
Bags can be purchased for \$3 each, or \$5 for two bags; cash only. Any profits from the project will benefit the Summit Green Team, a group of







LOIS BHATT ANDBETHANY TULLOCH RETIRES FROM BRIDGES OUTREACH



It is with mixed emotions and eternal gratitude for her service that we announce the retirement of Lois Bhatt, our Executive Director since January 2004. Lois has led Bridges' outreach program for the homeless for the last fourteen plus years. She has had ultimate responsibility for the oversight of the 2600 volunteers every year that help Bridges to deliver food, clothing and necessities to people living on the street in New York City, Newark, Irvington, and Summit, New Jersey. In one of the crowning achievements during her tenure, Lois organized the Coalition of Services in Newark, a mobile team of services providers, to provide ancillary services to our street friends, including medical testing, physical and mental health services, benefits enrollment, and housing information. The success of that coalition led Bridges in March 2014, again under Lois' direction, to open a home base in Newark known as Project Connect, whose dedicated staff provides case management services to people experiencing homelessness and links them to social and health services.

As Executive Director, Lois has worn many hats, including fundraiser, grant writer, event planner, program developer, and overall CEO and COO of everything Bridges, all with gentleness and grace. She retired on May 31, 2018.

We likewise regretfully announce the retirement of our Deputy Executive Director, Bethany Tulloch. Beth has been part of Bridges for a long time, serving as a Board member from 2009 to 2014, Board Secretary from 2010 to 2012, Board Chair from 2012 to 2013 and, for the





last four years, as our Deputy Executive Director. She has worked side by side with Lois, contributing to the growth of the services and connections that Bridges provides to our street friends. It has been a wonderful opportunity to work with such a professional and dedicated individual.

On behalf of the Board of Trustees, and all friends of Bridges, we wish Lois and Beth all the best. Please join us on June 5, 2018, for our Annual Board Meeting at the Summit First Aid Squad at 7 p.m., where directly following you

will have a chance to meet Richard and to chat with Lois and Beth about their future plans.

Founded in 1988, Bridges reaches out to the homeless in New York City, Newark, Irvington, and Summit, New Jersey every week. Over 2000 volunteers each year help deliver 65,000 meals, seasonal clothing, and necessities without question and with genuine respect. Our mission is to connect the housed and homeless to establish relationships that lead to greater acceptance and understanding, social and economic growth, and well-being.


Summit has started a Hometown Heroes program to honor our local veterans. From Memorial Day through July 4 2018, banners with an image and service dates for veterans will be displayed along Deforest Avenue, Summit, New Jersey.

This year, the City of Summit honored Robert Max, one of their hometown heroes, at our Memorial Day ceremony for his outstanding service to our country.

Robert Max is a 94-year old World War II veteran and survivor of a Nazi slave labor camp. He enlisted in the U.S. Army when he was a 21-year-old college student. An accomplished musician, he ended up in the Fort Dix Band playing alongside top big band

musicians. Although he could have remained stateside, Max opted to fight in Europe. He was involved in three military campaigns, including the Battle of the Bulge where he was captured by the Nazis. Forced to repair bombed out railroad tracks, Max marched hundreds of miles and worked in the bitter cold, enduring nearly four months without a coat, sufficient food, or any shelter at night. He went from 155 pounds to 89 pounds before his escape to a nearby home where he was rescued by American liberators.

Robert Max has been awarded the Purple Heart with the oak leaf cluster, three bronze campaign battle stars and the New Jersey Distinguished Service Medal.




