Over the past two years, the partnership between the New Providence school district and the New Providence Historical Society has allowed over 800 elementary school students to visit and explore the Salt Box museum. Students each year are able to connect the content of their United States History curriculum to the Salt Box museum's extensive collection, providing students with a tangible link to the important history in their community.

This ongoing collaboration entered an exciting new phase this spring with the Salt Box Museum artifact project. The museum has hundreds of artifacts in their collection, many of which have never been researched or archived. AP US History students from the high school chose items from the Salt Box museum's extensive collection to research. The students photographed the objects, measured them, and looked for significant markings to help identify their origins. They then researched the objects utilizing databases, historical records, and museum guides.

So far, the research has uncovered fascinating information about the collection. Students identified interesting details about the construction and purpose of the Studebaker wagon outside the museum; they identified the manufacturer of a genuine Civil War officer's hat in the collection, and determined that the coach trunk in the downstairs bedroom of the museum is most likely from the late 18th century.

This partnership is unique in the nation. School museum partnerships usually involve students visiting a museum and reporting on what the museum has in its collection. New Providence students are doing authentic field research on a collection that has been largely unstudied.

They will share their findings with the museum and provide historical context and fascinating back-stories for many objects in the museum's diverse collection.

New Providence Historical Society Salt Box Museum is located at 1350 Springfield Avenue and the Mason Room at New Providence Memorial Library, 377 Elkwood Avenue, New Providence. Both are open to the public, free of charge. Museum hours by appointment, Mason room hours Tuesdays 10 a.m. to noon, Thursdays by appointment. 
NEW PROVIDENCE FIRE DEPARTMENT

Special needs talent show draws 1,000 for 7th annual event It was truly their night to shine!

The show, which starred 30 special needs individuals from around Union County, took the stage with their high school volunteer buddies and rocked the house from start to finish. The well-conceived concept kept everyone engaged throughout the show, topped off by the finale, which featured Gloria Estefan hits Get On Your Feet, Conga and Turn the Beat Around, where the cast joined the audience for the exciting finish.

U.C.P.A.C. Executive Director Brian Remo could not have been more impressed with the cast performances.

Each decade was represented by several songs, where the entire cast took part in a big dance ensemble. "While all of our previous shows have been wonderful, we wanted our cast to have the chance to perform on a professional stage and the Union County Performing Arts Center was the perfect venue," said Sally Curci. "I'm so proud of every one of our stars. It was like being on Broadway. The crowd was amazing and the performances were wonderful. It was a perfect night."

Master of Ceremonies Ryan Fay was masterful again, entertaining the audience in between acts while making sure the show moved smoothly.
