## 407 PARTICIPANT IN RELAY FOR LIFE ON JUNE 2ND 2018

53 teams and 407 people participated in the American Cancer Society Relay For Life of Berkeley Heights event on Saturday, June 2nd, 2018 at Governor Livingston High School. The effort also included participation from the towns of Mountainside, New Providence, and Summit.

Over \$130,000 was raised to support the American Cancer Society's mission of saving lives from cancer. Funds raised help the American Cancer Society provide free information and support for people facing the disease today, and fund cancer research that will help protect future generations.

"It was inspirational to see people from all parts of our community come out to support us and help save lives from cancer," said Patti Broccoli. "Together, we celebrated those surviving cancer, remembered loved ones lost, and took tangible action to make a difference."

The following top 3 teams were recognized for their extraordinary efforts:

The Harwood Gang – raising \$15,390; The Pearly Girls -raising \$14,195; and NP (New Providence) Peer Leaders Green Team – raising \$8,165.

Founded by Dr. Gordy Klatt in Washington in 1985, the Relay For Life movement is the world's largest fundraising event to save lives from cancer. Uniting communities across the globe, we celebrate people who have battled cancer, remember loved ones lost, and take action for lifesaving change. During Relay For Life events, members of each team take turns walking or running around the track or path. Teams participate in fundraising in the months leading up to the event.

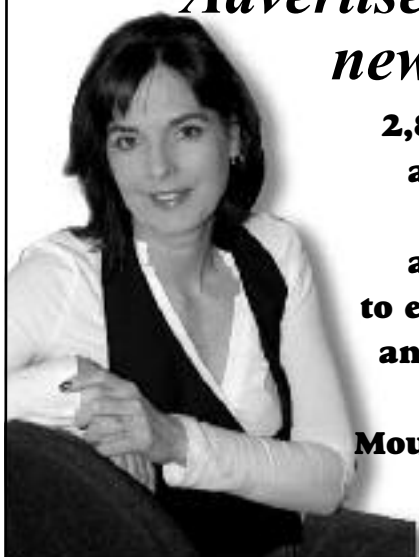

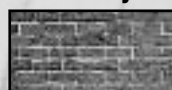

The annual celebratory ceremony at Lile Hall of Christ Church in Summit began with two speakers who were helped toward their Ph.D.'s by AAUW fellowships: Lois Rockson, a scientist working in public health, and Tamara Issak, who studies language and discrimination. Also on hand was Meryl Schaffer, a 2017 SCC scholarship recipient, who spoke on some of the surprises of her college freshman year.

Then it was on to the business of the day, this year's exceedingly impressive award winners:

- From Summit High School, Victoria Harvey, who was awarded the Tilla Thomas Merit Scholarship. Victoria will attend the University of Virginia next year.
- From Millburn High School, Summer Bushman, who won the Kathi C. Madison M.D. Scholarship. Summer plans to attend Emory University next year.
- From Governor Livingston High School, Sarah Lalevee, who was awarded the Mary K. Tennant Scholarship. Sarah will attend Georgetown University next year.
- From Summit High School, Emily Kostolansky, who won a Summit College Club Merit Scholarship. Emily will be a student at Tufts University next fall.
- From Chatham High School, Emily Boyland, who was awarded a Summit College Club

Foundation Scholarship. Emily will attend Villanova University next year.

All five young women had outstanding grades, demonstrated leadership abilities, and many sports, service, and social activities to their credit. The SCC Scholarship Committee introduced each girl with enthusiasm, outlining her many accomplishments as she was presented with her scholarship check, certificate, and flowers.

The program concluded with a cornucopia of refreshments and informal conversations between the happy recipients, proud parents, and satisfied SCC members.

Funding for the scholarships comes from the massive, week-long annual used book sale held by SCC each spring. Marilynn MacLean, a Scholarship Committee member, noted that the organization ran its first book sale in 1935! Since then, the club has awarded hundreds of thousands of dollars to worthy young women in the area.

## GIRL SCOUT OFFERS 'FREE SUMMER MUSIC PROGRAM' FOR MOUNTAINSIDE MIDDLE SCHOOLERS TO EARN HER GOLD AWARD

Allie Zimmermann, a 16-year-old sophomore at Governor Livingston High School in Berkeley Heights, New Jersey and a Senior Girl scout with Troop 40389 in Mountainside where she resides, is running a free summer music program for middle school students from Mountainside, New Jersey to earn her Girl Scout Gold Award. The Gold Award is the highest award in Girl Scouts and equivalent to the Boy Scout Eagle Award. Zimmermann is a member of the Governor Livingston High School's marching, jazz, and concert bands, playing both the saxophone and bagpipes.

"According to a University of Miami School of Music middle/junior high school band directors' report, students drop out of instrumental music in high school for fear of failure and because of the costs. I am providing a free program where Mountainside, New Jersey musicians entering the fifth through ninth grades in the Fall of 2018 can bring their instruments and work with other students, as well as volunteer musicians from Governor Livingston High School's music programs, on any type of music they choose.

While students can "drop-in" with their instruments, they can also sign-up in advance to reserve a spot with a student musician who plays the same instrument. The program is currently

running Monday through Thursday, 3 p.m. to 5 p.m., July 9th to 12th and July 23rd to 26th at the Mountainside Rescue Squad facility, located at 1399 US Highway 22 East, Mountainside, New Jersey," Zimmermann explained.

Noting that the summer sessions are planned to be fun for the middle school students, as well as offering a valuable opportunity to learn from fellow musicians not too much older than they are, Zimmermann noted that the younger musicians will gain confidence and be more likely to continue with their music in playing in the years ahead.

Zimmermann has been working closely with the Deerfield Middle School Band Director Tom Wise, who encourages his students to participate and continue playing their instruments over the summer months. The middle school musicians will also be invited to attend a summer band camp performance by the Governor Livingston High School marching band in Berkeley Heights, New Jersey. This will allow them to see their summer volunteers hard at work and understand what a marching band field show is and how it develops.

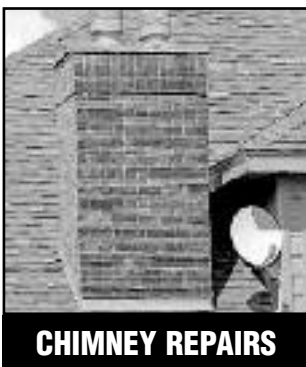

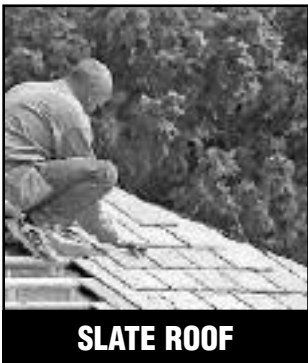

## IMAGINE SEEKS VOLUNTEERS

Imagine, A Center for Coping with Loss seeks individuals for our July 27-30th, 2018 volunteer facilitator training session.

Imagine peer support groups are the main source of support for grieving children and families in Union County and beyond. Groups are facilitated by trained adult volunteers who attend a 32-hour training and quarterly continuing education programs. Volunteers come from all walks of life and need no special background other than a willingness to listen and the ability to be with children and adults in pain without trying to fix, solve problems, or give advice. No prior experience is necessary. Volunteers must be 21 years or older. Volunteers serve as companions and loving listeners for those who are grieving.

"As our programs continue to grow, so does our need for additional, highly trained facilitators," said Mandi Zucker, Imagine Program Director. "There is a great need for grief support in our community -- over 700 children annually will lose a parent to death in Union County. Over 260 children and adults from almost 50 NJ towns are currently participating in our programs every two weeks at Imagine." Volunteers say the training is "life-changing" and a wonderful opportunity for learning about themselves and how their own losses have affected the way they grieve and how they support others. People that complete the training also leave feeling empowered to be a supportive person to people grieving any type of loss.

Imagine is a free year-round peer grief support center located in Mountainside, New Jersey serving children age 3-18 who have had a parent or sibling die, with concurrent support groups for their parents or guardians. Support for children and teens living with a parent or sibling with a life-altering physical illness is also available. Free year-round support groups are also available for young adults who have had a friend, sibling, parent or other important person in their life die, or who have a parent, sibling or friend living with an illness.
