran directly to him. He picked it up and fed it milk with a baby bottle provided by the homeowner. An associate of McGrath captured the other baby squirrel. Both squirrels were taken to a local vet that deals with wildlife animals.

"They are in a good place," said Sargeant Scott Herchick. "It was fate that the squirrel knew something was wrong and went to a human. It's hard to tell how old, they were younger squirrels. Orphaned squirrels."

Approximately 50 resident birds are on exhibit in large outdoor aviaries viewed by walking along the trails. Living on the campus of the Trust throughout the year is variety of raptors and birds of prey. Currently, the Trust is home to two Bald Eagles, Turkey Vultures, Barred Owls, Great Horned Owls, Ravens, Screech Owls, Red-Tailed Hawks, a Snowy Owl and many more!

Aviaries are open to the public 7 days of week.

Our visiting hours during the fall, winter and spring are 9:00 am to 4:00 pm.

During the summer we are open to visitors from 9:00 am to 7:00 pm.

There is no cost to come by for a self-guided tour, however, we ask you to consider a small donation of \$2 per person.

The Raptor Trust is a 501(c)(3) not for profit organization which provides free medical care to thousands of orphaned or injured birds each year. Our infirmary staff is available seven days a week during daylight hours to admit injured birds, but we must rely on the people who find them to bring them to us for care. RAPTOR TRUST'S ANNUAL COMMUNITY DAY

The Raptor Trust, of Millington, New Jersey, recently held their Third Annual Community Day at Stirling Hotel, Stirling, New Jersey. The day was filled with fun and festivities, including live music from Ross Griswold and the Second Line, with special guests the Raccoon Ridge Ramblers. Booths from community partners and local environmental organizations were featured. There was also family games and activities, a tricky tray, a silent auction, and a 50/50 raffle. Food and drinks were provided by The Stirling Hotel. Proceeds from the event benefit The Raptor Trust.

Community partners included: Somerset County Parks Environmental Education Center; Friends of the Great Swamp, Woodlands Wildlife Refuge, Morris County Parks Great Swamp Outdoor Education Center, Delaware Valley Eagle Alliance, and Conserve Wildlife Foundation of NJ.

Educator Kate Matta was showing birds like Penny, a 9-year-old blind Eastern Screech Owl and Zizi, a female American Kestrel. Zizi was found in New York City as a baby. The people who found her fed her baby food, which was a mistake.

"They eat mice and insects," said Matta. "So, she was not getting proper nutrition. Her growth is stunted." However, since Zizi was raised around humans, she is totally unafraid of people according to Matta. She added, "Zizi doesn't know how to hunt. She's a 'people bird.' She's done this event before. She had no problem with people looking at her and taking pictures."

Melissa Anahory, a licensed wildlife rehabilitator at Woodlands Wildlife, was teaching children about Tan, an Eastern Box Turtle. "He likes people," she said. "He doesn't hide. He's used to people." She continued to explain to the kids that a turtle has the shell to hide in.

The Raptor Trust was named and established as a non-profit corporation in the state of New Jersey in 1982.

The City of Summit is sharing information on NJ Transit schedule adjustments during the installation of federally-mandated, positive train control safety equipment on all NJ Transit passenger trains.

Beginning on Monday, June 4 and continuing through December 31, 2018, NJ Transit will adjust weekday service schedules on four Morris & Essex trains.

"I am very pleased that NJ Transit has spread service disruptions throughout its entire system and is not only impacting the Morris & Essex line, as was done during the Amtrak repairs last summer," explains Summit Mayor Nora Radest. "Not only is the installation of positive train control equipment federally mandated, it is a matter of safety. Avoiding another tragedy like the Hoboken train crash is a priority for us all."


Service on inbound train #608 departing at 5:45 a.m. from Dover will be eliminated from Dover to Chatham. The train will not originate in

Summit. Service on inbound train #626 departing at 8:28 a.m. from Dover will be eliminated from Dover to Morris Plains. The train will now originate in Morristown.

Service on outbound train #608 departing at 6:42 a.m. from Hoboken to Dover is temporarily discontinued. Service on outbound train #645 departing at 5:08 p.m. from Hoboken to Dover is temporarily discontinued as well.

Radest continues, "Along with other mayors on the Morris & Essex line, I have met with NJ Transit to express how critical it is for Summit and other towns near transit hubs to be able to rely on consistent, timely and safe train and bus transportation. I am encouraged by the improved flow of communication and NJ Transit's response to our concerns."
