WHAT, WHERE, AND WHEN IN OLD KENILWORTH: THE SHALLCROSS HOUSE

The Shallcross House, oldest building still standing in Kenilworth, New Jersey, dates to the 1700s. Sometimes referred to as the Sayre-Shallcross House it is located out on Springfield Road adjacent to Shallcross Pond in Black Brook Park. The dwelling was extensively remodeled by new owners after sold by the Shallcross family in 1993. The building still retains its general, historic outlines.

Daniel Sayre, early owner and a Revolutionary War soldier, used the pond waters for his tanning business. The family of John Shallcross (b. 1850) acquired the estate soon after it arrived here in 1898 when that part of Kenilworth was in a section of Union which along with a section of Cranford made up New Orange. New Orange became the Borough of Kenilworth in 1907.

Research by the Friends of Black Brook Park, under the leadership of local resident Dorothea Krihak, suggests that the old farm house played a role in the Battle of Connecticut Farms and Springfield in June 1780 when the British attempted to march through this area in an effort to capture General George Washington and his troops in Morristown. The British plan collapsed due to strong resistance from local patriots.

Shallcross men were contractors and numbers were employed on the old Rahway Valley Railroad in various roles. Prior to WWI Shallcross Express Co. was born and other family members also entered the transportation business. In the1930s and 1940s Charles Shallcross built and flew planes from the Shallcross property, much of which was donated by Joseph Shallcross to help form Black Brook Park. The family helped establish the Methodist Church and was active in public education and local politics. The Shallcross family was known for its generous acts of philanthropy to many local causes. Shallcross descendants reside in Kenilworth today.

ALPACA FROM HIGHLAND AIRS RANCH VISITS LIBRARY

Victoria recently paid a visit to the Kenilworth Library. Victoria is a 10-month-old alpaca, residing at Highland Airs Alpaca Ranch in Hackettstown, New Jersey, owned by Joy & Colin Scott.

Colin Scott talked about alpacas to an audience of roughly 80 adults and children, followed by a Q&A segment. He shared that alpacas can be very loving, that they come from the Andes (and can survive in below freezing temperatures because of their coat) and are sheared once a year to be comfortable during the heat and humidity in New Jersey summers.

Alpacas have top quality fiber which is hypoallergenic. They eat pastured grass, hay, and grains. They are related to llamas, but llamas are more aggressive. They have no teeth on their upper palate.

Alpacas can weigh anywhere between 125 to 180 pounds. Their average height is between 32 and 39 inches at the shoulder.

After the talk, Joy Colin led Victoria outside of the library so that children could pet her and take photos. Victoria was a hit with everyone there!




