The business started out as an ice cream and candy store in the 1950's and evolved into what it is today - a full-service deli, restaurant, and catering business. MEET THE BUSINESS OWNER -PETE CELIA

I was born and raised in Union and am a proud graduate of Union High School. My cousin, Carl Matorama and I purchased Cozy Corner in June, 1988 and completely renovated the place. he new business opened in late August, 1988.

Since that time, the business has grown and changed to keep up with our client's needs, preferences in menu items, and even technology. Over the years we have added the convenience of online ordering and delivery services, and expanded our menu to include both private party and corporate catering.

In 2012, like many of our loyal customers and neighbors, we were devastated by Hurricane Sandy. We were without power for 9 long days. But so were many of our clients, who were turning to us for "comfort food" because their own food had spoiled and they needed a break from cleaning up the result Sandy.

By the Grace of God, we were able to rent 2 generators to stay open for our customers. Word quickly spread that we were open, and we were extremely busy (and tired ourselves) but happy that we could help the community in some small way as we came together to deal with the aftermath of Sandy.

The generator could not support all of our refrigerators and freezers, so we shut down all but the minimum that we needed to stay open.

When the lights came back on, we realized that we could operate with less freezer capacity, so the walk-in freezer was converted to a refrigerator.

Sandy brought hardship and devastation, but we like to remember the goodness that it caused too. Changing the walk-in freezer to a refrigerator reduced our energy consumption and therefore, our carbon footprint. And the best part is that the refrigerator gave us more room for" farm to table" fresh foods, which all of our health conscience customers just love!

Despite all the changes, our primary focus has always been and will always be "comfort food", which is evident in just about every aspect.

Cozy Corner Deli specializes in great comfort food. Our most popular breakfast items are a Taylor Ham, egg & cheese sandwich, with a cup of our famous fresh brewed coffee. For the heartier appetite, customers rave about our over-stuffed 3 egg omelets which are served with the best home fries in the area.

ARC OF UNION COUNTY ENJOYS A VISIT TO OUR HISTORY 'BACK IN TIME'

The Union County Office of Cultural and Heritage Affairs partnered with The Arc of Union County to hold their first "Back in Time" history event for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities. The event was held at the Deserted Village in Berkeley Heights. The afternoon program featured three historical sites in Union County, and the presenters gave an interpretation of the period of time each site represents.

Arlene Soong from the Historic Miller-Cory House Museum, located in Westfield, gave an interactive presentation while dressed in period clothes from the Colonial Period. She provided samples of herbs and fresh food that were grown

in the gardens during that time period. Participants had a chance to see, feel and smell the fresh ingredients and cooking tools that people used to prepare meals in the past.

Kathy Arminio and David Arminio from the Caldwell Parsonage, located in Union Township, shared some background about local historical icon Reverend James Caldwell and his role in the American Revolution. There was also time for fun and games as participants played period games such as hopscotch with a stone, pickup sticks and 9-pin bowling. They rounded up the event with a visit to the museum at the Deserted Village, located in Berkeley Heights, where participants explored the artifacts and historical documents that help us to understand our local history.



RICH ROSENTHAL TO PRESENT "THE PRECEDENTS OF THE PREFIDENT"

The Union Township Historical Society will inaugural oath, through the establishment of the host Rich Rosenthal at Connecticut Farms Presbyterian Church on Sunday, September 16, 2018, at 2 p.m. Rich will present "The Precedents of the Prefident*: George Washington and the Creation of the Executive Office." (*In 1789, a print "s" was written "f.")

As George Washington was about to become the first President under the new U. S. Constitution, he said, "I walk on untrodden ground to shape America." And that he did! Every one of his actions as President - from the (left) Rich Rosenthal will present "The Precedents of the Prefident*: George Washington and the Creation of the Executive Office" on Sunday, September 16, 2018, at 2 p.m., hosted by the Union Township Historical Society.

U. S. Treasury and financial system, to the creation of the Coast Guard, cabinet meetings, appointment of ambassadors and Supreme Court justices, dealings with Congress, to his refusal to run for a third term - was a precedent.

There can only be one Number One - and George Washington was that Number One, setting the guidelines for all future presidents.

Rich Rosenthal has lectured on many historical subjects and is president of the North Jersey Civil War Round Table. He was a board member and one of the founding members - along with preeminent New Jersey historian, the late John T. Cunningham - of the North Jersey American Revolution Round Table. Rich lives in Parsippany with his wife, Harriet; they have two daughters and three grandchildren.

UNITY AWARD PRESENTED TO COUNTY EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM

Fifteen individuals and seven organizations recently received the Union County Human Relations Commission's prestigious Unity Award for Achievement, an honor given to role models who dedicate their time and efforts to activities and programs that raise and honor the human spirit.

The 2018 awards marked the 17th year in which the Commission has named honorees.

The Union County Emergency Response Team (UCERT)/ USAI NJ PRIDE was honored for aid deployment to Puerto Rico.

Below is preprinted from the event's program. The team included UCERT/SWAT/USAI Commander Martin Mogensen; Patrolman Alexander Ruiz, Clark Police Department; Officer Elliot Bernard, Fanwood Police Department; Patrolman Sean Kaverik, Kenilworth Police Department; Detective Roselle Park Edward Nortrup, Police Department; Officer Dragan Ristovski, Township of Union Police Department; Detective Daniel Fay, Union County Prosecutor's Office; Officer Sean Holcomb, Union County Prosecutor's Office; Lieutenant James Guerrant, Union County Sheriff's Office: Sergeant Manuel Cruz, Union County Sheriff's Office.

This Unity Award was given in recognition for emergency response to help residents of Puerto Rico by assisting local law enforcement in the wake of hurricane devastation.

On Wednesday, September 6, 2017, Hurricane

carved a merciless path of destruction through the Caribbean, killing at least 44 people, leaving thousands of others homeless, and plunging more than 1 million residents of Puerto Rico into darkness.

Two weeks later, on Wednesday, September 20, 2017, Hurricane Maria - which, despite weakening to a Category 4 hurricane by the time it stuck Puerto Rico - devastated the island, decimated buildings, crippled communication, drenched it with intense flooding, and left hundreds of recipients dead or missing. Its previously damaged electrical grid was also compromised.

The Catastrophic damage, coupled with the devastation of other islands in the area, compounded relief efforts. Maria was the tenthmost intense Atlantic hurricane, and the worst natural disaster on record in Puerto Rico. For weeks, in MAria's wake, most of the island's population suffered from flooding and lack of resources, compounded by the slow relief process.

Union County stepped up to help. Nine Union County law enforcement officers who are members of the Union County Emergency Response Team (UCERT) traveled to Puerto Rico in the wake of the hurricane to help keep law and order there.

The officers, under the command of Union County Police Department Captain Martin

Irma - a Category 5 storm with 175 mph winds - Mogensen, who commands UCERT, Union County's SWAT team, and the Federal Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI), went in two deployments in October and November 2017 to provide relief. Coordinating with the New Jersey State Police, Puerto Rican State Police, and San Juan Police, they provided community outreach assistance, infrastructure protection, and traffic control points.

> The Union County officers relieved local officers who had been working long shifts daily and wearing regular clothes because they couldn't wash their uniforms. Their radios didn't work either. They communicated by waving each other down, or by cell phones

> Two months after the storm, the officers had to struggle on a daily basis for the necessities: food, water, fuel for their generators.

> The officers agreed that the images seen on TV and online di not capture the enormity of the damage: Roads with giant fissures, downed utility poles, epic food and water shortages, no traffic lights, gridlock, cars disabled or struck sitting on the side of seven-lane highways, and lack of power. Crime and violence were also a dangerous byproduct of the hurricane aftermath. Day-to-day life was exhausting.

> We salute the members of the UCERT team who put their comfortable lives here at home on hold while they reached out to help fellow officers and the residents of Puerto Rico in the aftermath of the tragedy.

ANNUAL CEMETERY TOUR TO HAVE WORLD WAR I THEME

the observance of the 100th anniversary of the end of World War I. To pay tribute to the men and women who gave so much during the "war to end all wars," this year's cemetery tour, hosted by the Merchants and Drovers Tavern Museum Association, will feature a World War I theme. actually 3 sets of 5, not "two bell chimes."

I would like to invite the community to attend the ceremony and visit the Memorial Park located next to Union Fire Headquarters. This memorial is dedicated to the members of the Union Fire Dept including the 2 line of duty deaths that occurred in Union, and the 9-11 tribute which includes a piece of the World Trade Center and a piece of the Pentagon, Union Fire Department is one of only a few departments within the state that has a piece of both sites that were attacked that day.




