### **COLEUS**

Many of us have early childhood memories of coleus (KO-le-us) as the purple houseplant on our grandparent's windowsill. Today they are most commonly used as an annual in the shade garden or as potted plants.

Coleus are members of a large family with 150 species, but only two are sufficiently ornamental to be used by today's American gardeners.

In their native environments of India, tropical Asia and Java coleus grow to be a shrub like perennial with soft leaves.

The most popular species is 'Common Coleus' (C. blumei) native to the island of Java in Indonesia. This coleus has vibrant colored or variegated leaves of green, yellow, crimson, mauve or pink. This is the likely parent of most of the coleus we plant today.

The second is 'Spanish-thyme Coleus' of the topics, an aromatic herb that is sometimes grown as a houseplant.

Coleus can easily be propagated by rooting 6" stem cuttings in water, which results in an identical plant to its parent. This is an excellent project for gardening with children.

Seeds planted indoors in early spring will produce many variations of color and leaf patterns.

In the garden coleus require light shade to part sun. Indoors they need bright light at all times including a few hours of direct sun every day. Insufficient light will produce weak spindly growth. They are perfect for folks looking to add a splash of color in shady spots.

Being from the tropics where there is daily rainfall, coleus require moist soil. When dried out the leaves wilt quickly. Although the plant seems to bounce back when watered, the lower leaves will drop off giving the plant an unpleasant leggy appearance.

When growing in flower pots use 'soil' based potting mix rather than 'soil-less' mixes and give the roots plenty of room to grow. These plants do not like to be root bound and benefit by being repotted when they grow too big for their pot, even during the heat of summer.

During the growing season feed every two weeks with a standard liquid fertilizer.

Mature coleus develop spikes of blue flowers. To keep your coleus robust pinch off these flowers stems as often as possible. The energy

the plant uses creating seeds will deplete its vigor and life span. It is important to also pinch back the leafy tips of the coleus to maintain its bushy appearance.

Despite coleus' popularly as a house plants they lose vigor indoors. To over-winter coleus take a stem cutting in late summer and root it in water. With so many easier houseplants now available on the market most gardens treat them as annuals and buy new plants the following spring.

For the largest variety of leaf and color choice visit and support your local garden centers. The staff is better trained to keep plants healthy and vigorous.

### ST. GEORGES AVENUE – TWO MILES OF HISTORY

Rahway's oldest north/south thoroughfare, St. Georges Avenue, is indeed a historic road. Important, even as far back as the days when Native Americans inhabited the area, it has been a witness to much of Rahway's history and has always been a link in the development of transportation systems in our country. Before and during the American Revolution it was a part of the road that connected New York City to Philadelphia. In 1913, it became a piece of the newly created Lincoln Highway, the first graveled transcontinental highway to stretch across the United States.

One is usually surprised to learn that St. Georges Avenue is a section of the Lincoln Highway, a road affectionately known as "The Main Street Across America." Formally dedicated on October 31, 1913, it runs from Times Square in New York City to Lincoln Park in San Francisco covering a distance of over 3,000 miles. The highway crosses the states of New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, Iowa, Nebraska, Colorado, Wyoming, Utah, Nevada, and California. Over certain times in its 105- year history, with some changes in its configuration, the highway passed through 14 states, 128 counties, and more than 700 cities.

This important and historic road, which bisects Rahway, was originally part of an ancient Indian trail. Native Americans who migrated from the Watchung Mountains to the coast during the summer seasons followed a path that is today Westfield Avenue to what is now St. Georges Avenue. Upon reaching this trail, the

Indians could make their way to the river to navigate to the Arthur Kill or travel south to the more southern regions. Over the years, artifacts left by these early visitors have been found in several spots along the river banks.

As our country grew, New York City and Philadelphia became major cities. The main route connecting the two was St. Georges Avenue (at that time called the King's Highway), which gave the road strategic importance during the Revolutionary War. Life along the road was dangerous in those days and it was the site of numerous skirmishes and battles between colonial forces and British redcoats. The Battle of Spanktown was fought at the river crossing near the entrance of what is today the Rahway County Park.

Rahway's first church, established in 1741, was located on St. Georges Avenue and the community's earliest graveyard was established next to the church. Abraham Clark, a signer of the Declaration of Independence, is buried in the historic cemetery. In 1786, the first state mint was built on St. Georges near the branch of the river that flows parallel to River Road. The coins minted there were the first to be stamped with the words "E Pluribus Unum." George Washington travelled the road on his inaugural journey from Mount Vernon, Virginia to New York City and came through Rahway on April 23, 1789.

By the early 1800s, the road was a busy stagecoach route and a number of hotels, including the Merchants and Drovers and the Terrill Tavern, were built on its roadside to

accommodate weary travelers. In the mid-1800s, the "grand" avenue became the preferred location for prominent families when choosing a site to build their stately mansions. Many handsome estates dotted the highway between Linden Avenue and Central Avenue. Rahway's first high school was built overlooking the avenue in 1873.

By the 1930s, those living in cities north of Rahway found St. Georges Avenue to be the best route to take when planning a day trip or a weekend excursion to the Jersey shore as it was a natural link to Route 35. With so much traffic on the road, it was only natural that businesses would be established on the highway. For almost seventy years (1930-2000), almost every major automobile company had a dealership on St. Georges.

Although the character of St. Georges Avenue has changed many times over its long history, today, the two-mile stretch is still a major artery with an estimated 25,000 cars traveling the road each day.

Author's note: The annual convention of the Lincoln Highway Association, a group dedicated to promoting and preserving the road, will be held in New Jersey from June 20-24. On Friday, June 22 members of the association will visit the Merchants and Drovers Museum and the Rahway Cemetery for tours of both historic sites. The Association, which has a membership of over 800 members, meets annually in one of the states through which the Lincoln Highways passes. The 2017 national convention was held in Denison, Iowa.





Summa Cum Laude from Rider University with a 3.9 GPA. She is currently pursuing her Master's in Advertising at Syracuse University. Other judges include Girls; Live, Love, Laugh, Inc. Legal Aid Advisor and CEO of Groundwork Agency Tish Johnson, of Newark, and lead singer of T.J. & Company Band, Jaleesa Koonce, of Linden, NJ.

Kamouri Terrell, 18, of Newark, an alumna of Girls; Live, Love, Laugh, Inc., was recognized for her outstanding achievements and her commitment to academic success. "Girls; Live, Love, Laugh, Inc. had a positive impact on my life. It introduced me to things young girls living in the inner city usually don't experience at a young age. I will always take the etiquette I learned with me everywhere I go," said Terrell. Terrell is a senior at Newark Collegiate Academy where she belongs to the National Honor Society and is a member of the varsity girls' basketball team. Terrell has been accepted to seven universities, which include Spelman College, Clark Atlanta University, Lycoming University, Tuskegee University, Rider University, Dillard University, and William Patterson University. In the fall, she will be attending Lycoming University in Williamsport, Pa., which awarded her the Dean Scholarship for \$22K and an academic scholarship of \$20K equating to a full ride to the university. 





Not new to the world of cosmetology, Vanessa has been practicing esthetics since the age of 7, applying make-up for friends and family and experimenting on herself. She has been hired to


do make-up for weddings, proms, bridal showers, and baby showers. Vanessa is especially excited to be doing make-up for some of the RHS students attending this year's prom!

## **AUDITIONS FOR CDC THEATRE'S HISPANIC THEATRE FESTIVAL**

Spanish-language theatre is alive and well in New Jersey. For the second straight year, the CDC Theatre will feature its Hispanic Theatre Festival (or, as it prefers to be known, its Festival de Teatro Hispanico) for four performances July 26 to 28, 2018.

Despite a large and vibrant Hispanic population of 1.2 million in the state, the creators of this event recognized that there are no Spanishlanguage plays being performed on an ongoing basis that cater to that community in central New Jersey. As far as the Theatre world is concerned, the beauty of the language and the richness of the Hispanic heritage is simply being ignored. Families that want to attend live theatre, do so exclusively in English. Children grow up never hearing Spanish on the stage.

Last summer, the CDC Theatre, the longest continuously-running Community theatre in New Jersey, bridged that gap by mounting the premiere Hispanic Theatre Festival. It featured two one-act plays: "Ana y las langostas (Ana and the Locusts)" by Argentine playwright Alicia Dolinsky and "Bony y Kin (Bony & Kim)" by Puerto Rican Carlos Canales. The casts were filled with local Spanish-speaking actors from Plainfield, Cranford, Union, Edison, and Linden, as well as more distant communities such as Jersey City, Perth Amboy and Fords. They represented various places of national heritage from Mexico, Cuba, Peru, Puerto Rico and Honduras.

The play being showcased this season is "Bar Manolo," a full-length comedy by European playwright Jean-Pierre Martinez. The story unfolds in a friendly, comfortable bar that happens to be across from a cemetery, and the bar owner, Manolo, relies on a steady stream of customers looking for a little respite from the activities across the street. This particular afternoon features the interplay of two

philosophical funeral workers, a professor who may or may not be having an affair with one of his students, a flooded basement, a damaged coffin, a misplaced cell phone, a lost lottery ticket, a waitress frustrated with her bad luck with online dating, a befuddled old lady and a host of other characters, all of whom Manolo greets with a friendly smile and an offer of watered-down cognac.

Auditions for the nine adult roles will be held at the CDC Theatre, 78 Winans Avenue, Cranford from 8 to 10 p.m. on Sunday, June 10, and Monday, June 11. The production is looking for men and women of various ages. Spanish fluency is not necessary, but comfort in the language is a must. Bar Manolo will be directed by Joel Redmount of Scotch Plains, who founded and continues to produce the Hispanic Theatre Festival.

Performances will take place at the CDC Theatre on Thursday July 26, Friday July 27 and Saturday July 28, all at 8 p.m., with a matinee performance on Saturday July 28 at 2 p.m. Knowing it wouldn't truly be a Festival without appropriate music and food, the Producers of the event are looking to provide complementary refreshments on Opening Night, in the spirit of the evening.

And while the CDC Theatre is looking to tap into the underserved Spanish-speaking audience throughout our geographic region, they extend an invitation also to those non-Spanish speakers who may be intrigued by the multicultural nature of this Theatre Festival. The CDC looks forward to exploring the richness of la cultura Latina, as reflected in plays that mirror the pride, the drama and comedy of the human experience, as showcased through a Spanish language lens.

Tickets will be available for purchase in July through the website cdctheatre.org or available at the box office prior to each performance. Further information will also be provided on the website.


