Four scholarships, totaling \$3,250, were awarded to Linden High School seniors Ayanna Brant, Tomaz Dulian, Destiny Parker, and Kevin Reyes.

The Linden New Business of the Year Award was given to Blue Apron. The company's mission is to make incredible home cooking assessible to everyone. Linden Mayor Derek Armstead stated "Thank you for coming to our town and hiring 1,500 employees, many of them from Linden. Thank you for helping our local economy."

The Business of the Year Award was given to The Linwood Tap House. Located on the corner of Linden and Wood Avenues, the Linwood, built sometime before 1882, has been a staple in Linden since the 19th century, a family sports bar and restaurant, it boasts having 35 beers on tap. In 2006, the Munchmobile deemed the Linwood had the "Best Hamburger in NJ." Today, along with their extensive menu which changes frequently, the Linwood is also known for their great pizza.

Mayor Armstead stated "I've been going to the Linwood since I was a teenager, (owners) Lori and John Neshinka are very generous to the community. They donate the food for Linden High School's Project Graduation every year."

The Person of the Year award was presented to Ingrid Andrade, a Columbia Bank branch manager. The Linden Chamber of Commerce noted how Ingrid is a very active volunteer in the chamber. Ingrid's motto is "Live, Love and Laugh" by living life to the fullest, loving every chance she gets, and laughing at least once a day while encouraging all to do the same and making the world a better place.



LINDEN'S DORIS JOHNSON TO ADVOCATE FOR FOSTER YOUTH JUDGE ADMINISTERS OATH TO NINE NEW CASA VOLUNTEERS

Doris Johnson of Linden is among the latest class of community volunteers to complete child advocacy training and take their oath from Superior Court Judge James Hely to become Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of Union County. After being sworn in, Johnson said, "I'm so looking forward to getting to help change the lives of our babies, one case at a time."

Volunteers with CASA serve as extra eyes and ears for family law judges hearing cases involving the county's abused, neglected or abandoned children removed from home and placed in foster care. They have court-ordered access to all parties in a foster child's life, including foster parents, doctors, caseworkers, therapists and teachers, and incorporate findings into court reports from these contacts as well as time spent with the youth. In addition to ensuring their needs are met and best interests protected, the CASA volunteers aim to become

> The new advocates are ages 28 to 72 and include parents and non-parents; professionals in business, technology, education and law enforcement; students; retirees; and homemakers. Most had no prior knowledge of the foster system. Each will soon receive their case and meet the foster youth for whom they will advocate.

> It is CASA of Union County's goal that every Union County foster child have an advocate, yet half of the more than 500 such youth still await one. Could you be their voice? The next training begins July 11 and two additional trainings are slated for the fall.







A League of Their Own (PG; 128 mins)

July 3 at 2:00 p.m.

Directed by Penny Marshall, this 1992 film tells the story of The All-American Professional Girls Baseball League. Beginning in 1943, this league was based in midwestern cities like Racine, Wisconsin and Rockford, Illinois whose cities' minor league men's ball teams had sent most of their players off to the military during the war. Owners tried girls' baseball in its place and the league lasted until 1954. The movie features comedy stars Geena Davis and Tom Hanks as well as Madonna, Rosie O'Donnell, Lori Petty, Jon Lovitz, David Strathairn and Garry Marshall.

Murder on the Orient Express (PG-13; 114 min)

July 16 at 6:00 p.m. This 2017 remake of the Oscar-winning film features a virtual Who's Who of international film stars in this Agatha Christie mystery. Directed by five-time Oscar nominee Kenneth Branagh, this movie takes us onto the classic train to Istanbul as a murder occurs onboard. 

YOUTH MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID TRAINING **BEING OFFERED JULY 17TH AND 24TH**

Caring Contact, a crisis hotline that serves Northern and Central New Jersey, will be offering Youth Mental Health First Aid Training in Westfield on July 17th and 24th, 2018. Youth Mental Health First Aid is designed to teach parents, family members, caregivers, teachers, school staff, peers, neighbors, health and human service workers, and other caring citizens how to help an adolescent (age 12-18) who is experiencing a mental health or addiction issue or is in crisis.

Youth Mental Health First Aid is primarily designed for adults who regularly interact with young people. The course introduces common mental health challenges for youth, reviews typical adolescent development, and teaches a 5step action plan for how to help young people in both crisis and non-crisis situations. Topics covered include anxiety, depression, substance use, disorders in which psychosis may occur, disruptive behavior disorders (including class education to the Central and Northern New AD/HD), and eating disorders.

The eight-hour course is being offered in two four-hour sessions, on July 17th and 24th from 6:00 pm to 10 pm at the Westfield Presbyterian Church, located at 140 Mountain Ave, Westfield, NJ. Youth Mental Health First Aid is listed on the National Suicide Prevention Registry of Evidence-Based Programs. Successful completion of the course includes a three-year Youth Mental Health First Aid certification.

If a bear comes into your yard or you see one while camping, do not be afraid, but remember bears are not tame animals, they are wild creatures.


Here are some tips that you should follow if you see a bear: ...

- Do not get scared and do not run.
- Talk to the bear to let it know you are there.
- Never feed the bear!
- Do not go near the black bear.
- Do not look directly into the bear's eyes.
- Make sure the bear can get out of your yard or campground easily if it wants to. Don't stand in front of the escape route!
- Make lots of noise. It could scare the bear away.
- If you are playing with friends, get in a big group. Talk and wave your arms. You will look really big and the bear might leave.
- Bears can make a lot of noise, so they may huff, snap their jaws and slap the ground if they think you are too close. Back away slowly.

A bear that stands on its back legs is not about to attack you. It just wants to see and smell you better. Let a bear know you are there by waving your arms and talking to it.

Bears may pretend to attack by running at you. DO NOT RUN!

Back away slowly and get to a safe area. Black bears rarely hurt people. If a black bear attacks, fight back!
